

These students were selected on the basis of physical fitness, scholastic ability, and emotional stability. AU named them the "Seven Nutrinauts" because they are studying the unknown in nutrition. This experiment is designed to test National Research Council standards for the minimum vitamin and mineral requirements of late-teen-age girls. The subject must discipline herself to eat and drink only measured solids and liquids while following her otherwise normal routine. Preparations for the experiment began in April, 1962, but the actual 25-day "countdown" began February 12. Numerous girls were under observation for many months before the final seven were selected.
