<u>R</u>. <u>H</u>. <u>Pierson</u>, President, baving just returned from San Francisco and Los Angeles, California, and having attended the Harris Pine Mills Board and Constituency Meeting for the Pacific Press Publishing Association, reported.

He said that according to some of the practices of the trade Harris Pine Mills cannot operate. However, they sold over \$23,000,000 worth of wood products last year, from their plant at Pendleton, Oregon, and their nineteen branches throughout the country. At their plant they have been told "You cannot close down on Sabbath; you have to keep things going." But every Friday afternoon the fire is pulled from the boiler, and the rest of the factory keeps the Sabbath. It is the good Lord that comes along and helps us out.

Many years ago, C. H. Harris tried out a different size of furniture, and it proved a success. Elder Nagele told us of some of the advantages of having a different size than others use. It is not supposed to work. But you may go into their showroom in San Francisco, and it is beautiful. If you come near where they have their showrooms it is well to see them, it is a real thing of beauty. It is like the bumblebee that it is said cannot fly, it just goes ahead and flies anyway. 2,037 young people in our institutions have been helped, on an average of \$700 each year. It is a real contribution to the Church.

### DEVOTIONAL SERVICE:

W. Duncan Eva, President of the Northern European Division, offered prayer.

Speaking on the topic of "Commission or Omission," <u>R. H. Pierson</u>, Chairman, dealt with the active Christian witness as compared with the social gospel approach. God's plan for communicating this changeless gospel is still the same. When the Saviour sent His disciples out, He said "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." One says "I'll fulfill this great commission by going and preaching the doctrine of Christ." Another says "I'll fulfill this great commission by going and doing the works of Christ." Both are right--Sinai, Calvary, Galilee, all have their place in the Jesus way.

He quoted from the devotional book <u>Think on These Things</u>, by N. F. Pease, a statement that it is not good to live in a world like this and be unconcerned. No follower of Christ can be indifferent to the sufferings of others. Abraham Lincoln is quoted as saying, "I'm sorry for the men who can't feel the whip when it is laid on the other man's back." Jesus wept at the opening of a tomb, and when He looked upon a doomed city. He could not be indifferent to human sorrow and tragedy. We must witness both by our works and with our lips. Do and <u>say</u>. In the controversy over social action and doctrinal witnessing, Jesus would say today what He said 2,000 years ago "These ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone." Matt. 23: 23. We are to <u>do the works</u>; we are to <u>speak the words</u>! We need both social action and doctrinal witnessing. To omit either is to change God's changeless plan for communicating the changeless message of a changeless Christ. It changes the great commission to the great omission.

#### **VISITORS INTRODUCED:**

Theodore Carcich, Vice-President, on invitation of the Chairman, introduced visitors present. The Northern European Division and British Union Conference are negotiating regarding a possible merger of the Review and Herald Publishing Association and the Stanborough Press, Ltd. The proposal will be presented in a board meeting this afternoon. General Conference representatives will be there to give guidance. This would mean a great forward step to our publishing work in Northern Europe and particularly in the British Union.

He introduced W. Duncan Eva, President of the Northern European Division; B. E. Seton, British Union Conference President, K. A. Elias, General Manager of the Stanborough Press, Ltd.; and Colin Wilson, of Scotland. They will be in Takoma Park over the week end.

#### **REPORTS:**

<u>A. C. McKee</u>, Director of Deferred Giving, expressed pleasure in bringing greetings to the members of the General Conference Committee from our workers and believers in the Australasian Division. He spoke with appreciation of the very keen, progressive and dedicated group of workers from the division office down through the ranks and into the local conferences. The Division Committee have called W. E. Rudge as Division Director of Deferred Giving. He is a very fine and capable man with many years' experience in departmental responsibilities and fourteen years as conference administrator. He will bring to this department a great deal of inspiration and spiritual guidance that will be very fruitful in days to come.

Elder McKee in company with W. E. Rudge had the privilege not only of meeting with the Division Committee, but of meeting with the Seventh-day Adventist solicitors in New South Wales, also the Division solicitors in Sydney and the solicitors in New Zealand in giving considerable study to the laws of New Zealand and the Commonwealth and how they relate to the various aspects of deferred giving. This enlarged concept of Christian stewardship is greatly appreciated by our leaders and constituency, and will find a large response on the part of our people in Australia. They had opportunity of meeting with our people in four of the camp meetings and three special workers' meetings in Australia and New Zealand, and found our people have warm and receptive hearts. Wherever they presented the deferred giving program they had a tremendous response on the part of the people. Elder McKee closed with a story of a contact with a fine couple who came into knowledge of the truth as a result of G. E. Vandeman's meetings three years ago. They gave testimony to their happiness in keeping the Sabbath, and the fact that as a result of their tithe paying the Lord had blessed them greatly in their business. They feel they have gained a new concept of Christian stewardship and have dedicated their entire estate to the cause of God through the preparation of a Christian will.

Arthur L. White, Secretary of Ellen G. White Estate, stated he had just received a letter from D. A. Delafield, the Assistant Secretary, who is in Australasia.for three months. He reports that he has just launched Testimony Countdown in the Wahroonga Church. The house was packed the first night with more than a thousand present and it was packed every night for the six nights he reports on. Elder Delafield writes in his very fine letter--"This is the Lord's doing; it is marvellous in our eyes." Australia has ordered fifteen hundred sets of Testimonies for the Church and 350 of the Pastor's Kits. They plan to move

into a nation-wide Testimony Countdown program beginning in May. Australia has given the same kind of a response that we found with our pilot program in Takoma Park and is now being experienced across North America as many of our churches have moved into this program.

<u>R. H. Pierson</u>, President, reported that the baptisms for 1969 in the South India Union totaled 5,642. This is practically two times the number they had the year before. Next year's goal is 11,000 in this one union, in the Gibraltar of heathenism.

<u>R. R. Hegstad</u>, Public Affairs and Religious Liberty Department Associate Secretary, reported that the meetings in Kingston, Jamaica, held by R. K. Cemer, began February 11 with some 3,000 people crowding the tent. On the first Sunday afternoon and night, two sessions accommodated 6,000. The second Sunday crowd swelled to more than 7,000. The afternoon meeting alone produced 300 decisions for the Sabbath. Elder Hegstad spent the first two weeks with Elder Cemer, giving illustrated lectures on religious liberty in various countries.

W. Duncan Eva, President of the Northern European Division, told of a recent visit with J. F. Coltheart. He gave a wonderfully encouraging report of the work in Rotterdam. The black-and-white pictures Pastor Coltheart had shared showed some full halls. The large hall in Rotterdam was full at each session he held. Not only are we cheered by the numbers who attended--and there were thousands of precious souls--and the number who will be influenced to take their stand for the truth, but it is the new attitude toward evangelism on the part of the workers that cheers us most. Brother Coltheart says he has not had a finer, more co-operative group of workers than in Holland. The results in Finland were extraordinary. It was the same in Sweden. The brethren in Northern Europe are working with new faith and courage. We have more requests for Pastor Coltheart's services than we can fill.
