VOTED, To pass on to the General Conference the East Mediterranean Union call for an overseas experienced evangelist, who is an ordained minister, to lead out in the Beirut Center activities as its director, with the understanding that he will be asked to study the Arabic language on a full-time basis during his first year in our division.

Miss Indra Ashod has been teaching half time at Middle East College and serving the division the other half, and both organizations have appreciated her fine Christian help, but it is realized that it would be better for her to give full time to one organization or the other, and since the college has called for her full time, and since she seems pleased with this possibility, it was

VOTED, To pass on to Miss Indra Ashod the call of Middle East College to join their faculty on a fulltime basis as of September 1, 1960.

In view of the weak and unstable electrical supply at the division compound, it was

VOTED, To approve of installing a satisfactory transformer for the compound, and to appropriate a sum of IL 2,000. for this purpose from division contingency funds.

Moseley, Jr. Elder R. A. Wilcox extended a welcome to Elders Moseley OPENE NG and Chase, and introduced Elder J. E. Chase who led out in the morning devotional message. He quoted Nelson Algren as having said, "The race is not for missiles, but for the hearts of men." Attention was called to Testimonies for the Church, Vol. 9, pp. 116,117 showing that plans for advance moves are to be made "all along the line." Mention was made of the great Youth Congress just held in Atlantic City. An earnest season of prayer was held, Elders Fenn, Darnell, Gammon, Moseley, and Chase offered prayer for the Lord's help in the advancing of the cause in the Middle East Division. There was a period of about twenty minutes intermission. IMETISSION Upon reassembling at 9:00 a. m., prayer was offered by R. A. Wilcox. APPROVAL OF MINUTES VOTED, To approve the minutes of June 21, 1960. WELCOME TO V. A. FENN The Chairman expressed a hearty welcome to our new division treasurer and auditor, Elder V. A. Fenn, who will also serve as secretary-treasurer of the East Mediterranean Union. All were pleased to join in this welcome on the occasion of Elder Fenn's first meeting with the division committee. GREETINGS Elder Chase brought greetings from Elders J. S. Russell and D. V. Kubrock, and the Chairman read a card written from Paris by A. A. Haddad now attending the All European Institute of Scientific Studies for the Prevention of Alcoholism. EMERGENCY REQUEST FOR Whereas political conditions make it imperative for the BEIRUT ARMENIAN CHURCH Beirut Armenian Church and School to be relocated imme-AND SCHOOL diately, and whereas now there is a fairly attractive 2803 offer to purchase the property, and whereas they cannot hold evangelistic meetings at night at the present location, therefore the Division has granted a special

VOTED, To pass on to the General Conference the urgent request of the East Mediterranean Union and the Lebanon Mission for permission to move the Beirut Armenian church and school from their present location, and to sell the property, and also to request the General Conference to grant an emergency appropriation of \$50,000.00 to enable them to relocate in a satisfactory area.

VOTED, That in connection with the fall meeting it is ITINERARIES OF O. A. BLAKE AND W. E. MURRAY recommended that Elders Blake and Murray, after a brief wisit to Istanbul, plan to reach Beirut, Lebanon by November 15, and that after attending the annual meetings of the division committee, they attend the East Mediterranean Union Biennial Session in the Beirut area, and go to Egypt November 25 so as to be present at the Nile Union Biennial Session, and that they be free for further travel on December 1 in the Nile Union.

Inasmuch as certain conflicting interests seem to exist it was

VOTED, To appoint a special committee composed of R. A. Wilcox, R. C. Darnell, A. G. Zytkoskee, and R. H. Hartwell, to study the question of General Conference visits to the division in 1961, and it was understood that this committee would report back to the division committee.

Since there is much involved in the question, it was

VOTED, To ask the division officers to study the matter of Covernment Insurance when they are in the Nile Union, and that they report back to the division committee their findings.

VOTED, That in planning for Spirit of Prophecy year in 1961, the division literature committee be asked to prepare a set of Spirit of Prophecy correspondence lessons without delay, and that they be based on Counsels to the Church which are to be published in periodical form, and that this material be ready for use by January 1961, and it was suggested that where Arabic is not used classes be conducted in other languages, thus acquainting all of our people with the gift of prophecy, and it was suggested that pastors conduct such classes for at least three months.

The committee reconvened at 2:00 p. m. in E. L. Gammon's office at Middle East College, with the usual members in attendance, and also R. C. Skinner who had just arrived from Tehran.

1961 SEMIMARY EXTENSION VOTED, To retain the date July 16 to August 25, 1961, for SCHOOL the holding of the S.D.A. Theological Seminary Extension 2808 School in Beirut, Lebanon, and that the General Conference be solicited to maintain the original plan of sending two teachers from the Seminary and one from the General Conference Ministerial Association.

SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO STUDY SCHOLARSHIP PLAN 2809

PAN ISLAMIC CONVENTION REQUESTED 2810

VOTED, To appoint a special committee composed of R. A. Wilcox, R. C. Darnell, A. G. Zytkoskee, R. W. Wilmot, V. A. Fenn, R. H. Hartwell, and R. E. Anderson to study the colporteur scholarship revision requests.

In view of the special problems connected with the winning and holding of Moslems, it was

VOTED, To request the General Conference to arrange for calling a Pan Islamic Convention of Adventists to give study to the problems of working for M_oslems, suggesting that the Middle East Division offer to act as host for the convention if held in Beirut, Lebanon, and requesting the General Conference to appoint a chairman for the convention.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DI SCOUNTS 2811 Whereas the Middle East College has requested advice regarding the question of discounts to students in elementary school, and since the acting educational secretary presented a report showing a great divergence in discounts being offered in the various elementary schools of the Middle East, it was

VOTED, That for the 1960-1961 school year where possible a family discount be granted as follows, where two or more children of the same family are students in one of our schools during the same year:

The second child be given 10% discount The third child - 20% discount The fourth child and beyond - 30% discount

That other discounts be as follows:

Non Adventists pay full price. Adventist workers and members be granted a 25% discount.

And in the case of Adventist workers the mission educational policy be applied to the 75% collected by the school.

It was understood that the family discount was to be figured and granted before other discounts were given, and it was recognized that tuition rates cannot be the same in villages as in cities, but that discounts could be somewhat unified throughout the division.

VOTED, To adjourn at 5:00 p. m., until 8:00 a. m. June 28, 1960.

Anderson, as a special committee to POLICY study the student colporteur policy, and requists for re-2815 vising it, and that their recommendations be reported to the year-end meeting of the division committee.

E. E. COSSENTINE VISIT VOTED, That the General Conference be requested to arrange the visit of E. E. Cossentine so that he can be in the Middle East Division from September 15 to November 1, 1961

ITINE RARY APPOINTMENTS VOTED, To assign A. A. Haddad to the Nile Union August 2 to 7, 1960 for their Youth Congress, R. C. Darnell to the 2817 Nile Union June 29 to July 7, and again from September 23 to October 7, G. A. Keough July 27 to August 1 to Egypt for the teachers' institute, that he also hold teachers'

institutes in Jordan and Iraq in August as may be arranged, a teacher's institute in Iran early in September where he will be from September 1 to 10, and that he conduct the teachers' institute for Lebanon after that; R. E. Anderson visit Egypt in the period between September 23 and October 7, when R. C. Darnell and A. G. Zytkoskee are there, as he may be needed.

VOTED, To pass on to the Middle East College Board the request for E. L. Gammon to visit the Nile Union July 27 to August 7, and for Miss Edith Davis to visit Egypt July 27 to August 1 for the teachers' institute.

BRANCH SABBATH SCHOOL YEAR 2827 VOTED, That the Middle East Press be advised to proceed with the printing of the Arabic calendar for 1961 even though only 3,000 firm orders are in hand.

VOTED, To recommend that Book and Periodical Houses handle the Arabic and Armenian calendars for 1961 without profit.

VOTED, To place with the Middle East Press the order for 1,250 Arabic and 450 Armenian Week of Prayer readings for 1960 with the understanding that they will be supplied at the best prices possible.

Whereas most areas of the division have either done no Ingathering during the past few years, or at least have made a very poor showing, and whereas funds are needed to advance the work in the Middle East, and it is important that wise contacts should be made with friends, and surely something can be done everywhere, it was

VOTED, That in fields other than Cyprus, Lebanon, and Iraq, a minimum individual Ingathering goal be set at IL 10.00 or its unit equivalent, for each member, and that in Cyprus, Lebanon, and Iraq the goal set for each individual be a minimum of IL 20.00 or its unit equivalent. Where the church goals are higher it is understood that there will be special efforts made to reach these. Many members can quietly approach their special friends even where public solicitation is not permitted, and of course most of them can contribute something themselves if necessary to reach the goals.

LIES Whereas it is necessary that leaders should lead in this project as well as in all worthy endeavors, it was

<u>VOTED</u>, That in each center where there are various organizations or mission headquarters, a rally be held and all paid workers be brought together before the Ingathering campaign begins, and that each worker be encouraged to set a personal goal for Ingathering, and at the same time plans be made for the conduct of the campaign in the area concerned, and pastors and leaders instruct members in organized plans and a goal be set for each church.

Whereas the year 1960 has been designated as "Branch Sabbath School Year," and whereas there are opportunities for new branch Sabbath Schools to be opened in the Middle East, it was

VOTED, That mission administrators join with the departmental secretaries and local Sabbath School councils in studying when possible on the local committees and church boards to ascertain every means to promote this worthy project during the last half of 1960, and that, where they are not doing so already we urge every worker to

encourage both by word and by example the opening of branch Sabbath Schools.

I RAN TRAINING SCHOOL LAND 2828 <u>VOTED</u>, That in the face of extremely high costs being demanded for property adjacent to the property of the Iran Training School the Iran Mission be advised to suspend attempts to purchase additional land for the time being.

VOP BIBLE COURSE ENROLLMENTS TO BE SOUGHT WITH INGATHERING 2829 VOTED, To recommend to local fields that in the 1960 Ingathering campaign plans be made to include the use of an attractively prepared first lesson of the Bible Correspondence course, encouraging those contacted to enroll in the course, and that church members be instructed how to make the contacts in the best way.

DAY OF FASTING AND PRAYER 2830 VOTED, To recommend to the minority committee of the division that, in view of various grave and difficult problems in connection with the work in this division, plans be made to set aside September 24, 1960 as a day of special prayer and fasting.

After agreeing to refer all unfinished business to the minority committee, it was

VOTED, To adjourn at 5:10 p. m.
