- 2. Mission: To proclaim to 25% of the world's population who live in the NSD territory the everlasting gospel in the context of the three angels' messages of Revelation 14:6-12, leading them to accept Jesus as their personal Savior, helping them unite with His Body, nurturing them in preparation for His soon return, euipping and empowering them for service.

When Jesus said "Go Make Disciples..." to 500 men and women on that spring day 2000 years ago, He was not thinking that simply one million out of twelve million Seventh-day Adventists should work for the salvation of their fellowmen and women. "The Savior's commission to the disciples included all the believers... All who receive the life of Christ ARE ORDAINED to work for the salvation of their fellowmen. For this work the church was established, and all who take upon themselves its sacred vows are thereby pledged to be co-workers with Christ." [DA 822]

project. KUC has already submitted a written strategy. Among the unions and conferences, CHUM and KUC have selected KITS and training Centers have been identified in Hong Kong-Macau as well as Taiwan.



Sabbath school met in the sub-basement all those years. This group is mainly Filipino maids and workers, our teachers, and other foreigners that work around Taipei.

This group in recent months have felt the urging of the Holy Spirit to reach out and spread the gospel to others and to offer a place where we can bring our school parents and students and other foreigners to an English only service. And of course Chinese speaking people that want to learn more English. Our mission is to reach the unreached with the gospel and to provide a loving, caring environment in which to do it.

In recent years Taiwan has experienced a huge interest and upsurge in learning English. Last year a young man from the country of Malawi came to Taiwan for six months to study at the College of Technology. There he met Narissa. He often invited her to come to church with him. She finally consented and fell in love with Jesus. She was baptised and started bringing her fellow classmates to church. This group numbers from 10-20 every Sabbath. One main attraction is the English Bible classes that are offered for their benefit. Several from the Chinese church have become involved as has Mike Munsey, one of our teachers and these with others offer a comprehensive program starting at 8:30 A.M. Sabbath morning and continuing on throughout the Sabbath Day with Bible studies and then nature activities in the afternoon. This group joining with our Adult English Sabbath School group is swelling the crowd to over 50. As you can see we have a ready made church.

It is a joy and privilege to go to church these days. Narissa is such an inspiration to all of us in her persistence in calling her classmates and inviting them to church. She is actually Burmese-Chinese, She is facing Sabbath problems being enrolled in an electronics course and they have to take tests on Sabbath. She is thinking of going to Taiwan Adventist College to major in English and Secretarial. Pray for her that she will know God's will for her life.

Please keep God's new church in your prayers that we will listen to His leading and we will win more souls for Him.


Manuals of Spiritual Gifts - produced by Japan Publishing House

the Japan Publishing House published "Network," the spiritual gifts materials, for the Christians in Japan. The materials include: Leader's Guide,

Participant's Guide, Consultant's Guide, Operation Guide, Over Head Projector Master Sheets, and two video tapes.

The original materials of "Network" were developed by Bruce Bugbee, Don Cousins, and Bill Hybels of the Willow Creek Community Church and published by Zondervan in the United States of America. The Willow Creek Community Church is one of the most rapid growing churches in America and the church has used "Network" as the materials for lay training.

"Network" is divided into three stages, namely "Discover,"
"Interview" and "Service." Through studying the materials,
lay people can discover their passion for the Lord, their

spiritual gifts, and their special areas to serve Him. Thus "Network" is designed to prepare the church members to make the church be functional and lively.

According to Yasuki Miyamoto, director of Sabbath School/ Personal Ministries department at the Japan Union Conference, he found no good Japanese materials for the spiritual gifts in the Adventist church as well as in other denominations as he worked for establishing the healthy churches. Thus, he began to negotiate with the Willow Creek Community Church to translate "Network" into Japanese in the beginning of 1999 and got permission in the middle of the year. The work of translation was completed by the end of 2001.

Miyamoto plans to conduct a seminar for the Willow Creek "Network" Memorial Sale on March 25 - 26, 2002 at the Ochanomizu Christian Center Chapel in Tokyo. The guest speaker is David (Soo Gwon) Chai, Asian Region Director for the Willow Creek Community Church. Since the Japanese materials are targeted to all Christians, this seminar is open to any Christian denomination and organization. The registration fee is Japanese 2,000 yen (US\$15.38).

The opening discount sale of "Network" will be from March 25 to June 30, 2002 with the special price Japanese 19,800 yen (about US\$152.31) plus 5% tax. After this term, the price will be 22,000 yen (US\$169.23) plus the tax.

This project was announced on Christian Shinbun, the Christian weekly paper, on January 27, 2002. It was the first time for the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Japan to be accepted by the paper for any news or advertisements. Until this time, the paper has never dealt with the Adventist church, because the paper has not considered the church as one of the main stream Christian churches.
