FIRST INTER-AMERICAN PUBLISHING COUNCIL FOR COORDINATED PLANNING--Chaired by IAD president B. L. Archbold, the council convened March 8-13 at Pacific Press headquarters in Mountain View, California. During the session discussion was given to the coordinated plan which encom-

passes the entire sales program, including units of sales for every category of colpor teur in the principal languages of Inter-America, to be promoted and stocked by our Book and Bible Houses and Publishing Houses until the end of 1975; likewise, the Spirit of Prophecy books to be promoted in the churches during 1973 and 1974. The need was stressed for a well-organized training program for the Publishing Department and Book and Bible House leadership to better serve the 5,000 literature evangelists being recruited in Inter-America.—IAD Publishing Bulletin.

DOUBLE CENTURIONS--Inter-America has 134 double centurions who during the combined years of 1971 and 1972 won 200 or more souls. The centurions are distributed in the following unions: Antillian, 14; Caribbean, 16; Central American, 14; Colombia-Venezuela, 9; Franco-Haitian, 27; Mexican, 24; West Indies, 30.

WORLD'S LARGEST FIVE-DAY PLAN--Twelve hundred persons quit smoking in Mexico City as a result of the Five-Day Plan clinic sponsored by the Temperance Society of Mexico and co-sponsored by the Mexican Social Security Institute. Almost 3,000 persons crowded night after night into the hall provided by that government agency. The clinic was conducted by Drs. Braulio Perez Marcio and Vernon W. Foster and Pastor Pedro Arano Molina. Also co-operating on the part of the Social Security Institute were Drs. Roberto Sandoval, Aguirre Zozaya and Roberto Robles Garnica, the latter director of the Depart ment of Preventive Medicine.
