DEVOTIONAL SERVICE:

<u>F. L. Bland</u>, Chairman, referred to Jeremiah 33, which calls our attention to the experiences of Jeremiah while he was in prison. He had been imprisoned by Zedekiah, King of Judah, because of his determination to prophesy according to the directions of God. Elder Bland read verses 1-3, which contain the promise "Call unto me, and I will answer thee, and shew thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not." This is a good message for us to consider today, down here in the closing scenes of the history of this world when God's work is to be finished. We need to have that faith to call upon God for His leadership, for His guidance, for the knowledge of Heaven, that we may know how to direct God's work, and that we may see great and mighty things taking place in God's work which we have never seen before. This promise which was made to Jeremiah while he was shut up in prison is good for the leaders of God's Church today. Let us pray most earnestly for God's directions and blessings.

REPORTS:

 \underline{E} . \underline{W} . \underline{Tarr} , Bureau of Public Relations Secretary, just returned from a 13-week journey through the Far Eastern and Australasian Divisions, gave a brief account of his impressions. He was greatly impressed by the overwhelming contrasts between these two interesting areas of the world field, the Far East with its 400,000,000 people, Australasia with vast ocean expanses but only 20,000,000 people.

The trip was packed with interesting experiences, group and individual meetings, trips by mission planes, boats and canoes. In Fiji, Naomi Masausila, in

January 6, 1972

charge of Dorcas welfare work, travels much of the time visiting various units and establishing new ones. Units are led by Adventists, but those of other faiths are admitted. Last report indicated 2,376 members, with Seventh-day Adventists 1,511, Methodists 501, Catholics 196, Assemblies 27, Jehovah's Witnesses 9, and 42 others. Every year an average of between 40 and 50 non-Adventist members join the Church, many bringing their families with them.

From the New Hebrides men go over to the French Island of New Caledonia to work for high wages brought about by the giant nickel industry. Frequently in the New Hebrides a church board and members needing a new church will choose from six to twelve strong men of the church and send them to New Caledonia to work there and send money back to build the new church. During this visit two of these churches on Ambrym Island were under construction with one to be dedicated the following week.

C. C. Weis, Lay Activities Department Associate Secretary, reported: The total amount raised through January 1, 1972, is \$7,187,648.01. This is a per capita of \$16.18 for the North American Division.

The total amount raised at the end of the eighth week of Ingathering last year was \$7,010,932.06. This is a gain of \$176,715.95 over last year's achievement for the same period.

The amount raised this week is \$383,027.91 as against \$239,691.86 in the eighth week of the previous year.

We have three million-dollar unions: Columbia, Pacific, and Southern.

Fifteen conferences have reached the Silver Vanguard goal.

Surpassing last year's totals are four unions: Atlantic, Canadian, Southern and Southwestern, and 24 conferences.

J. J. Aitken, Field Secretary: On January 6, 1972, Elder Aitken received a letter from Dr. Ewald R. Lonser, of the White Memorial Hospital. After a year of prayerful interest in the Radio-Europe broadcast, Dr. Lonser, representing those faithful ones of our medical institutions who are deeply interested in the broadcast of God's work around the world, sent a contribution of \$12,000 for the benefit of spreading the gospel through Adventist World Radio in Europe. This represents the sacrificial spirit of thousands of our people in all professions, and particularly here in the medical profession, for the onward march of the cause of God.

REPORTS:

<u>V. W. Schoen</u>, Lay Activities Secretary, reported: The amount raised for Ingathering this week is \$133,191.13 as against \$144,869.53 raised in the corresponding week last year.

Fifteen conferences have attained Silver Vanguard status.

Six unions--Atlantic, Canadian, Central, Lake, Southern, and Southwestern-and 29 conferences have exceeded their final totals for last year. All unions except one showed gains this week. We need \$7,138.67 to reach the total amount raised in last year's campaign.

The total amount raised for the same period last year was \$7,155,801.14. This means that we show a gain of \$165,038.00 over last year's achievement for nine weeks.

This is a per capita of \$16.48 for the North American Division.

The total raised through January 8, 1972, is \$7,320,839.14.

Caris H. Lauda, Secretary, North American Missions Committee: We are pleased to report that on Sabbath, January 1, a new Korean SDA church was organized in Chicago, Illinois, with a charter membership of over 50. This enthusiastic group with its talented officers are planning to make 1972 a great soul-winning year for Mission '72.

On Sabbath, January 8, the New Jersey Conference organized its eleventh Spanish church. The New Brunswick Spanish SDA church was organized on that day with 33 charter members. They have an enthusiastic experienced staff of officers who immediately laid plans for a great soul-winning year.

Fresh News from the Philipoines: The ground-breaking ceremonies for the radio station DXAR on our Mountain View College campus took place on December 7. We thank the Lord that radio station DXAR will soon be transmitting the love of God in word and song. Do pray for this radio project.

Last year the Mountain View College ministerial seminar with its teachers and students won nearly 300 individuals to Christ. These have been baptized and now rejoice in the faith. One series of meetings at present has an attendance of over 200, with only 20 being S.D.A.'s. The ministerial seminar is giving Bible studies in 17 different homes. And all are planning and working to make 1972 the greatest year ever in winning souls to Christ.

W. A. Higgins, Associate Secretary Publishing Department: Some very outstanding Publishing Department reports are coming to us from different parts of the world field. In South America, during one recent month, a literature evangelist delivered 2,600 paperback books, including 644 copies of The Life of Jesus, 43 hard-bound books, 26 Bibles, or a total of 549,000 pages of literature.

Another literature evangelist, in Brazil, in one recent month delivered 1,608 volumes of The Great Controversy. This man has been canvassing for seven years, and has won a total of 210 persons baptized.

From Finland comes the report of one lady literature evangelist who delivered more than \$70,000 worth of literature in 1971. Another lady in that same country delivered \$58,000 worth of literature last year.

Encouraging soul-winning results are being reported also. Colorado Conference, last year, reported 118 baptisms as the result of follow up of literature evangelists' contacts.

GENERAL CONFERENCE INTERNATIONAL FUND:

In order to provide some measure of international diversification of non-U.S.A. based denominational funds available for moderately long-term investment in companies located in countries other than the U.S.A. or Canada, in harmony with the recommendation of the General Conference Officers, it was--

VOTED, That an additional unitized fund to be known as the General Conference International Fund be established to serve the overseas divisions and their subsidiaries under the following basic guidelines:

- 1. Investments in this fund shall be accepted only from investing unit-holders (overseas divisions and their subsidiaries) or from the General Conference for the benefit of designated overseas divisions. (Since the Inter-American Division is based in the U.S.A., funds cannot be accepted from that division, but its subsidiaries based outside the U.S.A. could be unitholders.)
- 2. The initial capital of this fund shall be acquired by the transfer to this fund of 70% of the market value as of December 31, 1971, of each of the overseas divisions' investments in the General Conference Investment Fund and the General Conference Income Fund with the exception of the Inter-American Division and the Furo-Africa Division, and a lump sum amount from the Euro-Africa Division of funds presently held in Switzerland. These transfers from existing unitized funds shall be made without gain or loss to the divisions. The initial value of this fund shall be set at \$100.00 per unit.
- 3. Subsequent transactions will be determined by the divisions in counsel with the General Conference.

- 4. The members of the General Conference Investment and Securities Committee shall serve as the operating committee for this fund with separate minutes being maintained under the title International Investment and Securities Committee.
- 5. Investments made by this fund together with net investment income and net realized capital gains shall accrue to the benefit of the investing unitholders or to the beneficiary divisions in case the General Conference advances any funds for the overseas divisions. None of these funds shall be returned to or brought into the U.S.A. at any time.
- 6. The books of account for this fund shall be maintained by the General Conference Treasury (or its designate) in a manner similar to other denominational unitized funds.
- 7. The books of account for this fund shall be audited at least annually by the General Conference Auditing Staff.
- 8. The Geneva office of Edie International shall be retained as investment counsel for this fund under full discretionary basis within clearly defined investment guidelines, the fee for this service to be negotiated by the General Conference Treasury.
- 9. Banking and custodial services for this fund shall be provided by the Geneva office of the First National City Bank under the normal fee arrangements for such services.
- 10. The authorized signatures for the bank account shall be the Treasurer, the Undertreasurer, and the Assistant Treasurer serving as investments manager of the General Conference, with only one signature being required to transact business; Edie International's designated representative shall also be given a power of attorney limited to negotiating settlements of accounts in connection with the handling of securities for this fund. (*See footnote.)
- 11. Certificates or other evidences of ownership of investments made by this fund shall be held in custodianship by the Geneva office of the First National City Bank with monthly position statements being provided by the bank to the General Conference Treasury and to Edie International.

W. J. Hackett served as Chairman. On his request, D. W. Hunter presented thoughts for meditation. He read selections from the book \$3.00 Worth of God, by Wilbur E. Rees. For the first, he read Mark 10: 35-37, which verses contain the request made by James and John, the sons of Zebedee, that they might sit on the right hand and left hand of Jesus in His glory. In the comment following, the writer states: "I want to be a 'somebody' associated with 'somebodies': ... Humility is such a rare jewel that it deserves a rich setting." The second scripture was Mark 10: 28, in which Peter said, "Lo, we have left all and have followed thee." The writer comments: "If I'm doomed to be a saint, then I want to be a gold cup saint. That's the whole trouble. isn't it? Everyone wants to be a showpiece. The emphasis is on success rather than on submission. ... Then let's be honest. I am not a saint; I am a performer." The third text quoted was Ex. 34: 29, in which occurs this statement: 'Moses wist not that the skin of his face shone." The author adds: "Saints are not conscious that they are different, but the dark world is quite aware of the light which has invaded it. The world does not need to ask, 'Have you talked with God?' but only 'What did He say?'"

INTRODUCTION:

M. E. Loewen introduced R. W. Nixon, who comes to us from the Southern Publishing Association, where he was Book Editor. He previously had experience in the Bureau of Public Relations. He is to serve as an Associate Secretary in the Public Affairs and Religious Liberty Department. His work will be primarily assisting R. R. Hegstad in editing Liberty Magazine. We welcome him. This will give him opportunity to assist on the magazine that has the largest circulation of any in the denomination.

REPORT:

Ernest H. J. Steed, General Conference Temperance Secretary, reported to the Committee on his recent two months' visit to South America and on new temperance activities from the General Conference.

He participated in Union Ministerial Councils with Charles Brooks, General Field Secretary. This combined approach he believed helped the evangelist see the spiritual nature of temperance and its relationship to front line evangelism.

In Brazil they have over 200 youth especially trained as temperance sales workers. Coupled with a public relations approach of going into a community showing temperance films, talks on the radio and TV and press news, they then visit every home supplying the books published. Thus the Temperance, PR, Publishing and Young People's Missionary Volunteer Departments have a most effective combined public contact achieving excellent results.

Yesterday a contract was signed for twenty temperance films to be used world-wide on the newest communication media E.V.R. This system will process these films on tape in cassettes that are used in a new device to hook up to the TV set. Factories, schools, hospitals, government buildings, etc., can provide through a battery of TV sets the picture and sound from the cassette. Soon this plan will extend to individual sets.

The latest Temperance film, "I Took the High Road," featuring drugs and the spiritual answer will be premiered in the U.S. Congress, January 31. This film will have special significance as used for Mission '72 public arousement, said Elder Steed.
