Roth reports there were 14,000 baptisms in the Inter-American Division in 1961, and that their membership has undoubtedly reached 150,000 at the end of the year. In the South American Division they fully expect to report 12,500 baptisms for 1961. In Chile alone, almost 1,000 people were won in 1961. In the local mission of Bolivia, 1,423 were baptized; their goal this year is 2,000. The reports from Korea are interesting and encouraging. The indications seem to point to well over 100,000 baptisms in the world field during 1961.

We face the challenge of 25,000,000 people, and only about 800 church members after forty years of work. We have only one Thai pastor with any formal training in Bible or evangelism." Place that statement with that which Mrs. E. G. White wrote--the message is to go until it belts the world, and it gives us great inspiration. It is an encouragement to us to know that, and to ponder these statements.

W. E. Murray suggested that in the opening prayer we remember J. B. Cooks, who is soon to open a large evangelistic meeting in Cape Town, South Africa, where it is expected there will be an attendance of approximately 7,000 people.
