## Beware of False Teachers

The Word of God tells us that in the last days false teachers shall arise from amongst us who will seek to turn away God's people "from the truth . . . unto fables." (II Tim. 4:3-4.)

This prophecy is being fulfilled very subtly here in our British West Indies Union. Agents of so-called "new light" called the "Shepherd's Rod" are at work surreptitiously in some of our churches attempting to tear down the church of God by sowing seeds of suspicion and discord. They come with a very sanctimonious air "deploring" the spiritual declension in the church and glibly quoting (or misquoting) the Spirit of Prophecy, in an attempt to support fantastic interpretations of prophecy that are neither Biblical nor in harmony with the writings of Sister White.

By methods, fair or foul, they secure names and addresses of Seventh-day Adventist church members to whom will be mailed large quantities of their pernicious literature. The main burden of their message is a subtle attack upon the leaders of the movement, and crafty insinuations against the church as a whole. This they do under the guise of being good Seventh-day Adventist church members.

The Lord tells us that their evil work is but a sign of the last days in which we live.

It is Satan's work to bring discord and trouble into the ranks of God's church at a time when we ought to be getting ready to meet the Saviour ourselves and also be working untiringly to give this

Third Angel's Message to the unwarned world about us.

### God's Church Precious to Him

"For thus saith the Lord of hosts; After the glory hath he sent me unto the nations which spoiled you: for he that toucheth you toucheth the apple of his eye." (Zech. 2:8.)

### "The Lord Looked Down from Heaven... to See"

It's a striking thought, isn't it? So much of the time we forget that God is constantly watching His children, and often His heart is grieved because He sees that we are so forgetful of His love for us. But He never forgets us, and He is always working for our eternal welfare.

In His wisdom He planned that those who became His children through the blood of Christ would be much happier if they were helping others to know Jesus. He knew also that if His children were busy they would be less subject to the temptations of Satan, and would the more surely enter the eternal kingdom; so God planned.

His plan was that the gospel was to go to all the world, and He gave the responsibility to men. First, Christ came and paid the price required for our redemption. Then the commission was given to the disciples and they zealously worked for the Master. As their numbers grew, churches were established. Through the centuries the church had its trials and problems. winning souls through Ingathering. Too many think that they are excused from this particular phase of soul-winning. They think it is the work of the ministers and a few select laymen. Perhaps the importance of Ingathering was not too clear to them. Perhaps they don't quite understand! Today, as in the days of David, "The Lord looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand..."

Dear friend, as He looks down and sees you, does He find that you understand that you also must do your part in the Ingathering so that souls will have an opportunity to enjoy the blessings of salvation? Are you fully acquainted with God's plan? Is your first and greatest interest in life to win souls, or do you let other things come first? ## God's Answers to Man's Excuses

**EXCUSE:** I operate a cultivation and do not keep separate account of all items; such as milk, eggs, crops, etc., but lump them all in together. If there is anything left at the end of the year, after paying bills, I tithe that; otherwise I do not pay tithe. It is too much work to keep account of the milk, eggs, garden produce, etc., my family consumes. We simply cannot be bothered with such items, but throw them all into the general items and let it go at that. What my family consumes is a small matter, so why try to keep track of such things with the idea of tithing them? Since hardly any cultivation makes a profit these days, why should I be expected to pay tithe? The brother in the city church can pay tithe because he earns a wage each week, but the poor cultivator doesn't make anything, consequently he has nothing to tithe.

**ANSWER:** There was a time, years ago, when the cultivator was the main financial support of this cause. While profits in those days were never large, nevertheless nearly every cultivator among us found a way to keep an account of his earnings and pay an honest tithe upon the same. We never heard it said in those days that the cultivator could not tell what his profits were, neither was it said that we did not make anything, consequently had not tithe to pay. We have deep sympathy for our brethren on cultivations in these times, but while that is true, surely in every case there must be some income. Everything is not a loss. Many of our brethren on cultivations are faithful tithe payers and keep an accurate account each month of their dairy income, crop incomes, fruit income, poultry, etc.. They have no difficulty in knowing what is expense and what is net income after expense has been taken out. When they use for themselves milk, eggs, and vegetables and fruit they can readily place a market value upon these things that they consume upon their tables. Surely those things used in the home are a part of the income and should be as faithfully tithed, as I am supposed to tithe the income from any garden I might plant.

There is a real danger that too many of our brethren may be inclined to offer excuses in this matter that God will not accept. The Lord will prosper the Seventh-day Adventist cultivator who faithfully pays his tithe. He will not bless the one who offers excuses for non-tithe paying. I verily believe more of our brethren would be blessed in the money

whose end shall be according to their works." (II Cor. 11:13-15.)

Satan came to Adam and Eve in the form of a beautiful serpent, not as the great destroyer that he is. He does the same thing today. Note the following warning from the pen of inspiration:

"It will be found that those who bear false messages will not have a high sense of honour and integrity. They will deceive the people, and mix up with their error the "Testimonies" of Sister White, and use her name to give influence to their work. They make such selections from the "Testimonies" as they think they can twist to support their positions, and place them in a setting of falsehood, so that their error may have weight and be accepted by the people. They misinterpret and misapply that which God has given to the church to warn, counsel, reprove, comfort, and encourage those who shall make up the remnant people of God." By this misusing of the "Testimonies", souls are placed in perplexity, because they cannot understand the relation of the "Testimonies" to such a position as is taken by those in error; for God intended that the "Testimonies" should always have a setting in the framework of truth.

"Those who advocate error, will say, 'The Lord saith,' 'when the Lord hath not spoken.'" *Test. to Ministers*, pp. 42, 43.

"Be it known that these men are on the side of the great deceiver. Believe them not. They are allying themselves with the enemies of God and the truth. From such turn away, have no fellowship with their message, however much they may quote the "Testimonies" and seek to intrench themselves behind them. Receive them not; for God has not given them this work to do." *Id.*, pp. 51, 52.

"But the fact that a movement to establish error is connected with a work which is in itself good, is not an argument in favour of the error. We may disguise poison by mingling it with wholesome food, but we do not change its nature. On the contrary, it is rendered more dangerous, as it is more likely to be taken unawares. It is one of Satan's devices to combine with falsehood just enough truth to give it plausibility." *The Great Controversy*, p. 587.

### ATTACKS UPON THE LEADERSHIP

Notice what the Servant of the Lord has to say about attacks upon the leadership of the movement:

"Satan knows how to make his attacks. He works upon minds to excite

jealousy and dissatisfaction toward those at the head of the work. Next follows skepticism in regard to the vital points of our faith, the pillars of our position, then doubt as to the Holy Scriptures, and then the downward march to perdition." *Testimonies for the Church*, Vol. V., p. 672.

It is not contended that all of our ministers and leaders are perfect. We are all sinners saved by grace, with Paul struggling toward the mark of the high calling in Christ Jesus. With the apostle we all say:

"Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus. Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended; but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." (Phil. 3:12-14.)

### NEW LIGHT WILL COME THROUGH THE DENOMINATIONAL ORGANIZATION

The Lord has made it abundantly clear through His Servant that when new light comes to the Advent people that it will come through the proper channels—the denomination. He will not raise up some stray individual to head some fanatical offshoot. Note well these words:

"God has not passed His people by, and chosen one solitary man here and another there as the only ones worthy to be entrusted with His truth. He does not give one man new light contrary to the established faith of the body. In every reform men have arisen making this claim.

"Paul warned the church in his day, 'Of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them'. The greatest harm to God's people comes through those who go out from among them speaking perverse things. Through them the way of truth is evil spoken of."

*Test.*, Vol. 5, p. 291.

### HOW TO RECEIVE MESSENGERS OF ERROR

When these false teachers come with their subtle doctrines how shall we receive them? How shall we know how to recognize them?

First we can examine books and tracts carefully to determine their origin. All of our Seventh-day Adventist literature has the imprint of our own Publishing Houses. All of our members will recognize these immediately. If you receive some tracts with fantastic symbols and printed in Waco, Texas, or Mt. Carmel, Texas, claiming to contain "new light"

you will know that this is spurious! The Lord tells us plainly how we should receive agents who seek to interest us in such:

"Whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son. If there come any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house, neither bid him God speed: For he that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds." (II John 9:11.)

"Now I beseech you, brethren, mark them which cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned; and avoid them." (Rom. 16:17)

"God is displeased with us when we go to listen to error, without being obliged to go; for unless He sends us to those meetings where error is forced home to the people by the power of the will, He will not keep us. The angels cease their watchful care over us, and we are left to the buffetings of the enemy, to be darkened and weakened by him and the power of his evil angels; and the light around us becomes contaminated with the darkness. . . While false doctrines and dangerous errors are pressed upon the mind, it cannot be dwelling upon the truth which is to fit and prepare the house of Israel to stand in the day of the Lord." *Early Writings*, pp. 124, 125.

These are not my words—they are the inspired words of God through the apostles and His servant to the Remnant Church! Let us heed His instruction!

### CALL TO UNITY

In these last days God calls for unity in the ranks of His people. "Let each one who claims to follow Christ, esteem himself less, and others more. Press together, press together! In union there is strength and victory; in discord and division there is weakness and defeat. These words have been spoken to me from heaven. As God's ambassador, I speak them to you." *Test. for Church*, Vol. V., p. 428.

We have a great message to give to the world. We must not be turned aside by "offshoots". God is leading a people and not stray offshoots. Let us press together to finish the work of God in the world!

Let us stay by the old ship Zion and our heavenly Pilot will take us safely through. Let us study God's word more earnestly than ever before. Let us study the writings of the Spirit of Prophecy more than ever before, living every day as though it were our last. Then God will give us a part in the glorious triumph of the Advent movement when His Son comes in the very near future.

## ERRORS IN THE TEACHING

1. The Bible and the Spirit of Prophecy teach that "the Harvest" spoken in the thirteenth chapter of Matthew is the end of the world. The Shepherd's Rod says, No, it is the loud cry of the third angel's message.

*The Bible:*

"The harvest is the end of the world." Matt. 13:39; See also Rev. 14: 17-20.

*The Spirit of Prophecy:*

"The tares and the wheat are to grow together until the harvest; and the harvest is the end of probationary time."

"The wheat and the tares grow together until the harvest, the end of the world."—*Christ's Object Lessons*, pp. 72 & 75.

2. "The Shepherd's Rod" states that the separation of the tares and the wheat comes "at the commencement of the harvest" or "the loud cry". The Spirit of Prophecy states that the separation takes place *after* "the work of the gospel completed".

*The Spirit of Prophecy:*

"When the mission of the gospel is completed, the judgment will accomplish the work of separation . . ."

"Both the parable of the tares and that of the net plainly teach that there is no time when all the wicked will turn to God. The wheat and the tares grow together until the harvest. The good and the bad fish are together drawn ashore for a final separation.

"Again, these parables teach that there is to be no probation after the judgment. When the work of the gospel is completed, there immediately follows the separation between the good and the evil, and the destiny of each class is forever fixed."—*Christ's Object Lessons*, pp. 122, 123. (old edition).

Brother and Sister D. P. The following is just one of many stories turned in by Sister Waldo:

#### *Ships that Pass in the Night*

"She told me the people in the house here, where she was stopping, were very worldly and that it was refreshing to meet someone so wholesome! She said: 'Why haven't I met you before?'

"She seemed lonely and wanted to talk more about the Bible. So I took her to our home for lunch and the time was well spent. She requested me to autograph her book and as we parted she said: 'Who knows but the Lord sent me, way down to the Bahamas to meet you and to get this book!' (Who knows!)

"Someway I feel that we shall meet again on the wharf when our ships have anchored on the shores of eternity! Who knows?"

During the month of March our three colporteurs delivered books amounting to £155. 12. 9 and took orders in the amount of £413. 4. 1.

Good reports are coming in from our other workers also. Here are a few excerpts from Brother Paul Ward's recent letter which indicate how the Lord is blessing the efforts of our people in that

district:

"I thank the Lord for a profitable visit in the Landrail Point (Crooked Island) District recently. Brother Frank Scavella and I visited three other settlements where we spent four days. We had meetings every night in the school room, and during the days we visited every home in these settlements, giving Bible studies. The people were anxious to hear the message. I never met people before so eager to hear the Word of God.

"When I arrived Sunday afternoon in one of the settlements, one of the Baptist ministers told me that if I were not successful in getting the public school house for meetings, I could have the use of his church during my stay. We were successful in getting the school house for the services, however, but he attended each one.

"I do hope and pray that we may be able to hold a public evangelistic effort in the near future in this area for the door is open for us and what we have to do, we must do quickly!

"The Landrail Point church is running fine . . . and the building is now very attractive. It can't be beaten! Brother Frank Scavella and those other brethren who helped to build and re-model it deserve credit, for it is a modern church and very neat in every way.

"While I was there, the Baptist minister in Landrail Point was converted and took his stand definitely for the truth. After thoroughly instructing him, the church voted to accept his application for membership and he was later received into the church on profession of faith. His wife also took her stand. She is awaiting your next visit at which time she desires baptism and membership in the church there."

The Mission has fallen in line with the rest of the Union in observing the Wednesday morning eight o'clock special prayer season for the unreached and unconverted. It is also singing: "Lord Lay Some Soul Upon My Heart" and this is having its effect for good, as more and more take an active part in soul-winning work. Another baptism was held for the Nassau churches on Sunday morning, the 2nd which makes two baptisms in the Shirley Street Church for the first quarter and one in the Grants Town Church for the same period. Many are calling for the rite to be administered throughout the Mission. Surely this is the time to work as never before for the Master, whether it be the colporteur work, the ministerial effort or whatever it may be. This can and must be our best soul-winning year!

## Items of Interest from West Jamaica

All honour to our godly, successful laymen who are really the backbone of our soul-winning work in the West Jamaica Mission. These men are truly modern heroes who are doing exploits.

Here is a report from the layman's movement of the Mount Carey church which should be an inspiration to those who are taking an active part in finishing the work of God in the earth in this generation. This is what Brother Brown writes:

"Just to let you know the work for quarter ending March, 1947. Mount Horeb school stands at 67 in membership, and out of that we have baptized 10 on March 30, making a total baptized of 21, with 14 more in the baptismal class to be baptized in June. The tithes and offerings from this school amounted to £15 14 7.

"The membership of the Cambridge Sabbath school is now 21. We have rented a place to keep our school. Since working here we have kept only three meetings and one family decided to join the Sabbath school and many others believe the truth. Their offerings amounted to £1 18 9.

"The Rohampton Sunday school's membership is 40 and we have already baptized one from this place."

If the laymen in every church would be as energetic as those of the Mount Carey church, the work would be quickly finished. These brethren have to travel 15 miles for one visit to either Cambridge or Mount Horeb.

The response of the people at Mile Gully to the Advent message is truly wonderful. This being an entirely new place for the message it is indeed a fulfilment of the Lord's promise to pour out His Spirit upon His people. The work that has usually taken three months to accomplish has been done in one month. A definite evidence that God is cutting short His work in these last days.

The meetings were started on the 9th of March and on the 5th of April they had their first Sabbath services when 120 new believers attended Sabbath school and other services, 90 remaining until the close of the Sabbath.

The members of the Bible class number 400, and at 6:30 each evening they eagerly gather to drink deeper of the wonderful truths presented.

A gentleman who has never attended one of the meetings because of illness, but lives near enough to hear the singing, was so impressed that he voluntarily offered an acre of land in a very important part of the district for a church spot, and has also promised to give lumber to help build the church. Another man has offered a cedar tree, and the believers are so anxious to have a church building that they have actually started collecting funds for this purpose.

Pastor Haig and Sister Pringle have found it impossible to answer the many calls that are coming in from adjoining districts.

Pastor Lindo reports a very good interest at Kellits, where he is also conducting an effort in a new place. We hope that before long a church will be raised up in this place.

This month being the time for our Ingathering campaign, all our ministers have throttled down their evangelistic efforts to two or three meetings per week so as to help put the campaign over the top. Brethren and sisters, let us pray earnestly that God will send forth labourers into His harvest, for the time is short.
