MINUTES of the meeting held May 21, 1964, were approved.

NATIONAL MEDICAL CADET CORPS TRAINING CAMP--CANCELATION:

At the 1963 Autumn Council authorization was voted for a National Medical Cadet Corps Training Camp to be held in Grand Ledge, Michigan, June 9-23, 1964. To date the National Service Organization has received only forty-three applications for this Training Camp. It is felt this would be too small a number for the purposes for which it is set up. The North Pacific Union Conference are to hold a Medical Cadet Corps camp August 25-September 7, 1964, at Gladstone, Oregon, and there are to be 250 men in attendance. All of those who have made application for the training in Grand Ledge, Michigan, and desire to do so, can transfer to the camp in the North Pacific Union Conference. The Officers of the Grand Ledge Training Camp will be transferred to the North Pacific Union Conference Medical Cadet Corps camp. On recommendation of the National Service Organization, it was--

VOTED, To cancel the 1964 National Medical Cadet Corps Training Camp in Grand Ledge, Michigan.

ANDREW H. FARTHING--STATUS:

Andrew H. Farthing, after serving two years in the British Union Conference, came on his own responsibility and expense to the United States, and while attending Atlantic Union College was called in 1952 to connect with the work in India. As indicated in the minutes of the General Conference Committee for May 29, 1952, this appointment was made with the understanding that Brother Farthing desired to have North America considered as his home base and was willing to relinquish his two years of service in England in order to obtain such status.

For the sake of recording Brother Farthing's status, his service record, and the responsibility for sustentation, in an official action, it is--

VOTED, That the denominational service record of Andrew H. Farthing be reckoned as having begun when he was appointed April 7, 1952, to service in India on the basis of an overseas worker from the North American Division, and that the North American Division be responsible for his sustentation when he becomes eligible.

A. P. SALOM--WALLA WALLA COLLEGE:

VOTED, To pass on to the Australasian Division a call from the North Pacific Union Conference for A. P. Salom, of Avondale College, to serve as Assistant Professor of Religion at Walla Walla College.

WILLIAM H. TAYLOR, M. D. -- PERMANENT RETURN:

VOTED, To authorize the permanent return of William H. Taylor, M.D., at present Medical Director of the Hospital at Ankole, in Southern Uganda, he having requested a permanent return for personal reasons, effective in August, 1965; and in harmony with the recommendation of the Trans-African Division. Dr. Taylor has spent three terms in East Africa.

WILLIAM H. TAYLOR, M. D. -- LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY:

VOTED, To pass on to William H. Taylor, M.D., permanently returning in August, 1965, from Uganda, East Africa, a call to connect with the Loma Linda University as Instructor in the Department of Anatomy, School of Medicine.

JANE OLSON--PERMANENT RETURN:

VOTED, To authorize the permanent return of Jane Olson, daughter of Elder and Mrs. Boyd E. Olson, of Singapore, for educational reasons; in harmony with the recommendation of the Far Eastern Division.

JOHN B. ASHTON--RELEASED:

VOTED, That John B. Ashton be released from appointment as Music Teacher for the Rio Grande do Sul Academy, Taquara, Brazil, he having declined to accept the call, for various personal reasons.

DAVID M. REEVES, M.D. -- RELEASED:

VOTED, That since David M. Reeves, M.D., finds it impossible to carry out his agreement he be released from deferred appointment to overseas service.

ROGER L. ENGELBERT, M.D. -- RELEASED:

VOTED, That Roger L. Engelbert, M.D., be released from the call to service in the Ngoma Hospital, he having been under appointment for several years. HERMAN C. CURTIS, JR.--RELEASED:

VOTED, That Herman C. Curtis, Jr., be released from the call to the Ile-Ife Hospital, Nigeria, as a Pharmacist, since because of personal obligations he is not able to respond.

ZAKI NAROUZ ABDEL-MALEK--MIDDLE EAST COLLEGE:

VOTED, That Zaki Narouz Abdel-Malek, of Washington, D.C., be invited to connect with the Middle East Division, to head the Linguistic Department in the Middle East College; on the basis of a national returning to his homeland (effective in 1965).

CENTRAL AFRICAN UNION--FRENCH-SPEAKING WORKER:

VOTED, To pass on to the Southern European Division the call from the Trans-African Division for a French-speaking worker to serve as Publishing Secretary of the Central African Union.

VOTED, That the Central Union Conference and Boulder Memorial Hospital be requested to release Cleo Vernon Johnson, and that he be invited to connect with the Middle East Division as Administrator of the Benghazi Adventist Hospital.

ERNEST A. MARINKOVIC -- MONTEMORELOS, MEXICO:

VOTED, That the Southwestern Union and Texas Conferences be requested to release Ernest A. Marinkovic, of Weslaco, Texas, and that he be invited to connect with the Inter-American Division as Bible and Evangelism Teacher at the Montemorelos Vocational and Professional College, in Mexico.

W. C. TETZ, M. D. -- TRINIDAD:

VOTED, That W. C. Tetz, M.D., of Lacombe, Alberta, be invited to serve as a relief Doctor for Trinidad from July 1 to August 15, 1964, in place of H. W. Gimbel, M.D., who is not able to go forward.

VOTED, That the Pacific Union and Southern California Conferences be requested to release Ray A. Forbes, of the White Memorial Hospital, and that he be invited to connect with the Far Eastern Division as Manager of the Taiwan Sanitarium and Hospital.
