POST GENERAL CONFERENCE CHANGES—Elder L. Herbert Fletcher, chosen at the time of the General Conference Session as director of the Youth Department of the Inter-American Division, has felt impressed to continue as president of the West Indies College, a post he has held for the past two years. The Inter-American Division Committee then recommended to the General Conference Committee that Elder C. D. Christian, elected at the session as director of the Lay Activities Department, fill this vacancy as director of the Youth Department; and that Elder Sergio Moctezuma carry both the Sabbath School Department, to which he was elected, and the Lay Activities Department.

Elder Angel Perez, formerly treasurer of the Antillian Union, will now be secretary-treasurer of that Union. Brother Juan Prestol, secretary-treasurer of the North Dominican Mission, has been named auditor of the Union; and Elder Wilson Roberts, who was attending Andrews University with bursary assistance, will be the director of the Youth and Education Departments of the Antillian Union Conference.

Elder Aristides Gonzalez, president of the Panama Conference, has been named secretary of the Central American Union, to join the other two officers previously announced: Elder Robert S. Folkenberg, president; and Elder Juan de Armas, treasurer.

In the West Indies Union, to fill the vacancy created by Elder M. G. Nembhard's appointment to the Inter-American Division, Elder S. N. McKinney, president of Bahamas Conference, has been appointed secretary of that Union.———J. H. Figueroa.

NEW CONFERENCE ORGANIZED IN CARIBBEAN UNION—On August 27, 1975, a new conference was born in the Caribbean Union and named the North Caribbean Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. It's territory consists of Anguilla, Antigua, Barbuda, Montserrat, Nevis, St. Kitts, St. Eustatius, St. Croix, St. Johns, St. Martin, St. Thomas, Tortolla and Virgin Gorda. The new conference is composed of 42 churches with a membership of over 7,000 believers.

The newly elected president of this conference is W. W. Thompson, formerly president of the East Caribbean Conference. Also elected as secretary-treasurer is Eugene Blackman, formerly secretary-treasurer of the East Caribbean Conference. The departmental directors are: publishing, Campbell Rogers; lay activities, Sabbath school and communication, J. C. Schillingford; youth, health and temperance, Oriel Fleming; stewardship and education, E. W. Carnegie; and ABC manager, Eugene A. Blackman.

The North Caribbean Conference has tremendous resources and potentials in terms of finances and man power. This new organization will undoubtedly add substantially to the strength of the Caribbean Union. Within recent years the region that now comprises the North Caribbean Conference has experienced a mushrooming growth in church membership through the Evangelistic Outreach that has swept throughout the territory. Over 50 percent of the total membership of the North Caribbean Conference are in the under 35 age group. The theme of the Conference, Even So Come Lord Jesus, seems to be the overwhelming passion of the believers in the North Caribbean Conference.—George W. Brown.
