EVANGELIZATION WITH PUBLICATIONS-When the territory was divided to form the Central Mexican Conference and the West Mexican Mission early in 1975, leaders of the Central Mexican Conference realized they were left with only three licensed and eight new colporteurs. Under the circumstances, we did not know how we could reach our annual goal for deliveries of Ps 1,000,000 (US\$ 80,000). However, the Lord has blessed our publishing leader, Pastor Humberto Carpiette, and the publishing program in such a marvelous way that we have not only reached but surpassed the goal suggested by the Union, with a total of Ps 1,367,542.10 message-filled books distributed by the end of the third quarter. The 11 colporteurs that we had at the beginning of the year have now been increased to 33; and, with the help of God, we expect to recruit a record number of Literature Evangelists by the end of the year.
