### RELIEF TO BELIEVERS IN EUROPE AND ASIA:

There was an earnest discussion of the present appalling situation in Europe and Asia as regards famine conditions, and the fact that many hundreds of our believers will be among those who will be threatened with starvation during the next few months. It was felt that an appeal ought to be made to our people in America immediately, laying upon their hearts the gravity of the situation, and appealing to them to come to the help of their suffering brethren and sisters. It was felt that for the next few months emphasis should be placed on the need for food. Consideration was given to possible ways and means of getting food into the occupied countries of Europe. Statement was made that food supplies can be sent from Denmark and Sweden into these areas, if money were available for its purchase. It was felt that funds ought to be made available to our brethren in Denmark for this purpose.

VOTED, That a campaign be launched immediately, for the raising of money and food and clothing in as large quantities as

possible, in order to bring relief to our people in the lands where there is acute suffering because of the lack of food.

VOTED, That a committee be appointed by the Chair, to take into consideration the whole question of relief to our people in the world field, and make definite recommendation at the earliest possible date of ways and means of supplying such relief.

#### LETTER TO PRESIDENT TRUMAN:

The draft of a letter addressed to President Truman was submitted, and with some alterations approved. The letter petitions the President to take whatever steps are necessary to remove impediments now existing, in order to make it possible for both organizations and individuals to send food and clothing to the distressed people of Poland, Germany, Hungary, the Balkan States, Japan and Korea.

## M.S.KRIETZKY--VISIT TO RUSSIA:

VOTED, To request the North Dakota Conference to extend M.S.Krietzky's leave of absence [he has been attending the Theological Seminary], in order that he may make a visit to Russia as our representative as soon as transportation and visas can be secured, in the hope that he may be able to make personal contact with our leaders and people in Russia, to learn if and how we can be a help to them.

#### FAMINE RELIEF:

The committee appointed in the meeting of April 1, on famine relief, submitted a report, which was amended and adopted as follows:

WHEREAS, By reports from the public press and over the radio, from representatives of the General Conference who have visited some of our overseas divisions, and by correspondence from our division leaders, we are made to realize that a large portion of the world is facing the overwhelming tragedy of famine, and that millions of people will perish from starvation before another harvest; and

WHEREAS, Among the millions in the countries affected are thousands of our brethren and sisters with their children, who have a right to look to us for help; therefore

We recommend, 1. That Sabbath, May 4, be appointed as a day for receiving an offering in all our churches in North America, for famine relief, aiming at a goal of \$500,000, this goal to be apportioned to the union conferences on the basis of the tithe income; it being understood that the offering will not apply on the Sixty-cent-a-week Fund.

In order that this offering may be widely promoted,

We recommend, 2. That M.E.Kern, J.F.Cummins, E.D.Dick, W.A.Butler and J.A.Stevens be a committee to arrange for promotional material and articles for the Review and Herald, the Signs of the Times, the Youth's Instructor, the union conference papers, the foreign language papers, etc.

We recommend, 3. That up to \$500,000 of Rehabilitation Funds be set aside as an advance on the offering that will be taken in the field for famine relief, and that this fund be made available for the purchase and shipment of food to our members in famine areas throughout the world.

- 4. That two men be appointed, one for the purchase and shipping of food and other supplies to Europe, and the other to secure food and other supplies for the Orient.
- 5. That R.L.Benton be assigned to this work for Europe, and that I.E.Gillis be secured to serve as our purchasing agent for the Orient.
- 6. That the clothing and famine relief work be combined under a new committee to be appointed by the Chair, and that this committee be given wide operational powers.
- 7. That J.J.Strahle be asked to go to Europe, to act as director of our relief work, and that Vigge Thomsen and Nöller Christensen, of Denmark, be associated with him as a committee.

April 2, 1946

- 8. That the members of the German language trained group, as well as Paul Misenko, be sent to various parts of Europe, as it is found they can be utilized, to assist in supervising the distribution of food, clothing, etc., under the counsel of J.J.Strahle.
- 9. That we place a request with the Voice of Prophecy for the loan of I.E.Gillis for a period of time, to supervise the distribution of food and other famine relief supplies to our membership throughout the Orient.

We recommend, 10. That \$50,000 be sent immediately to Denmark, for the purchase of food stuffs, and their distribution from there to Poland, Czechoslovakia, Germany, Hungary and Austria.

- II. That our representatives in Sweden be asked to secure available food stuffs for distribution in the same countries, in consultation with our Relief Committee, and that our Swedish office bill us for the cost of these supplies.
- 12. That \$75,000 be allocated for the purchase of food stuffs for the Orient, of which \$25,000 shall be sent to the China Division office, for the purchase of obtainable foods in China.
- 13. That \$50,000 be allocated for the purchase of food supplies under the direction of R.L.Benton, for shipment to Europe.

## J.J. STRAHLE-PLANE TRANSPORTATION:

VOTED, To authorize plane transportation for J.J. Strahle in order that he may reach Europe at the earliest possible date.

### APARTMENT HOURS FOR GLENDALE SANITARIUM:

Aiken, Senator of Vermont has introduced a measure to authorize the President, and the Secretary of Agriculture to issue such directives as may be necessary to prevent the use of grains for the manufacture of liquors or any other non-essential purposes during the present war emergency; and

WHEREAS, We believe that the famine in different parts of the world demands that immediate and drastic steps be taken to preserve for food purposes all grain,

Resolved, That we express our wholehearted approval of Mr. Aiken's bill, S.J. 149, and urge that it be immediately passed by the Senate.

WHEREAS, The Honorable Jerry Voorhis, a Congressmen from California, has introduced a measure to authorize the President, and the Secretary of Agriculture to issue such directives as may be necessary to prevent the use of grains for the manufacture of liquors, or any other non-essential purposes during the present war emergency; and,

WHEREAS, We believe that the famine in different parts of the world demands that immediate and drastic steps be taken to preserve for food all grain,

Resolved, That we express our wholehearted approval of Mr. Voorhis' bill, H.J., 325, and urge that it be immediately passed by the House of Representatives.

RADIO ADVERTISING OF LIQUORS:

WHEREAS, The use of intoxicating liquor is increasing rapidly in the United States; and

WHEREAS, We believe it is against the public policy to further increase the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages; and

WHEREAS, One of the agencies for advertising much used by the liquor interests is the radio, which comes into millions of homes in America where youth and children of immature judgment are particularly susceptible to its influence,

Resolved, That we urge that the Congress of the United States exercise itspower to pass necessary regulations and restrictions to prohibit the advertising of alcoholic beverages over the air.

# FOOD PACKAGES FOR EUROPE:

Report was given concerning contact made by members of the Committee on Relief with an organization in New York, known as Cooperative for American Remittances to Europe, or CARE.

The purpose of this organization is to arrange for the sending of packages of food to Europe. It was learned that we can order these packages in quantity, and that they may be sent either to individuals or to one person whom we may designate as our distributing agent. While the packages, which have been bought from the Army, having been prepared as rations for men in the Army, contain a few foods and some other things that we would not approve of, they do provide a quick means of sending relief to our people who are suffering for lack of food in various countries of Europe. Each package provides an average of 40,000 calories, or food enough for thirty meals. It was

VOTED, That we approve of the Committee on Relief placing an order with CARE for 4000 food packages, at a cost of \$60,000, to be shipped as follows: to Holland, 500 packages; Poland, 1500; Czechoslovakia, 750; Italy, 500; Finland, 750.

\$50,000 FOR FOOD THROUGH RED CROSS:

In response to a cable received from Geneva, signed by H.Erzberger and J.J.Aitken, it was

VOTED, To cable \$50,000 to the Southern European Division office at Bern, to be used by Brethren Erzberger and Aitken in the purchase of food for our people in Central Europe, this being now possible through the Red Cross.

DEFERRED APPOINTMENT OF MEDICAL STUDENTS
FORMERLY IN ARMY SPECIALIZED TRAINING PROGRAM:

In view of word from the War Department to the effect that there are no arrangements made by the Department for using the medical students who have been discharged from the Army Specialized Training Program and placed in the Enlisted Reserve Corps, at the time when they finish their professional training, it was
