### M. L. ANDREASEN -- STATEMENT CONCERNING:

R. R. Figuhr reported on a visit which he and R. R. Bietz had with M. L. Andreasen, shortly before the death of Brother Andreasen on February 19, 1962, at the Glendale Sanitarium and Hospital. Elder Figuhr then presented the following statement which had been prepared before the death of Brother Andreasen, and which was adopted:

On Friday, February 16, 1962, R. R. Figuhr and R. R. Bietz visited M. L. Andreasen, in the Glendale Sanitarium and Hospital. The matter of suspended credentials and problems related thereto were frankly discussed. Elder Andreasen gave assurance that it is not his desire to engage in any activity which would harm the church which he loves so much and to which he has given so many years of his life. If his activities have created doubt and confusion he regrets this as much and more than any one else.

For two years he has not written to the churches, and he has consistently given instruction to the offshoots that his letters and pamphlets are not to be duplicated. Elder Andreasen has given assurance that he has no plans for the future to send material to the churches. He believes that further statements in regard to his convictions should be directed only to the Officers of the General Conference or other members of the General Conference.

March 1, 1962

In view of this understanding the former action suspending the credentials shall be revoked and Elder M. L. Andreasen shall be listed in the <u>Yearbook</u> along with other sustentees.

- 8. That the present policy be confirmed that no equipment be taken out of the office for use in the homes or elsewhere; any deviation from this policy shall be upon the authorization of the General Conference Officers.

1962 GENERAL CONFERENCE SESSION--RETIRED WORKERS TO ATTEND:

The following recommendations from the Committee on Attendance of Retired Workers at the 1962 General Conference session, as approved by the General Conference Officers, were presented and voted:

# Basis of Invitation

- 1. That as a general rule, retired workers of the elected staff of the General Conference and overseas divisions be invited to attend one session of the General Conference. In the case of Officers of the General Conference and the divisions and outstanding overseas missionaries with long service periods, we invite them to attend not more than two sessions of the General Conference, at the discretion of the General Conference Committee.
- 2. That only retired workers resident in North America be invited to attend the 1962 session at General Conference expense.

### Allowances

That the following allowances be made to the retired workers invited to the 1962 General Conference session:

- 1. Hotel and per diem to the retired worker, or worker and wife, on the session rates while attending the session.
- 2. Travel by rail: Train fare (clergy where eligible) and Pullman for the retired worker, or worker and wife, plus per diem at the session rates.
- 3. Travel by air: Air coach, including jet where used, plus per diem at session rates.
- 4. Travel by automobile: Same basis as for overseas missionaries traveling in North America by car; that is--
- <u>a.</u> 7  $\not$  per mile for the direct mileage over the authorized route for husband and wife.
  - b.  $3\frac{1}{2} \not\in$  per mile for single persons traveling alone.
- c. Room accommodation is included in the above mileage rates, and no extra allowance is made for motel or hotel, or tolls on roads and bridges.
- d. Per diem at the session rates calculated by direct route on the basis of one day for each 450 miles or major fraction thereof traveled. (Use Rand McNally mileage chart in computing distances.)
