BANGKOK CLINIC SPARED By Dr. R. F. Waddell

The clinic had a miraculous escape recently. About ten o'clock one night a fire started in one of the shops across the street. Within a few minutes the entire block was going up in flames. The wind was blowing the fire toward the Clinic and it looked as though it might go up too. The patients all became panicky and were stampeding, most of them walked out, and those that couldn't were carried out by their friends. The nurses tried to telephone me but the line was out of order. Finally a Chinese friend of ours happened to see the blaze, came to our house and awakened us. We went to the Clinic with due haste (60 miles an hour), but found the place deserted except for our faithful nurses and dressers who were busy carrying water to soak down the roof laundry, pulling down chicks, and watching to see that looters did not break in.

Fortunately the wind began to change and drove the flames in the opposite direction, and the clinic was spared. Within five hours the conflagration had razed and gutted 4,000 shops, wiped out several square blocks and inflicted damage estimated at well over 2,000,000 ticals.

We are all very thankful to God for His protecting care over us. Many people came to the clinic this morning to enquire as to the institution's safety. One rich old man came hurrying over very early and seemed so glad to know that all was well. He, although a heathen, exclaimed, "Your God protected you from that awful

WHAT WE MAY KNOW OF COMING EVENTS

As one meditates after listening to the news as flashed from the many radio stations in these days of distress and perplexity, he cannot but question what is to be the outcome of it all. He seriously asks, "What does the future hold in store for us?"

We may not be able to outline the exact course of the various nations in the present dilemma, but one thing is certain; we need not be in darkness concerning the coming events. We are "children of light." For as a "light that shineth in a dark place" the rays of prophetic instruction light up the pathway of the future to each and every one who diligently studies the instruction Gcd has given through His Word and the Spirit of prophecy. The Bible prophecy outlines in general the experiences before us, while the Spirit of prophecy unfolds them more specifically.

We marvel that the disciples, in the light of the Saviour's plain prophecies were unprepared for the closing scenes of His earthly ministry. That we are imperiled by the same dangers today is made plain in "Great Controversy" page 594 in the following words:

"In the prophecies the fuutre is opened before us as plainly as it was opened to the disciples by the words of Christ. The events connected with the close of probation and the work of preparation for the time of trouble, are clearly presented. (Italics mine) But multitudes have no more understanding of these important truths than if they had never been revealed. Satan watches to catch away every impression that would make them wise unto salvation, and the time of trouble will find them unready."

We Need Not Be Ignorant

Do we know these events and the experiences needed in preparation for the close of probation as it is our privilege to know them? Or are we allowing ourselves to be dupes to Satan's devices so that the time of trouble will find us unprepared?

We need not be ignorant concerning the future events or the preparation needed, for God has instructed us more earnestly now than ever before as the following statement clearly shows: "In ancient times God spoke to men by the mouth of prophets and apostles. In these days He speaks to them by the Testimonies of His Spirit. There was never a time when God instructed His people more earnestly than He instructs them now concerning His will, and the course that He would have them pursue.—"Testimonies," Vol. 5, 661. (Italies mine).

If Not, Why Not?

Are we availing ourselves of the privilege that is ours? Do we possess the various books in which the instruction concerning the future experiences of God's people are clearly presented? If not, why not? Of if we possess them, are we diligently studying them in order that we may not be in darkness concerning the impending conflict and the preparation needed to stand victoriously through it all?

The two books that present the most direct and detailed account of the coming events are "Early Writings' and "Great Contro-They clearly present the versy." union of civil and religious powers, and what such a union will mean to those who stand firm for God's revealed will. Within their pages is outlined in no indefinite language, the place spiritism with all its deceivableness, signs, lying wonders, and miracles will hold in the great scheme of the adversary of Gods truth and people. There we will find clearly revealed just what the image of the beast is and when and how it is formed, the work it will accomplish and what our personal relation should be to every device contrived to accomplish our downfall.

But more than this, and even more important to us, is that in these two books is clearly presented what we should be doing now in this time of apparent peace, in order that we can be ready to stand as victors in the trying days before us. Also great and precious promises of assurances of God's care for every one of His true children are so positively set forth that in the very knowledge of them our faith and courage will be greatly strengthened. Vivid pictures of the final outcome both to the sinner and the saint, are portrayed in these two important and wonderful volumes.

The Coming Crisis

The following statements quoted from "Great Controversy" will help us realize the importance of knowing what God in His compassionate love has given us in view of the closing scenes of the controversy:

"The season of distress and anguish before us will require a faith that can endure weariness, delay, and hunger,—a faith that will not faint, though severely tried. The period of probation is granted to all to prepare for that time."—"Great Controversy," page 621.

"Those who delay a preparation for the day of God cannot obtain it in the time of trouble, or at any subsequent time. The case of all such is hopeless,"—Id., page 620.

"Are the people of God now so firmly established upon His word that they would not yield to the evidence of their senses? Would they, in such a crisis, cling to the Bible, and the Bible only? Satan will, if possible, prevent them from obtaining a preparation to stand in that day. He will so arrange affairs as to hedge up their way, entangle them with earthly treasures, cause them to carry a heavy, wearisome burden, that their hearts may be overcharged with the cares of this life, and the day of trial may come upon them as a thief."—Id., pp. 625-26.

Shall we allow Satan to so arrange our affairs that we will not take time to read and study the words of counsel and warning God has so graciously given us in His word and in these books which shed such detailed prophetic light upon the experiences of the future?

For several months Brother Sitanggang, our Batak worker in the Southern part of Thailand, has been calling for Brother Kon Vui-leong and me to come to visit him and to baptise some interested ones. Hence we went South on the 22nd of July and after examining some of the candidates decided to baptise two, a Chinese man and his wife.

On Sabbath, July 29, we had a brief service in Yala, after which a number of us went by bus to a lovely place by the river. Here was a most suitable place for the sacred ordinance to be administered, shut off as it is from any who might not understand what we were doing. Here we were privileged to bury this couple with their Lord in baptism.

There is apparently a wonderful opportunity before us in the South and we believe that this brother and sister are but the first-fruits of a goodly harvest of souls in that section of our field. How our hearts ache for more labourers. We could well use a score of consecrated workers, and should by all means have another foreign missionary family or two. Then too, as Brother Kon and I visited portions of the South in the interests of our Harvest Ingathering funds, we were again most forcibly impressed with the mar-velous opportunity and the most urgent need for a medical work there. There are hundreds of well-to-do Chinese and many scores
