There have been months of preparation, reports have been written, display booths have been set up, sermons have been prepared and hotel reservations have been made. There is one thing that overshadows all this preparation, and that is to share in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Elder Bietz read two paragraphs from <u>Gospel Workers</u>, page 289, concerning the power and influence of the Holy Spirit. One outstanding sentence reads as follows: "Those who are under the influence of the Spirit of God will not be fanatical, but calm and steadfast, free from extravagance in thought, word, or deed." MINUTES of the meeting held May 28, 1970, were approved.

STUDENT MISSIONARY PROGRAM---ORIENTATION COURSE:

A large number of our young people have gone out to serve in mission fields in various stations, as teachers and in evangelistic outreach. The number is increasing. It is desirable that some effort be made to prepare these young

people for these experiences by a student missionary orientation program. On recommendation of the Home and Overseas Officers, it was--

VOTED, That the following Committee be appointed to prepare a Student Missionary Orientation Course in the Summer of 1970, as follows: D. S. Johnson, Chairman; D. H. Baasch, Secretary; Walton J. Brown, J. H. Hancock, W. L. Pascoe, G. Oosterwal, of Andrews University; and Elton H. Wallace, of Pacific Union College; and that the Committee be called at a convenient time to prepare this course.

G. ROSSI-SEMINAR AT ANDREWS UNIVERSITY:

G. Rossi is Public Relations, Radio-TV and Religious Liberty Secretary of the Italian Union Mission. On request of the General Conference Public Affairs and Religious Liberty Department it was-

VOTED, To pass on to the Southern European Division a request that arrangements be made for G. Rossi to go to Andrews University following the General Conference session, to attend a Religious Liberty Seminar on Calendar Reform in the Vatican.

TRANSFER OF LOMA LINDA FOODS:

On October 24, 1968, an action was taken by the General Conference Committee approving the transfer of Loma Linda Foods from the Pacific Union Conference to the General Conference. That said transfer shall be effective as of July 1, 1970. It was further--

VOTED, To authorize R. R. Bietz, Chairman; E. M. Howse, Vice-Chairman, and C. P. Miles, Secretary of the General Board of Management, to participate in signing the necessary documents to effect the transfer.

VOTED, To pass on to Oakwood College a call from Atlantic Union College for Gaines Partridge, to serve as Professor of Education.

DEVOTIONAL SERVICE:

Opening prayer by R. H. Henning, of Tanzania, East Africa.

<u>R. H. Pierson</u>, Chairman, read Matt. 17: 8, 9, as a text of Scripture taken from the experience of Jesus and the disciples after the tremendous experience which had occurred on the Mount of Transfiguration. It says, "And when they had lifted up their eyes, they saw no man, save Jesus only. And as they came down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, saying, Tell the vision to no man, until the Son of man be risen again from the dead." Elder Pierson called attention to the following points:

(1) They saw no man save Jesus only. In our presession meetings we were given a new vision of our crucified, risen, and soon-coming Lord. These fine meetings helped to set the tone and create the atmosphere for a good General Conference session. (2) They came down from the mount. Yesterday was a high day. We were aware of the sweet presence of the Lord as we met all day. Now today we come down from the mount. But it must not be to a lower spiritual plain. Every day we must be conscious of the presence of the Spirit of God. We are going back into the field and work, we will be coming into grips with the problems and the challenge of the times. But we must keep the sense of His presence tho'we have come down from the mount. I would change the words of the Master, and say, Tell the vision to <u>every man</u>. This is our challenge as we go back to our people.

Elder Pierson said probably mistakes have been made. He suggested that the delegates write down things they feel would be helpful for the next session in 1975. In the pressure of the program during the lastten days, we want to be sure this morning that everything is all right. We have been under pressure. Sometimes we had to move things along rather rapidly. We will try to do better. If quick decisions were made on the spur of the moment instead of with wider counsel, we were pressed and there were many suggestions. We had to move ahead on the spot. If anybody was wounded or offended, please forgive me, and in the usual program I will try to work things out more in counsel in future under normal conditions.

I would have liked, last night, to have made another appeal for racial unity and progress, and spelt out some of the problems we face; and certainly I would like to have said there were no simple answers to those problems. There will be new ones during the next few years. Elder Pierson suggested the field leaders select the problems in their fields and set up machinery that will seek solutions in these areas.

I would like to have made an appeal to cur youth, to connect them with us and to give them a part in our program.

I would like to have spoken concerning officer and departmental leadership co-operation and relationships, and our hopes during the next five years. We have taken a number of steps that have been helpful. We value the leadership of our dedicated departmental leaders, not only in the General Conference but throughout the world. I am talking to every leader in this group--officer or departmental. We must get our aims and objectives of this church before us. The servant of the Lord has a great deal to say about these things. So far as I am concerned, this is the

blueprint. If there was ever a time we needed it and to stay close to it, it is now. Elder Pierson invited the members to write to him, or better yet to Arthur White, for the material that has been assembled which deals with the aims, goals, and objectives of our publishing and medical institutions, to study it very carefully, and to keep it before the workers.

Another thing we need to keep in mind: To too many of us the church is coming to be just another church. Try to keep before the people of God around the world the fact that Seventh-day Adventists are not just another church, that it is the movement of God with the message of God in this hour.

As he closed, Elder Pierson invited the members to send him a list of anything that we can do better in the next General Conference session. He said, We are thinking of having the next General Conference session outside of North America. There are two or three places we are thinking about for an Autumn Council. At present we are looking forward to Mexico City or Europe for our 1972 Biennial Council. The General Conference may be held perhaps in Europe or some other place. We are thinking rather seriously about both of these possibilities.

And "they saw no man, save Jesus only," when they came down from the mount. May God bless us as we move into the next quintennium.
