DIVISION OF WEST AFRICAN UNION FUNDS:

Following the assignment of certain territories of the West African Union to the Southern European Division at the time of the 1948 Autumn Council, a committee was appointed to make recommendation concerning a division of the assets related to these territories. This committee submitted a report, which was adopted as follows:

We recommend, 1. That the balance of the Overseas Furlough and Transportation Fund on December 31, 1948, be divided as follows: 18%, or \$738.00, to the French African Union; and the balance to be retained by the West African Union.

- 2. That all rents received from the French field during 1948, amounting to Col.Fr. 75,610.60, or \$499.02, be turned over to the French African Union.
- 3. Inasmuch as the French fields kept their 1948 Ingathering receipts, none of the union Revertible Funds belong to them.
- 4. That the Big Week, Union Home Repairs, and Donations Funds be retained by the West African Union.
- 5. That the West African Union make a grant of \$4,000 from its operating capital to the Southern European Division, to assist in providing operating capital for the French African Union.
- 6. That mission equipment which is located in the French fields concerned and which is carried on the books of the West African Union, remain in the French fields, appropriate accounting entries being made.
- 7. That the treasurer of the West African Union, having been asked to have all personal, mission, and institutional accounts with the transferred fields in balance as far as possible on December 31, 1948, be asked to pass on the balances of accounts with the French African Union at the rate of .0066 dollars to the Colonial Franc.
- 8. That Trust funds held by the West African Union and assigned to the French fields be transferred to the French African Union through the Southern European Division.
- 9. That the West African Union make a grant of \$800 to the French African Union from its Sustentation Fund.

- 10. That the West African Union make a grant of \$240 to the French African Union from its Spring in Tithe and Offerings Fund.
- 11. That the Evangelistic and Colporteur Funds remain with the West African Union.
- 12. That the total Class 1-A appropriation, amouting to \$210,500 (not including the Voice of Prophecy) provided in the budget for the West African Union be divided as follows:

West African Union French African Union \$186,700 23,800

13. That the Voice of Prophecy appropriation, amounting to \$5,000 be divided, \$4,000 to the West African Union, and \$1,000 to the French African Union.
