DISAPPROVAL OF TRANSIT FARES SUBSIDY FROM TAX FUNDS FOR PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS:

VOTED, That the following statement be sent to the District Committee of the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States:

Re: House of Representatives Bills HR 12332 and 12333 to reimburse the D.C. Transit Company of Washington, D.C., out of Federal tax funds, for transporting at reduced fares school children attending church-related schools

WHEREAS, The historic position of the Seventh-day Adventists, in harmony with the principle of separation of church and state as set forth in the First Amendment of the Federal Constitution, has been one of protest against the use of public tax funds in providing transportation for children attending parochial schools; and

WHEREAS, The proposed reimbursements to the D.C. Transit Company from tax funds constitute a transgression of this principle and could set an unfortunate precedent in the use of public tax funds for the transportation in public buses of children attending church-related schools;

We, the General Conference Committee of Seventh-day Adventists, as the official administrative body of our Church,

Representatives of the Congress of the United States that they disapprove House Bills HR 12332 and 12333 for the reasons above stated, and take appropriate measures to prevent favorable action by the Congress of the United States.

Further VOTED, That a similar statement be sent to the Senate District of Columbia Committee, referring to S. 4090 and S. 4091.
