## Progress

**I**N the world there are many standards by which we judge of progress; but in the Lord's work true progress is indicated by the growth of the spiritual life, and by the work done in bringing others to Christ.

The prosperity of the soul is not gauged by statistics; that is an experience attained only by prayer, meditation, and the study of the word of God. Spiritual progress is the only true progress the Christian can make. What does not help us to become more like our Lord and Master is not to be prized nor sought after. Money, position, and earthly honors give no spiritual power. The shoutings of our fellows in praise and flattery are only drags pulling us earthward. "O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness. Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life." 1 Timothy 6: 11, 12.

To bring others to Christ is the highest calling ever given to mortal man, and the present is the only time in all eternity, so far as we know, when man can do this important service for God. It will be exhilarating to sing in God's presence the song of victory; it will be wonderful to walk the golden streets of the New Jerusalem, and to partake of the marriage supper of the Lamb, in company with the blood-washed throng; but *now* and *here* is slugging, hard work — an unfinished task to be speedily done to complete God's work on the earth.

The progress we make can be known only by a careful study of statistics. The hundred and forty-four thousand, the seven churches, the seven seals, the seven last plagues, are statistical. We have to study and weigh statistics in order to know the progress we are making in this closing work.

A study of the statistics in this number will be of vital interest to every worker in the Far Eastern Division. They reveal, as in a mirror, the literature distributed, the growth in the Sabbath School, Educational, and Home Missionary endeavor, and the increase in tithes and offerings. And they show how many souls were won to Christ in each field during 1929.

Many will rejoice to see that 2,899 precious souls were added to our church membership in the Far East during the past year. This shows growth. But does it show the strength we should manifest at this time in our work? Is it our best? or can we do better? Each of us should ask, What have I contributed to the advance shown? What have I personally put into the sum total? How many of those who have given their hearts to the Lord have been converted as the result of my own life and work? Have I been a real soul-winner during the past year?

There is no seed so precious or so full of life and power as the word of God, no harvest so joyful as the harvest of souls, no reward that can compare with the reward promised to those who win men to serve the Lord. Let us so shape this day and every day that we may share in the harvest for 1930.

## Statistical Reports for 1929

### STATISTICAL REPORTS — 1929

#### FAR EASTERN DIVISION

DILIGENCE on the part of many local and union mission secretaries, with the assistance and counsel of union superintendents, has brought to us full statistical data for the year 1929, revealing the status of the Far Eastern Division of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists at the close of the year. With these facts in hand, we have compiled for the current issue of the OUTLOOK a series of statistical tables and summaries showing progress in various lines of missionary endeavor.

#### CHURCH MEMBERSHIP GAINS

Net gains in church membership during 1929 were slightly in excess of those of any preceding year, the total aggregating 2,899, bringing the number of baptized believers in the Far East up to 24,651. This total is exclusive of the 1,736 members of the Netherlands East Indies assigned as from Jan. 1, 1929, to the Central European Division. The decrease in our former membership as a result of this transfer to a sister organization, has been more than covered by gains: the membership on Dec. 31, 1929, notwithstanding the deduction of 1,736 referred to, is nevertheless 1,163 in excess of any preceding year when the Netherlands East Indies constituted an integral portion of our territory.

The net total gains for the quadrennium (Dec. 31, 1925 to Dec. 31, 1929), even after deducting the number transferred, stands at 8,852.

Net gains in church membership in the Far East for the past ten years (Dec. 31, 1919 to Dec. 31, 1929) aggregate 17,952, to which rightfully might be added the membership gains made during the nine-year period of the decade during which the Netherlands East Indies were operated as a part of the Far Eastern Division. From Dec. 31, 1919,

to Dec. 31, 1928, our net gains in the East Indies were 1,578; these added to the 17,952 gained during the ten-year period of 1919-1929, reveal an actual gain of 19,530 (net) in the Far East the past ten years. The total number of our baptisms during the decade was 28,617.

On page three is given a "Membership Chart," revealing in detail, union by union, and year by year, the running record of church membership and of baptisms.

#### CHURCH MEMBERSHIP GAINS BY UNIONS AND BY PROVINCIAL MISSIONS

The summary of gains by provincial missions, (see page 17) includes some where the figures are relatively small, but where the difficulties have been many. God is at work in places where hindrances are multiplying, as is evidenced by the record of gains in the China field the past year. Never has China had so fruitful a year in soul-winning as during 1929, when a total of 975 were added to the church membership of the previous year for unions in China and Manchuria. The ratio of increase in China during 1929, was within half a per cent. of the ratio of increase in the Philippines.

#### THE SABBATH SCHOOL DEPARTMENT

A summary of Sabbath school statistics for the Far Eastern Division appears on the upper half of page 16. The total membership, 32,326, is 7,675 in excess of the baptized church membership. This gives ground for large expectations in the winning of many hundreds of the Sabbath school membership as regular members of our churches. The Sabbath school gifts for missions have already reached the substantial sum of \$ 35,426.10 gold per annum.

#### THE PUBLISHING AND HOME MISSIONARY DEPTS.

For detailed information on the results reported from publishing and home missionary departmental activities, see pages 15 and 17, and also the Language Table on page 2. These are self-explanatory, and reveal increases in several of the unions.

#### MEDICAL DEPARTMENT

The special blessing of Heaven has attended the development of the medical department during the past year and quadrennium. A brief summary of the workings of the institutions already opened, is given on page seventeen, top. This table does not include some institutions in prospect and partially provided for, nor does it include the Shanghai Sanitarium Extension Clinic, which adds materially to the sum total of medical facilities already in existence in the Far East for the alleviation of physical suffering and for the training of medical missionary evangelists. The advances have brought courage and cheer to every union field thus provided with such agencies.

#### EDUCATIONAL AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

Pages 14 and 16 (lower half) are given over to tables revealing substantial progress in the educational and young people's work. Detailed statistics year by year on educational and missionary volunteer work are given in the last few columns of tables on pages 4-13.

#### PROGRESS BY UNIONS

Certain of the statistical tables set forth with considerable detail the progress year by year in various union fields,—see pages 4-9. Owing to the difficulty of segregating statistics for Mandarin China during years when the work was conducted under one central organization, a special table for China (on page 4) has been prepared to show progress year by year throughout all China, including the three outer provinces of Manchuria.

#### TITHES AND OFFERINGS

Detailed summaries of tithes and offerings appear on page 18.

#### WORKERS

The number of workers, both native and foreign, in service through the years, has been included in the "Membership Chart" (page three). The totals include many self-supporting workers — colporteurs and others; our school teachers, also, and nurses, are included in these summaries.

Those who make careful study of the lists of laborers through the

years, will observe that while the totals are steadily increasing, the relative ratio of number of workers to number of baptized believers is gradually decreasing—a healthful sign, other things being equal. Ten years ago one worker was listed for every six members of our constituency; six years ago, one for every ten; last year, one for every twelve and a half.

The relative ratio of number of souls won (net) per worker annually has been increased only slightly through the years, it now being approximately a net gain annually of three church members for every two workers. In the increase of this ratio of the average number of souls per annum won by individual workers, lies our potential advance in days to come. For example, a doubling of the ratio—in other words, an average of three souls a year won by each and every worker—would result in doubling our church membership during the next quadrennium—and this with no additions to our laboring forces. Three unions in our field the past quadrennium did actually double their membership (or more); these were North China, West China, (which quadrupled its membership), and the Philippines.

Of interest is the total number of foreign workers in the Far East through the years (see last few columns of the table on page three). At the close of the year 1929 there were 340, including wives of workers, and single workers (foreign). On Dec. 31, 1925 (at the beginning of the quadrennium) there were 321 (only 19 less). It should be remembered in this connection that with the beginning of the year 1929 seventeen foreign workers were transferred from our territory to the Central European Division. Increases of staffs in our medical work alone have added twenty-five or more the past five years; the educational, another twenty or more; and thus in schools and sanitariums strengthened of late, our entire foreign increase or the equivalent thereof has been more than fully absorbed. The adding of certain ones to serve as leaders of departmental lines of endeavor, and of yet others to labor in other good causes, has resulted in a net decrease of a considerable percentage of foreign workers engaged in strictly evangelistic field advances. This is a trend that calls for most careful consideration. Granting that it be a proper trend, it is highly important

that in proportion as the number of foreign evangelists decreases, we should make sure of strengthening the evangelistic courses in our training centers, of keeping before all our constituencies our church literature, and of planning for constant spiritual and mental growth among native working forces. All this emphasizes anew the importance of church officers, institutes, departmental conventions, ministerial institutes, reading courses, systematic home-study, and every other method of bringing up the working forces to a high standard. Thus patterns that point the way to increasing success in soul-winning, will be made plainer and still plainer to many who are uniting with us and are capable of becoming workmen who shall rightly divide the word of truth.

As a side-light on the trend of the times toward a strengthening of the native working forces, attention is called to the table of native ordained ministers. At present there are eighty native and eighty-four foreign ordained men; and it would seem, from a study of the annual increases of the past, another year should see the balance begin to be in favor of the native ministry. In this lies ground for strong hope.

### THE PEOPLES AMONG WHOM WE LABOR

On page two appear tables giving populations (column two) and languages in which work is being conducted both orally and through the medium of the printed page. No table, however, can be prepared that reveals the ripeness of the harvest fields where these many millions dwell. As in Far Eastern lands we get close to the people who have never heard saving gospel truth, but who seem glad to listen and willing to believe, we learn that Heavenly agencies are indeed mightily at work, preparing the way. It is our privilege and our responsibility to plan in a manner commensurate with the providential openings presenting themselves on every hand. No statistical data can cover this vital phase of our advance; only as we turn from a contemplation of our slender resources in men and means, to the One who is leading us on and on, may we know the blessedness of walking by faith and not by sight. While past progress and present strength may be comprehended in part by a study of the tables spread before us in this number of the OUTLOOK we must as workers and as laymen learn to put our entire trust in the infinite resources of our Divine

Leader, who stands ready to spiritualize our every energy, and multiply a hundred-fold the small results of the past.

In comment on Heaven's method of computing the resources of seemingly feeble groups of missionaries in lands of indescribable need, one has aptly declared:

"It seems to be a part of God's settled plan to produce and perpetuate" a constant "sense of inadequacy. He chooses 'weak things' to confound the mighty, and 'things which are not to bring to naught things that are.' The instruments of God's selection, to be properly qualified, must not only acknowledge, but be willing to glory in this arrangement. . . . Intellectual resources, pecuniary means, and strong organizations may become arms of flesh. . . . When Gideon was to be made 'the sword of the Lord' against Midian, his host was reduced to 'few men,' that no might or glory should be ascribed to the instrument. . . .

"Let us ever cherish the right spirit in regard to the inadequacy of the agency, or the want of proportion between the instrumentality employed and the results to be accomplished, in the great enterprise in which we are engaged. Ever let us realize the inadequacy of the instrumental agency, even if ever so much increased. From the extraordinary influx of wealth and intellectual resources into the church in these last days, the natural result of Christian activity, we may be approximating the critical period in the development of this great enterprise, the hour and power of temptation to fleshly confidences, and to forgetfulness of the great truth, that it is 'not by might nor by power' that the work is to be done. . . .

"What we want most of all, more than money or men, intellectual resources or an overflowing treasury, or wisdom and prudence in their management, is such faith as will bring the infinite and pledged resources of our almighty Head, the living Jesus at the right hand of the Father, to the aid of our instrumentality. Along with a deepening sense of our inadequacy, we want a more vivid, living, abiding apprehension of His actual position as our Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel, of the vastness of His power, the amplitude of His promise and His infinite veracity and trustworthiness. Here we find the life and power of all Christian enterprises, especially of this in which we are engaged. With this faith, victory is sure." c.
