THE THEME OF OUR MINISTRY.

“JOHN spake of this man.” The Baptist did little else than to speak of the coming One. But this was the sufficient object of his ministry. That was all that he was required to do; and to do this well was to fulfill the purpose for which he was sent. And it is not otherwise now. . . .

Do it privately.—John spake of Jesus to two disciples, as they stood beside him; and each became a convert and an apostle. It was so that Christianity spread in the first age, until the whole world was penetrated with its power. And probably fewer souls have been won by great preachers than by private individuals, speaking to children, friends, and neighbors, and saying, “Know the Lord.”

Do it experimentally.—“I saw and bare record.” There is nothing like personal testimony in this age of speculation and doubt. There is no voice so captivating as that which says, “Come and hear, all ye that fear God: and I will declare what he has done for my soul.” Who can resist the men, that

pointing to their own history as evidence, say, “We know that the Son of God is come, and has given us an understanding that we may know him that is true; and we are in him that is true, even in his Son Jesus Christ”? This is an age which asks eagerly for evidence; let us give the evidence of our spiritual senses, which is every bit as good as that of our natural senses, or our intellectual faculties. The spiritual eye is as certain a guide as the physical. “The eyes of our heart have been enlightened, and we have seen the Lord.”

Do it unostentatiously.—Let it be as natural as the laughter which bubbles up from the glad heart; or the song of the little child that knows no care, while it roams amid the flowers of spring. Do not divert men to yourself. Count yourself to have failed when they speak of you. Be content to be a voice, a messenger, a mirror, flashing the light onto the face of Christ from which it came. And that it may be so, keep the heart full of Jesus. The mouth must speak the things which it has made touching the King, when the heart is bubbling over with good matter.

The one thing which closes the lips of so many is the feeling that critical eyes would detect a flaw between the words and the life of the speaker. But, if there be ground for this fear, why not put the finger of faith on 1 Thess. 5:23, 24, and claim that He who has called to this work, and has inbreathed a yearning for the blameless life, should make it possible, and do exceeding abundantly, far more than he has even taught us to ask or think!—*F. B. Meyer, in “The Life and Light of Men.”*

THE translation of the Bible into the language of the Gilbert Islands has been completed. An edition of 2000 copies has been printed by the American Bible Society. Hiram Bingham, a missionary among the natives of the Gilbert Islands, has worked thirty-four years on this translation.

THE college secretary of the International Committee of the Y. M. C. A. publishes a valuable table of statistics relating to the religious condition of the colleges of North America, for the college year, 1892–93, and not including young women, or students in

professional school. It appears that 147 colleges have the English Bible in their curriculum, of which sixty-eight are in the Western States, and thirty-one are in the South; number of associations, 441; active members, 20,856; young men, 70,419; Christians, 38,327; non-Christians, 32,092; conversions, 2850; studying for ministry, 4892; studying for foreign missions, 1115.

MORE than sixty graduates or students of the Ohio Wesleyan University are now in foreign mission service. Nine members of the last graduating class are candidates for the foreign field. The University has now some twenty-five students who are preparing for missionary work — a good record — and one which it is said no other Methodist college can match.

HOME missions find no mean field in Chicago, according to the figures relating to its population. The latest returns give these nationalities: Americans, 292,463; German, 384,958; Irish, 215,534; Bohemians, 54,209; Polish, 52,756; Swedish, 45,877; Norwegian, 44,615; English, 33,785; French, 12,968; Welsh, 2936; Russian, 9977; Danes, 9891; Italians, 5000; Hollander, 4912; Hungarians, 4827; Swiss, 2735; Roumanians, 4350; Canadians, 6989; Belgians, 682; Chinese, 1217; Greeks, 698; Spanish, 297; Portuguese, 34; East Indians, 28; West Indians, 37; Sandwich Islands, 31. Total, 1,248,763.

SIDE by side with the steady growth in numbers gathered out of heathenism by the humble instrumentality of the Moravian Church is the steady increase in the number of its members who devote themselves to service in the foreign field. During the past year no less than thirty-six have gone forth, bringing the total of European missionaries to 392. At the same time the number of young men in training is unprecedented.

WE call the Chinese, heathen, and yet they have some customs that would do credit to a Christian people. On every New Year's morning each man and boy, from the emperor to the lowliest peasant, pays a visit to his mother. He carries her a present varying in value according to his station, thanking her for all that she has done for him, and asking a continuance of her favor for another year. They are taught to believe that mothers have an influence for good over their sons all through life.
