FROM PANAMA -- On Sabbath, September 16, there was a concentration of young people at Panama Adventist Institute during which four youth federations were officially inaugurated. The morning sermon was preached by conference president Aristides Gonzalez and conference youth leader John Parchment swore in the new federation officers.
