The plan of using the Sabbath school class as an evangelistic unit is gaining ground in the West Puerto Rico Conference. Every adult, youth, earliteen and junior class in more than 60 Sabbath schools has set a minimum goal of winning one soul per quarter per class. The total of 1,291 souls surpasses the basic goal for the entire conference according to Rafael Colon Soto, Sabbath school secretary. --T. R. Haylock.
