WAGE SCALE ADJUSTMENT:

Attention was called to the report of the Wage Scale Committee as adopted by the North American Division Committee and recorded on pages 27-30 of the minutes of that Committee, with special reference to the minimum rate set for women teachers in Intermediate and Secondary Schools. The adjusted minimum is recorded as \$\\$\\$41.00\$, as compared with a minimum of \$33.00 for the same category in the Secondary Schools. Although this figure is consistent throughout all of the Committee minutes, it is pointed out that there is apparently an error in this minimum rate in view of the great difference from the minimum in the rate for women teachers in Secondary Schools. In order to carry out the intent of the Committee and to harmonize this rate with that in other categories, it was

VOTED, That the minimum rate for women teachers be retained as in the 1956 Wage Scale at \$33.50. In adjusting it to the 1957 Wage Scale, \$5.00 will be added to this minimum, raising it to \$38.50, and this will automatically move the minimum to \$40.00 in the 1957 Wage Scale.
