# REPORTS:

C. B. Hirsch, Department of Education Secretary, and having just returned from the Loma Linda University Board meeting, reported:

Three days ago the U.S. Senate voted over four hundred million dollars to be made available to medical schools for the setting up of family practice departments. On the same day the Loma Linda University Board had taken an action approving a Department of Family Practice.

An action was also taken authorizing the University Medical School to set up a pilot program. This will be new to the University, but is in practice at Johns Hopkins, Boston, and a few other Universities. This program will make it possible for a student to finish a medical course in six or seven years, rather than eight or nine years. We have about 4,000 graduates out of high school. This would involve probably 150 on the outside. It will cut down the costs for a student preparing for medical education, and will help financially, parents and the denomination.

Temperance continues to open doors for the message, said General Conference Temperance Secretary, Ernest H. J. Steed, in presenting a report on his recent visit to Europe.

There is a new, growing awareness that the Adventist church has a rôle to fill in meeting the increasing problems of intemperance.

In Berlin he saw a large Five-Day Plan conducted in the Adventist church with over 300 present.

In France, 20 top leaders representing government, professionals, and temperance men, met with him to consider the educational emphasis of Institutes and Seminars of Scientific Studies for the Prevention of Alcoholism.

In Scandinavia, a strong temperance work is progressing, and Adventists are being challenged more and more to take a stronger lead.

His major visit was to meet government personnel and committees on sobriety in all the Eastern European Socialist countries of Yugoslavia, Bulgaria, Rumania, Hungary, Czechoslovakia, and Poland.

There is a moral emphasis, he says, in these Communist countries against alcohol, tobacco, and gambling. Many of these have National Sobriety Committees that produce a weekly newspaper on temperance.

He was received most cordially, and given an opportunity to outline the work and ideals of Adventists.

In Rumania, he spoke to three large church assemblies--the first General Conference representative to do so, they reported, since 1938.

The church leadership and members in these countries sent their greetings to the General Conference.

This visit gave good assurance that temperance could be a major community service of the church in these areas. Doors are opening and we must do our part to move in as Providence prepares the way before us.
