Being a Norwegian, Paulsen becomes the first European and the second non-American to be the president of the world church. It is said also that he is the first GC President having an earned doctoral degree which he earned at Tubingen University in Germany in 1972.


Since he had started denominational service as a ministerial intern in Norway in 1954, he has been serving the church at home and in mission field as a pastor, department director, Bible teacher, college president, and division secretary. He has served for 12 years as the president of the Trans-European Division until he was elected as one of the General Vice-presidents of the GC in 1995.

More than any other good qualities he has he is a spiritual man and a dedicated leader. He is an open and broad-minded administrator. I am sure the Lord will use him in a mighty way at this very significant time of earth's history, the closure of the second millennium, and even beyond.

I cannot finish my article without mentioning a few lines about the contributions Elder Robert Folkenberg has made to the world church during the last eight and a half years. It is regrettable indeed that he has to resign from the office of the GC President in the middle of his term. However, he chose to resign not to bring any more negative effect on the church because of the litigation filed against him by Mr. James Moore, his personal business associate.

During his administration the church has experienced rapid membership growth, from six million to ten million. Some 13,000 new congregations were established in the formerly unentered territories through the Global Mission initiatives. Had not his innovative vision the global evangelism utilizing cutting edge technology, especially through a satellite transmission network might have been delayed at least several years. Our division owes him a lot. The creations of the NSD and SSD, and the incorporation the EAA territory into a regular division organization, are the result of his far sighted vision.


Eight Korean students went to China.

On October 19, 1998, there was an interview between the NSD leaders and the seven university students. The purpose for the sponsoring organization was to know those students who applied to the scholarship.



They are young and brave by the grace of God and they will be able to understand, read, speak and write Chinese.
