A Seminary Student-Pastor Plan was submitted, as proposed by the Theological Seminary Board. After some discussion, in which a number of changes were suggested, it was

VOTED, To invite Dr. Frank H. Mann, of the American Bible Society, to address us at the time of our coming Spring Meeting.

LOIS BOWEN -- SOUTHERN MISSIONARY COLLEGE:

VOTED, To pass on to the Pacific Union Conference and the Paradise Valley Sanitarium the call from the Southern Union for Miss Lois Bowen to connect with Southern Missionary College, in charge of their nursing service.

CHRISTINE FFLAUMER -- PACIFIC UNION:

VOTED, To pass on to the Facific Press Publishing Association the call from the Pacific Union Conference for Miss Christine Fflaumer to connect with the Union Bureau of Visual Education.

GRACE FIELDS -- APPOINTMENT:

VOTED, That Miss Grace Fields be authorized to meet appointments at the Southern Publishing House, March 18-22.

OVERSEAS RADIO PROGRAM PRODUCTIONS:

The committee that was appointed to make allocation of funds for overseas radio production purposes, submitted the following recommendations, which were adopted:

We recommend, 1. That \$50,000 of the funds appropriated at the 1948 Autumn Council for overseas radio work for 1949, be allocated as follows: \$25,000 to the Inter-American Division and \$25,000 to the South American Division, thus providing thirtyminute programs in each of said divisions.

2. That a fund of \$\iip\$5,000 be set up on the General Conference Treasury books from the overseas Voice of Prophecy fund to provide for broadcasting expense in the Arabic language.

GENERAL CONFERENCE STAFF HOUSING COMMITTEE:

VOTED, That the officers be asked to appoint a committee to give study to the policies under which the present General Conference Staff Housing Committee is operating.

MEXICO--\$3,500:

VOTED, To appropriate \$3,500 from the Emergency Fund to the Inter-American Division to assist in repairing damage caused by flood to a school and two church buildings at Navojoa, Mexico.

REPRESENTATIVES TO PUERTO RICO:

A letter was read from the president of the Inter-Ameriean Division, requesting that a representative from the Treasury Department and one of the vice-presidents meet with representatives of the Division, the Antillian Union and the Puerto Rico Mission, March 15-16, to give study to the building of a hospital and sanitarium in Fuerto Rico.

VOTED, That this request be referred to the officers with power to act, it being understood that our sending two men as requested does not commit the General Conference financially to the project.

DEATH OF MR. AND MRS. RYE ANDERSEN:

Word was received from the Northern European Division of the death by road accident of Mr. and Mrs. Rye Andersen, in Foland. Brother and Sister Andersen were some years ago missionaries in Uganda, sent out by the Northern European Division. Recently Brother Anderson has been assisting in our relief work in Europe, particularly in the distribution of relief supplies in Poland.

VOTED, That the Secretary be requested to express to the Northern European Division our sympathy in the loss of these workers, and that we ask the Division to convey our sympathy to the relatives of Brother and Sister Andersen.
