## BOOK ON THE SPIRIT OF PROPHECY

VOTED, That, in harmony with the suggestion of A.G. Daniells, we approve of the Pacific Press being asked to publish the book on the Spirit of prophecy.

## PRAYER FOR ELDER DANIELLS:

It was agreed to meet at 4:30 this afternoon (1:30 Pacific Time), for prayer in behalf of Elder Daniells, word having been received by wire that his condition is definitely worse, and it was

VOTED, To send the following telegram to Elder Glenn Calkins and Dr. Magan:

"Deeply regret Elder Daniells' condition. Please inform him General Conference brethren meeting for special prayer for him one thirty today Pacific Time. Book reading committee and Pacific Press as publishers both approved. Watson ready to go West if called."

## CABLE TO I.H.EVANS:

Word was received from South America that Elder I.H. Evans, who is just now finishing his itinerary in that division is not very well, and some of the brethren question the advisability of his making the trip from there to Africa, notwithstanding that he feels he would like to go on. It was

VOTED, To cable I.H.Evans at Rio de Janeiro, as follows:

"Committee seriously question your going to Africa, but leave decision with you."

## J.C.THOMPSON NOT TO RETURN VIA INDIA:

A letter was read from J.C.Thompson telling of changes made in his itinerary in the Far Eastern Division, whereby he will be closing his work in that division at Singapore in July. In view of this fact he asked counsel about returning home via Europe and stopping to visit India en route. After some discussion it was

VOTED, That in view of the fact that a visit by a General Conference representative to the Southern Asia Division cannot be advantageously arranged for at the present time, J.C.Thompson be advised to return home from Singapore without stopping in India en route.

## EVANGELISTIC COUNCIL IN THE WEST:

VOTED, That the date for the Evangelistic Council for the Pacific and North Pacific Unions and the western part of the Canadian Union, be set for December 16 to 23, 1935, the opening session to be at 10:00 A.M., December 16.

## H.L.GRAHAM--CREDENTIALS:

The Pacific Union Conference having agreed to grant credentials to ordained men who may be studying medicine at the College of Medical Evangelists, when such men have the recommendation of the General Conference Committee and the Medical College, it was

VOTED, That we recommend H.L.Graham, who served for some years as a missionary in China, to the Pacific Union for such credentials.

## A.W.CLARK--POTOMAC CONFERENCE:

VOTED, To pass on to the Atlantic Union and the Southern New England Conference the call from the Columbia Union for A.W.Clark to connect with the Potomac Conference as pastor of the colored church in Washington, D.C.

## DANIEL A. McADAMS--INDIA:

VOTED, To request the Southwestern Union and the Arkansas-Louisiana Conference to release Daniel A. McAdams, to connect with the Southern Asia Division as field missionary secretary in one of the union missions in India.

## SPRING MEETING--WORKERS INVITED:

VOTED, To extend to leading workers in the Review and Herald, Washington Sanitarium, Washington Missionary College, the Columbia Union and the Potomac Conference, an invitation to attend such sessions of the Spring Meeting of the General Conference Committee as they may desire and find possible.

## NORTHERN EUROPEAN DIVISION--

## THIRTEENTH SABBATH OFFERING:

Under date of January 21, 1935, there was presented to the Committee a plan of the Northern European Division whereby the Thirteenth Sabbath Offering for one quarter of each year in Northern Europe should go to the support of the

mission fields of that division. The Committee was under the impression at that time that this would affect the income of the General Conference from the Northern European Division. However, further explanation regarding the plan, contained in a letter recently received from L.H.Christian, makes it evident that the purpose is to more fully familiarize the believers in the Northern European Division with the needs of their own mission fields, in the hope of greatly increasing the offerings. Said arrangement, he assures us, will not affect the income of the General Conference from the Northern European Division detrimentally, but on the other hand they hope it will increase the funds both of the division and of the General Conference.

Inasmuch, therefore, as the proposed plan does not seriously interfere with the Thirteenth Sabbath Offering program, but may increase the mission offerings both to the Northern European Division and to the General Conference,

VOTED, That the action of this Committee of January 21, 1935, with regard to the Northern European Division Thirteenth Sabbath Offering, be rescinded. And, further,

VOTED, That we consent to the plan of the Northern European Division for the year 1935, in respect of their Thirteenth Sabbath Offering, with the understanding that the plan be not continued beyond 1935 without further consideration being given to it by the General Conference Committee at an Autumn Council, when Northern European Division representatives are present.

R.RUHLING--RENT:

VOTED, That R.Ruhling be authorized to report as expense the rent which it was necessary for him to pay in Germany on his unexpired lease after his transfer to America, amounting to approximately \$122.00.

LEAFLET ON STATE AID TO CHURCH SCHOOLS:

The committee on the revision of the leaflet on State Aid to Church Schools submitted the manuscript prepared. Because of the issue that is now on in the State of Ohio, the leaflet is adapted especially to Ohio.

VOTED, To approve the revised manuscript on State Aid to Church Schools, and to ask the Columbia Union to meet one half the expense of publication.

#### MEDICAL EXPENSE:

The committee appointed to consider a plan for handling large medical expense items submitted the following recommendation, which was adopted:

We recommend, That the plan of paying one half the medical expense of our workers, exclusive of one week's salary, shall apply up to \$200; that the General Conference meet two thirds of the additional amount above \$200 up to \$300, and three fourths of the additional amount beyond \$300.

#### W.E.HOWELL--MEDICAL EXPENSE:
