- 4. That investigation be made as to the possibility of purchasing and sending forward the equipment necessary to enable the Filwoha Hospital to operate on a satisfactory basis in competition with other medical institutions in Addis Ababa.

Word having been received that E.C. lood is on the list of repatriates to be returned from China on the "Gripsholm, "and that he will probably be disembarked at Montreal, it was

SPOKANE CHURCH:
