M E Kemmerer, Undertreasurer, presented the Balance Sheet, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Operations and Retained Net Worth, as well as Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 of the 1974 Financial Statement for the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. The Auditor's statement was read by R M Davidson. M E Kemmerer also read the Balance Sheet and Statement of Income and Expense for the General Conference Corporation of Seventh-day Adventists. The Auditor's statement was read by M J McCulloch. In conclusion, the Undertreasurer read the Balance Sheet and Statement of Operations and Retained Net Worth of the General Conference Association (North American Conference Corporation). Reading of the Auditor's statement prepared by M J McCulloch was waived.

R E Osborn, Assistant Treasurer, presented the Financial Statements for the Investment Fund and the Income Fund. The Auditor's statement prepared by K W Whitney was read by R M Davidson. Although the Calculation of Performance indicates a minus performance in 1974, the losses were not so large as those of other mutual funds and popular indices. It is hoped that the upward trend since the beginning of the year will continue.

J C Kozel, Assistant Treasurer, presented the Financial Statements for the Sustentation Funds. The Auditor's statement prepared by R B Caldwell was read by R M Davidson. On December 31, 1974, there were 4,477 beneficiaries of the Sustentation Fund in the North American Division.

#### SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- The General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists keeps its books of account on the accrual basis.
- 2. There are no depreciation charges to expense as all of the fixed assets used by the General Conference of SDA are on a rental basis from the Corporation of SDA on whose records all of the fixed assets are carried.
- 3. The investment securities are carried on the books at cost or market, whichever is lower. This is accomplished by an allowance for the recognized unrealized decline on all marketable securities.
- 4. The books of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists are not kept on a fund accounting basis; however, the net worth reserves are handled in such a way as to represent fund balances for certain purposes. Schedule 86 shows the detail on certain expenses that are charged to operating expense with a corresponding credit to the reserve. Disbursements are made from the reserve.
- 5. The net worth of IS/Esda was transferred to a separate entity as of January 1, 1974 and the financial position and operation for the year ended December 31, 1974 appear in a separate audited statement prepared for that organization.

"Therefore I do not run uncertainly--without definite aim. But I buffet my body, and subdue it, for fear that after proclaiming to others the Gospel and things pertaining to it I myself should become unfit--not stand the test and be unapproved, and rejected as a counterfeit."

He spoke about three means by which Satan endeavors to sidetrack God's leaders:

- 1. Through a desire for things of this life. Those who are engaged in work for the Church should have no business entanglements.
  - 2. By allowing immorality to come into the working force of the Church.
- 3. Through pride and self seeking. "Let each esteem other better than themselves." (Phil 2:3).

The Chairman called for reconsecration of life to God, and Robert H Pierson offered a prayer of dedication.

M S Nigri and R L Pelton showed slides of the work in the Kasai area.

### (A-898) CREDENTIALS & LICENSES--POLICY REORGANIZATION AND REWRITING

- VOTED, A. To reword the title of the policy which now reads: WORKERS--LICENSING, TRANSFERRING, EMPLOYMENT REGULATIONS (GC Working Policy, p 76; NAD Working Policy, p. 64) to read: WORKERS--ACCREDITING, TRANSFERRING; EMPLOYMENT REGULATIONS.
- B. To reorganize and rewrite the section entitled "Credentials and Licenses" (GC Working Policy, p 76,77; NAD Working Policy, p 64,65) to read as follows:

Types--To whom issued.--Persons in the categories listed below shall be accredited by the responsible organization (see section "Method of Issuing" below) through the issuance to them of a credential, license or certificate as indicated under each category:

### 1. Ministerial workers--Ordained and Licensed

- a. Ministerial Credential, to ordained ministers
- b. Ministerial License, to those who are engaged in full-time ministerial work and who would be expected to be ordained in due course.

#### 2. Non-ministerial workers

- a. Missionary Credential, to workers with significant experience in denominational service, usually not less than five years, who demonstrate proficiency in the responsibilities assigned to them and whose remuneration is at approximately the maximum for their category in the denominational wage scale. These will include regularly employed field, medical, educational and office workers; Bible instructors and career literature evangelists.
- b. Missionary License, to workers with limited experience including regularly employed field, medical, educational and office workers and Bible instructors. It may also be given also to workers who are members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church such as miscellaneous office and miscellaneous institutional workers who have been in denominational service for more than five years but who do not qualify for Missionary Credentials.

### 3. Other Employees

a. Employment Certificate issued by the employing organization or institution to industrial and miscellaneous office and miscellaneous institutional workers not holding credentials or licenses from a denominational organization.

(Credentials & Licenses - contd)

b. Employment Certificate shall also be issued by the employing organization or institution to industrial and miscellaneous office and miscellaneous institutional employees who are not members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

### 4. Literature Evangelists

- a. Missionary Credential, to career literature evangelists who are engaged in full-time literature evangelism and who have been accredited as credentialed literature evangelists for a suitable period, usually not less than five years.
- b. Literature Evangelist Credential, to permanent regular literature evangelists in good standing.
- c. Literature Evangelist License, to beginners in the literature ministry after they have given three months of satisfactory service and who plan definitely to remain in this work.

#### 5. Lay\_Preachers

See Lay Activities Department policy.

C. To add the following to the section entitled "Credentials and Licenses" (GC Working Policy, p 76,77; NAD Working Policy, p 64,65) in the appropriate location as determined by the standing Working Policy Committee:

#### Guidelines for the Issuing of Ministerial Credentials

- 1. Workers who have been ordained to the ministry and are currently major administrative officers of a denominational institution are eligible to continue holding Ministerial Credentials.
- 2. Workers who are ordained and who have spent the major part of their lives in ministerial work but who choose or are obliged to work for a few years in other lines of denominational work before retiring shall be eliqible for and may continue to be granted Ministerial Credentials.
- 3. Workers who have been ordained and carry Ministerial Credentials but who of their own choice have discontinued ministerial work, or who in the judgment of their employing organizations are unable to perform satisfactorily in a ministerial role, but continue in denominational employment, are not eligible for renewal of their Ministerial Credentials nor for a continuation of them if these are still valid beyond the end of the calendar year.
- 4. When an employee with Ministerial Credentials is officially called to a position of clearly non-ministerial function, a letter of clarification shall accompany the call informing him if this results in non-ministerial status.

5. Teachers, according to present policy, are ordinarily eligible to receive missionary licenses or credentials. However, ordained ministers who are engaged in Bible teaching shall be granted Ministerial Credentials. Ordained ministers who are teaching in an area other than religion but who continue ministerial, evangelistic, or church major responsibilities and assignments in connection with their school work, may also be granted Ministerial Credentials.

## ROLE OF WOMEN IN THE CHURCH

VOTED, 1. That we continue to recognize "the primacy of the married woman's role in the home and family, as repeatedly emphasized in the Scriptures and the Spirit of Prophecy. . . . " (1974 Annual Council actions, page 13, paragraph 5), and that

We also recognize that there are many women in the church without family responsibilities who are capable and free to dedicate their full time to the service of the church in many spheres and on many levels.

- 2. That we agree that potential leadership roles, on all levels of administration not requiring ordination to the gospel ministry, be open to suitably qualified women whose home and family responsibilities make this possible.
- 3. That, therefore, we request church and institutional administrators on all levels to make continuing efforts to place qualified women, as well as men, in the categories of work referred to in the preceding paragraph.
- 4. That the way be opened for women elected to serve as deaconesses in our churches to be ordained to this office and that the Church Manual Committee be requested to give study to a statement of the qualifications of deaconesses and suggestions in regard to a suitable ordination service.
- 5. That in harmony with the spirit and intent of paragraph 3 of the Annual Council 1974 action (pages 12-14) the greatest discretion and caution be exercised in the ordaining of women to the office of local elder, counsel being sought in all cases by the local conference/mission from the union and division committees before proceeding.
- 6. That we recognize that the history of the Seventh-day Adventist Church provides precedents for women to fill roles of leadership. However, on the matter of the ordination of women to the gospel ministry we believe that the world church is not yet ready to move forward. Therefore, until this question becomes clearer we recommend that every endeavor be made to use women in the numerous positions many of them are well qualified to fill.
- 7. That we further recognize the considerable contribution that women have made to the church as Bible Instructors and in other soul-winning capacities, and recommend that where Bible Instructors or other women with suitable qualifications and experience are able to fill ministerial roles, they be assigned as assistant pastors, their credentials being missionary license or missionary credential.
