DEVOTIONAL PERIOD:

The Chairman, Neal C. Wilson, read a quotation from the book Education, page 142, in which God gives in His Word a picture of a prosperous man. The quotation included references as follows: Job 29: 4-16, R.V.; 31: 32; 29: 21-25.

Elder Wilson said we have different ways of evaluating men; we have different ways of evaluating ourselves. We may not consider ourselves to be prosperous, yet one can be prosperous in different ways--financially, spiritually, in acquisition of knowledge, and so on. This quotation refers to one who was a success in the truest sense. Success is sometimes defined as having reached the pinnacle, having had the praise of men, and having had the approbation of those with whom one labors. In this regard, some of us in this room would be considered as successful. Certain of our projects reach maturity and gain acceptance. In closing, Elder Wilson read also Proverbs 10: 22, and expressed the desire that God will help us to be men and women whom heaven and earth will delight to honor. May our work this morning be done in recognition of the sacred and wonderful opportunity that is ours of meeting these qualifications.

INGATHERING--FURTHER REPORT:

J. E. Edwards said that after the count-down, the Ingathering blast-off came last week. Now the crusade is in the stratosphere. Six unions are ahead of last year at the same time, and gains total \$85,314.36. Thirty-three conferences have surpassed last year's record of this date. Another \$100,000 conference --Michigan (\$115,194.18)--has been added to the five honored last week. The avalanche of Bible Correspondence Course requests from Ingathering magazines mount. Already 5,791, which represents one-third of the total received last year, have come in. Many fields have as their target a 10 per-cent gain over last year and plan to ring the victory bell by Christmas.

In the Central Union a 102-year-old regional sister, called Mother Lucas, from Wichita, Kansas, is "still doing Ingathering service."

We thank God for His blessing, the dedicated leadership of pastors, the loyal service of members, and the enthusiastic participation of youth in raising \$2,326,499.36--\$6.07 per capita. This is the largest first week report ever in North American history. North American churches are alert in watching for souls while Ingathering dollars.

DEVOTIONAL PERIOD:

The Chairman, Neal C. Wilson, said that Haggai was a prophet that seemed to have gained more acceptance so far as his messages were concerned, and better results in stimulating the people to trust in God than most of the other prophets. Many of the other prophets were rudely pushed aside. His four messages were given to the people, and they produced a reformation and activity that was almost unbelievable.

Elder Wilson read Haggai 1: 1-14. He said that verse 14 carries great significance. After the Lord invited the people to consider their ways, He said there are some causes why you have not seen an abundance in the past; why you have suffered; why you have been delayed and sent back. Part of it is your own making; part of it I brought upon you. I allowed it to come that you might realize your source of strength. In the 14th verse it says, "The Lord stirred up the spirit of Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and the spirit of Joshua, the son of Josedech, the high priest, and the spirit of all the remnant of the people; and they came and did work in the house of the Lord of hosts, their God."

You will notice there were three segments, three separate classes of individuals the Lord spoke about. But it was not until the Spirit of the Lord stirred up each one of those segments that they were ready to go ahead and do the work. The first segment was the leadership, the workers, those in authority, the administration. We constitute a group such as that in God's work today. Then there were the priests, those who dealt with the people day by day over spiritual problems, leading them into relationship with the Lord. Then there was the third group, themselves the remnant. The Lord stirred up the spirit of each of those groups. When that was done, "they came and did work in the house of the Lord of hosts, their God." This morning, fellow workers, I suggest to you this is our aim. We ought to be tied together by the Lord stirring up the spirit of each one of us. When this kind of leadership is given, it says the Lord is going to do something great through this people. May the Lord help us to keep these thoughts in our hearts, not only as we do our work today, but each day as we mingle with our people.

EVANGELISTIC CRUSADE IN TRINIDAD--EFFORT:

The Chairman welcomed E. E. Cleveland, who has recently returned from Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, where he was engaged in an evangelistic crusade. On invitation of the Chairman, Elder Cleveland gave a number of interesting facts concerning the meetings held. He spoke of the blessings of God upon the spade of evangelism that was expounded by our President here just prior to his leaving.

The union and local conference headquarters are located in Port-of-Spain. He told of the participation of the union and local staff in various duties connected with the crusade, with appreciation for their support. He felt Heaven blessed this total attack as one particular aspect of the evangelistic outreach of the church. The Lord was happy to see the departmental brethren getting together and showing the world we all mean business in this one thing and that is--winning souls.

Before Elder Cleveland left Trinidad, there were 812 new baptisms. On the last night, there were 7,000 people on the grounds; and 327 additional people signed their names as desiring to become Seventh-day Adventists and to study further the Bible truths. Arrangements were being made for the former members of the church to move into another building, so that the new members can occupy the main sanctuary. A tent will be placed on the grounds to accommodate the overflow.

Elder Wilson said a report like this just given should be the beginning of like reports from hundreds of places, even here in the United States.

INGATHERING--REPORT BY C. E. GUENTHER:

C. E. Guenther, Associate Secretary in the Lay Activities Department, presented a report of Ingathering for the week ending December 3--\$744,400, or almost three-fourths of one million dollars. The total reported to date is over three million dollars. Elder Guenther called this "Miracle Money" and a fulfillment of Christian Service, p. 167, which indicates that God will move upon the hearts of worldly men to give of their abundance for the support of His work.

Current examples were cited of individuals who were waiting for the annual Ingathering caller in order to write checks for liberal amounts. A poem was read which was written by a woman who refused to give at the door, but who was impressed to send a gift after reading the Ingathering paper.

7,038 Bible Correspondence School enrollments were received on Ingathering coupons from October 1 to December 7.

Ingathering is an evangelistic and spiritual adventure, and Elder Guenther stated its most telling effect is the spiritual charge it gives both to solicitor and to the donor.

He predicted the next two consecutive weeks will each yield over \$1 million, and mentioned the possibility of three consecutive \$1 million weeks in December, which would mean \$6 million by December 25.

The Department of Public Affairs and Religious Liberty has recommended the advisability of securing from a responsible and labor law knowledgeable legal firm a memorandum which might serve as a guide to the Department in cases where it may become necessary to contest with labor unions the work rights of individuals who refuse to join unions and pay union dues because of conscientious (religious) scruples.

VOTED, That the Department of Public Affairs and Religious Liberty be authorized in counsel with Boardman Noland to pursue the possibility of securing a legal memorandum on labor relations, which will be a helpful guide in protecting the work rights of those who because of conscientious convictions desire to be exempt from joining unions or paying union dues, and to authorize the expense involved in securing such a memorandum.

AMERICAN MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION--

ATTENDANCE GENERAL CONFERENCE REPRESENTATIVE:

VOTED, That W. Melvin Adams be authorized to attend the American Management Association meeting on legal problems related to labor unions to be held in Chicago, Illinois, January 9-11, 1967; and to authorize the payment of the stipulated fee.

DEVOTIONAL PERIOD:

Neal C. Wilson, Chairman, read from J. B. Phillips' translation Gal. 6: 1-10. These verses give instruction to deal gently with a brother who has erred, and to bear one another's burdens.

Elder Wilson spoke of the Scripture passage which says we are to help one another to carry the heavy burdens, and in this way fulfill the law of Christ. Many people are carrying loads today. Just the helpfulness we may express, showing consideration, being willing to listen for a few minutes even though we may not complete the day's schedule of work--some of these things ought to have priority. Give a little word of encouragement; put your arm around some one and help him carry the load. Fellow workers, I know you are carrying heavy loads. Many others are carrying heavy loads. You are leaders; one of our greatest privileges and responsibilities is to help others carry these heavy loads. The whole purpose in our being here is to help others, and the Lord sees we can do it in this way.

WEEK OF SACRIFICE OFFERING:

A report was given by Theodore Carcich concerning the Week of Sacrifice Offering. He mentioned that we did not have too much time to plan for this, or even to promote it. The results indicate the faithfulness of our pastors and the very fine response of our lay people. In three churches in the Illinois Conference, Brookfield, Broadview, and Hinsdale, their combined offerings were more on one Sabbath than 74 churches the previous year.

In the Takoma Park SDA Church they raised \$13,000, which is the amount raised in the last seven years. In the Sligo SDA Church they raised \$11,126. The report has come that the Loma Linda University doubled its offering in the

three churches. There are tremendous resources in the people of God if we approach them right.

MAKING INGATHERING HISTORY:

A. A. Esteb, Associate Secretary in the Lay Activities Department, said that the fourth official week of our Ingathering Crusade for 1966-1967 records history-making events. First, this fourth week is the largest week ever recorded in our denomination's dynamic story of Ingathering achievements. The total for the week is \$1,050,833.52. Second, this fourth week's total to date is the highest ever: \$4,121,733.75. We are making history.

Third, the Willowdale Church in Canada passed its \$10,000.00 goal in five nights. The first night they received \$3,212.00. This last Saturday night they received \$3,268.00, which is a record night for any church in Canada. 215 participated. There were 48 cars.

Fourth, the Aleda, Illinois, church building burned last week. The next night the church went over the top on their Ingathering goal. The Ingathering spirit this year is so high that nothing--even fire and disaster--can stop it!

Fifth, a pastor in Idaho writes: "Last year we met a lovely family while Ingathering. Later we gave them Bible studies. (Notice the follow-up.) They were baptized the 6th of November. They are young people with two pre-school children." Yes, we are making history. Ingathering is gathering in souls as well as dollars for the world work of the church!

Sixth, Pastor William Loveless of the Sligo SDA Church reports that Columbia Union College in five nights' soliciting and caroling by the students and faculty members brought in over \$17,000.00. There was 90 per cent participation of the faculty. WE ARE MAKING HISTORY.

DEVOTIONAL PERIOD:

The Chairman, Theodore Carcich, said his mind turns again to the action of the Autumn Council regarding revival and the evangelistic thrust. He referred to the words given in Psalm 85: 6, "Wilt thou not revive us?" Habakkuk himself prayed, "O Lord, revive thy work in the midst of the years." A revival is not something that can be humanly organized. It is not the work of machinery. Revival comes from God. Revival is the work of a supernatural agency. The word revival in the Old Testament means to recover, to restore, to return. In the New Testament the meaning of the word is to stir up, to rekindle something that was already burning.

As we meet here today to consider the work of God, there is a certain amount of possibly machinery and intelligence to offer; and above that there is a great need of the reviving Spirit of God. And what a background the world presents for this need of revival. We are in the midst of a world revolution, politically, socially, sexually, economically. The world is in a state of turmoil and revolution. Some one has said that if we are to go on to the year 2000 there will be seven billion people on this planet. Already this year we face a shortage in grain in this country. What is going to happen by the year 2000? It is terrifying politically, socially, and racially.

It is against this background that God calls for a revival in our individual hearts and in the church. The harvest is ready; it is ripe. I do not suppose the human heart has ever been better prepared for the preaching of the third angel's message. The stage is set for revival, a forward evangelistic thrust, so far as world conditions are concerned. In the morning worship period the report was given that up to the end of November, our pastors, our laity, and our people just in North America alone gave for the Week of Sacrifice Offering \$546,000.00. How ready the people are! We cannot bear the responsibility for

the past generation nor for the future generation, but brethren, we are here today, and you and I will have to answer at the bar of judgment for the present. Let there be a revival, let there be a sense of urgency. This is the hour. May the Lord help us today as we work and pray together.

INGATHERING CRUSADE REPORT:

J. E. Edwards reported that the week ending December 17 was the greatest in denominational history, shattering all former Ingathering records and establishing an all-time record for the fourth official week. During that week the churches of North America, under the direction of our dedicated pastors, raised \$1,122,588.00.

Various experiences from the field were used to illustrate what made this a phenomenal week. These experiences included the loyal leadership of pastors, older members in their 80's and 90's who have given untiring service in house-to-house solicitation; crippled youth who have hobbled from house to house raising Silver Vanguard goals; children, even of primary age, who are being taught to Ingather, and new converts who have gained glorious victories for God in Ingathering service. These pastors, older members, children, youth, and new converts have made this the greatest week in Adventist history.

Forty-five conferences are ahead of last year at this time. Two new conferences are added to the honor role of Silver Vanguard fields--Newfoundland and Oklahoma. These five conferences exceeded last year's final Ingathering total--Northeastern, Oklahoma, Ontario-Quebec, Maritime, and South Central. Two unions, the Atlantic and the Southern, have all their conferences in the gain column. Our members are inviting their Ingathering contacts to explore the Bible for they are alert for souls. Think of processing a thousand Ingathering Bible Correspondence School post cards in a day! Yes, the applications are coming in by the thousands. Truly Ingathering is soul-winning as well as fund-raising.

The Pacific Union had a great \$250,000 week; Columbia, \$180,000; Lake and North Pacific, \$150,000; and Southwestern, Atlantic, and Central, \$100,000.

It was interesting to learn of a Sabbath-keeping family in Kansas who knew nothing about our church but when they were contacted last week were delighted and will be attending a Seventh-day Adventist church for the first time this Sabbath. Permanent impressions for God's cause will be made by thorough follow-up, subscribing to the missionary magazine, giving the Missionary Book-of-the-Year, and making arrangements for Bible studies.

The total for the fourth official week is \$5½ million, a gain of \$154,000 over the same time last year. God's church is now on its last lap of the Ingathering crusade and will give the final thrust to this important missionary evangelistic program, going far beyond any previous achievements in order that we might pioneer in thirty-six unentered lands!

DEVOTIONAL PERIOD:

John 17: 17-19 was read by Theodore Carcich, Chairman. He spoke of John 17 as containing the priestly, mediatorial prayer of our Lord. We have been counseled that this prayer should be studied by those who have charge of God's work, in order to obtain direction and guidance for the work of God. Speaking of the expression "sanctified through the truth," he said this is not mythological language any more than the language of science, history, and politics is mythological language. This is language that can be understood by both the learned and the unlearned. Christ here directs us to the means of consecration and sanctification, "Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth." It does not mean God is limited to these means, but in the council of peace before the world was, it was agreed upon and settled that this was to be the means of consecration and sanctification of God's people.

The Scripture states, "Thy word is truth." God's word is the seed of new life. It is also the food for new life. He counsels us to "desire the sincere milk of the word that we may grow thereby" and "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth from the mouth of God." Here we have the means of consecration and sanctification. As He was, so can we be. Christ said, "For their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth." It is most impressive that the Lord of glory would submit himself to the same means of sanctification that He expects of His people. Today the call is to consecrate ourselves to the judgment of Christ--the High Priest and Judge. The call is for us as individuals and the church to take our standard of conduct from Christ, not from an idea or from a philosophy, but from a Person whom we have seen, felt, and heard. May the Lord help us to review this chapter from time to time, and to settle it in our own minds that there is a God in heaven, that there is a Son who came; and that to know the Father and the Son whom He sent is life eternal.

W. R. Beach, just returned from a visit to the Inter-American Division, and having attended the Division Council in Miami, Florida, brought greetings from the brethren of that division. He said they had a very fine Council. He appreciated the privilege of coming in contact with our leaders and the work in that field. Strong and courageous leadership is being given. An all-out effort is being made in the Central American Union Mission to upgrade their education. Several interesting and heart-warming incidents that occurred during his stay in the division were related. As he concluded he mentioned especially the fact that the college and hospital in Jamaica are going ahead nicely.

INGATHERING REPORT:

V. W. Schoen said that Ingathering time is an exciting time of many interesting experiences and involvements for God. The Lay Activities Department is most happy to bring to this Committee another short report of what we have done. Personal involvements this year indicate in many instances the guidance of God. In the Pittsburg Shadyside Church, in the Pennsylvania Conference, a sister has been contacting a business man for contributions by mail for a number of years. He has always responded with a check for \$40 or \$50. This year she wrote again and he sent her a check for \$500. Surely God is working with us to impress hearts to share so generously with His work.

In Nebraska Dr. Charles Prowant was making door-to-door calls one evening. As he rang the bell on a very lovely home the man who responded at the window was very disinterested. The next day what a surprise when the same man came to Doctor Prowant's office and gave a \$5.00 check.

In Oshawa, Canada, one of our solicitors called at a home where a man was asleep. When he came to the door he was so glad that somebody had awakened him because he was anxious to see his favorite program on television. He was glad to give a \$5.00 contribution for having been awakened.

Last week's report of our crusade was the best fifth reporting week ever. We reached a new time high of \$5,869,776.32. This gives us a \$121,265.46 lead over the last year's report.

Two unions, Atlantic and Northern, passed already their last year's total achievements, establishing new all-time records for their fields.

Twenty-three of the North American conferences exceeded their last year's finals and ten of these conferences achieved their Silver Vanguard goals. Three of our great unions, Columbia, Southern, and Pacific, are heading for the one-million mark.

The highest conference per capita so far is the Newfoundland Conference with \$27.28. The Southwestern Union is leading with the highest union per capita of \$22.11, and is heading for the Silver Vanguard union achievement.

In the Atlantic Union there were by Christmas time 181 victory churches which is an outstanding achievement. We are indeed grateful to God, to our ministry, and to the dedicated laymen for the outstanding work they have done this year.

PUBLISHING DEPARTMENT REPORT:

W. A. Higgins reported that the literature evangelists around the world continue to make encouraging gains in deliveries. We are also receiving outstanding reports of soul-winning work being done. From the Far Eastern Division we received a report that during the first ten months of 1966, 1,221 persons were baptized from literature evangelist contacts. This is almost double the record for last year.

One lady literature evangelist from Indonesia reports having brought 53 persons into the faith in 1966. All of these were Muslims, and seven of these have become literature evangelists.

From the Pacific Union comes a report from one literature evangelist who in twelve months had 60 persons baptized as a result of his contacts.

"3. To thank the General Conference Committee for sending the President and Treasurer of the General Conference to sit with us during our Winter Council. We have appreciated their wise counsel which has helped solve many difficult problems, and we have been blessed by their devotional messages.

"4. To express our thanks also to Elders N. R. Dower and R. A. Anderson for their inspirational presence, messages, and counsel."

VOTED, That an appropriate message be sent in return to the Northern European Division for this expression of gratitude.
