• PLANNING THE BOGOTA CAMPAIGN: For several months plans have been in the making for one of the most important evangelistic crusades ever held in Colombia. A VOP graduation is planned for at least 2,500 students on February 7. The following day, Mexican Union evangelist Carlos E. Aeschlimann, will begin a series of lectures in a large auditorium with a seating capacity of 5,000. The evangelist will be assisted by Henry Niemann of the Bogota central church and 35 other workers coming from other fields of the division. J. G. Nikkels, Upper Magdalena Conference president, will be the coordinator for the effort.

Along with the campaign a school of evangelism will be held. Classes will be taught by the evangelist and at least two other instructors. Credit for the classes will be given by the Colombia-Venezuela College. This will provide an excellent opportunity for our workers to obtain a preparation both practical and theoretical in evangelism and pastoral work.
