345 PERSONS BAPTIZED IN SIX WEEKS—The gigantic crusade in Campbellville, Greater Georgetown, Guyana came to a glorious end with the baptism of 345 persons of varying ages, races, and previous religious backgrounds. We conducted baptisms on the fifth Sabbath afternoon of the crusade, the following Tuesday night, Thursday night, and Sabbath morning. We experienced a beautiful Welcome and Communion Service that Sabbath afternoon, and the graduation ceremony on the Sunday night brought an exciting crusade to an end. It was a crusade of miracles: the largest harvest of souls in the history of Guyana; an unusually large number of Indians baptized; an evil spirit cast out; many receiving Sabbath privileges from work; families re-united; no rain except on the second night; an excellent attendance nightly; new methods developed and tested; excellent music nightly; and a lot of prayer and hard work by all the team.—*K. CARACAS CRUSADE—With six pastors officiating, 94 persons were baptized last Sabbath at the first baptism.
