

Route to:

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Rising 135 feet above the ground, the central theme building at Los Angeles International Airport contains a restaurant, lounge, and observation deck. Cradled beneath the arches the structure offers a 360-degree view of the airport activity, the Pacific Ocean, and surrounding communities.

The impressive Court of Flags has in its center an eight-foot-high perpetual "Flame of Freedom," symbolizing progress and understanding in the age of flight, as well as vigorous but friendly competition of free nations at peace. Domestic and foreign airlines serving the area are represented by flags unfurled on 63-foot-high poles.

The control tower, 172 feet tall, with office space and radar electronic equipment, dominates the entrance to the terminal area.







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The **INDUSTRIAL** experiences where the hand is trained  
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► Seven freshmen coeds are the first "Nutrinauts" in a highly exacting human metabolism study, sponsored by an agency of the U. S. Government, being conducted by the home economics and chemistry departments of Andrews University. These students were selected on the basis of physical fitness, scholastic ability, and emotional stability. AU named them the "Seven Nutrinauts" because they are studying the unknown in nutrition. This experiment is designed to test National Research Council standards for the minimum vitamin and mineral requirements of late-teen-age girls. The subject must discipline herself to eat and drink only measured solids and liquids while following her otherwise normal routine. Preparations for the experiment began in April, 1962, but the actual 25-day "countdown" began February 12. Numerous girls were under observation for many months before the final seven were selected.

► Southfield Junior Academy in Detroit has a going student association. During February the students conducted a student-faculty day in which the students did all the teachers' work. The only adult on duty was the principal's secretary. Alfred Lui, the student association president, acted as principal. The students have also conducted an enthusiastic ping-pong tournament and amateur hour. The school has this year added to its plant 114 lockers, a band, a hot-lunch program, and a large section of blacktop on the playground.
