U.S. TREASURY DEPARTMENT INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE--RULES RE KEEPING OF RECORDS:

New rules concerning the keeping of records, as required by the Internal Revenue Service of the U.S. Treasury Department, were presented. It was

VOTED, To record these rules for the information of our workers, as follows:

NEW RECORDKEEPING RULES FOR 1963

U.S. Treasury Department Internal Revenue Service Document No. 5049 (1-63)

<u>Documentary evidence is required</u> to support all expenditures for lodging while you are traveling away from home and for any other expenditure of \$25 or more, except that where such evidence is not readily available for transportation charges it will not be required. Documentary evidence is a receipt, paid bill or similar evidence sufficient to support an expenditure.

<u>Documentary evidence will ordinarily be considered adequate</u> to support an expenditure if it discloses the amount, date, place, and essential character of the expenditure. For example, a hotel receipt is sufficient to support expenditures for business travel if it contains the name and location of the hotel, the date or dates you stayed there, and separate amounts for charges such as for lodging, meals, and telephone. Similarly, a restaurant receipt is sufficient to support an expenditure for a business meal if it contains the name and location of the restaurant, the date and amount of the expenditure, and, if a charge is made for an item other than meals and beverages, an indication that such is the case. Some documents are not adequate evidence. A canceled check, together with a bill from the payee, ordinarily will establish the element of cost. However, a canceled check drawn payable to a named payee will not by itself support a business expenditure without other evidence to show that the check was used for a certain business purpose. Page 12.

Accounting to your employer in 1963 means that you submit to him an account book, diary, statement of expenses, or similar record maintained by you in which the information as to each element of an expenditure is recorded at or near the time you made the expenditure, together with supporting documentary evidence, all described above under the 1963 rules. You must account for all amounts received from him during the tax year as advances, reimbursements, or allowances (including those charged directly or indirectly to him through credit cards or otherwise) for travel, entertainment, and gifts. In other words you must submit to him the same type of records and supporting documentary evidence which you would be required to maintain to substantiate such deductions on your own 1963 return.

If the Internal Revenue Service determines that an employer's travel allowance practices are not based on reasonably accurate estimates of travel costs, including a recognition of cost variances encountered in different localities, the employees of that employer will not be deemed to have accounted to their employer, and will be required to substantiate the expenditure according to the rules of this pamphlet.
