

MAY 6-12, 1973--A WEEK TO REMEMBER--Nineteen seventy-three has been designated by the General Conference Youth/Family Life Year to be observed around the world. As a part of this most important emphasis on the Christian family, May 6-12, 1973, has been set aside as Youth/Family Life Week.

Since the youth of our church obviously constitutes an integral part of the Youth/Family Life Week emphasis, it has been recommended that Missionary Volunteer Week 1973 be combined with Youth/Family Life Week as a joint program to be conducted in all our churches throughout the Inter-American Division.

A special series of sermons has been prepared to be used for Youth/Family Life Week and MV Week as a combined program during May 6-12. All orders for these special sermons should be submitted to the Inter-American Division. All youth directors, local MV leaders, pastors, teachers, and other persons concerned should make every effort to ensure that this combined week provides the greatest possible inspiration for the local church.--George W. LAY CONGRESS--January 5-8, 1973, marked a historic event for Guyana. Over 200 laymen attended and told some of their soul-winning experiences. Those who had won one or more, were invested. They aim to "Win three in '73," and their goal was set at 2,117 baptisms. Local lay activities leader A. B. Johnson; T. T. Billingy of the Caribbean Union; and A. H.
