DEVOTIONAL SERVICE:

'My Presence Shall Go With You," was the topic of the devotional talk given by M. S. Nigri, Chairman. He presented some fine thoughts from L. Wilhelm, a German writer. The writer comments on Exodus chapter 33, where the Lord promises Moses that His presence will be with him while leading His people through the desert. In verse 13 Moses asks the Lord: "Now therefore, I pray thee ... show me now thy ways, that I may know thee and find favor in thy sight." And in verse 14 the Lord replied to Moses: "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest."

Elder Nigri then read several paragraphs from L. Wilhelm, closing with this quotation: "Even if Moses would have had to stay away from God's sight in the cliff of the rock in order not to see His face, he knew that the Lord was present and he felt His presence. The same thing happens with us. The Lord leads His people, and His kindness, grace and mercy are the evidence of His presence among us.

'When difficult moments arise, when we are facing a crisis, and we are tempted to ask for a more visible sign, let us remember His abiding promise: 'I will make all my goodness pass before you. ... My presence will go with you and I will give you rest.'"

REPORT:

Caris H. Lauda, Executive Secretary of the Association of Privately-Owned SDA Services and Industries, presented a report concerning his visit to the Far Eastern and Southern Asia Divisions. Excerpts from his report are given: "Mrs. Lauda and I have just spent the most wonderful and challenging '101 days' of our lives. We have seen a people prepared and preparing others for the soon coming of our Lord. In the fabulous Far East we have met some of the most wonderful, happy Christian young people in the world. In spiritual emphasis weeks in our colleges, academies and medical institutions we have found a great army of youth who love their Lord and are 'sharing their faith.'

"In public meetings we have seen a people longing for peace, joy and security and finding it in Jesus. We have seen in action one of the most fruitful evangelistic agencies—the Voice of Prophecy Bible schools and our language schools with over 1,400 students in Seoul, Korea, hundreds in Osaka, Djakarta and other places. A Bible class is included in their schooling, and business men and women, attorneys, physicians, nurses and others are taking the course, and paying for it. What a wonderful work our student missionaries are doing in these schools and in their ministry throughout the world.

"Today I bring you special love and greetings from Brother and Sister Castillo from the Island of Mindoro in the Philippines. You will recall that he was our chosen General Conference layman at Atlantic City last Summer. March 19 and 20 we were with him. Nearly fifty persons were baptized and we had the privilege of dedicating his new 27th church to the Lord. Following the dedication Brother Castillo said, 'Elder Lauda, please come back in six weeks and dedicate my 28th church to the Lord—it is nearly ready.' Brother and Sister Castillo have won over 100 souls to Christ since General Conference. They are nearing the 1,400 mark of souls won to Christ.

"In South India we traveled from Madras south and Thursday night came to a city, Paloyomcottie, where four years ago the evangelist was driven out of town. But listen, we hear gospel singing! We see a large open-air bamboo auditorium and 2,000 people are crowded inside with hundreds sitting on the floor. We see thousands outside to our left and also to the right. I speak to them of the great love of God and teach them the chorus, 'Wonderful, Wonderful, Yes, my Lord is Wonderful.' Elder Willmott is the evangelist and his dear father and three college students are his assistants. We feel sure they will raise up a church of 500 there."

Elder Lauda passed on requests from four of our office headquarters where he visited, urging visits from our General Conference workers. They stressed the need of such fellowship and encouragement. He closed by saying "Today I thank God for the privilege of being a member of the royal family of God. We have a wonderful Seventh-day Adventist family around the world, and I can hardly wait until we can all be together in heaven from all over the world. What a gathering of the faithful that will be!"

F. E. J. HARDER -- INTRODUCTION:

Neal C. Wilson spoke of his happiness in introducing to the family here at headquarters F. E. J. Harder, of Andrews University, a gentleman we feel is going to mean a great deal in the future of our program in North America, particularly as it relates to higher education. A meeting is to be held this afternoon of available members of the Executive Board of Higher Education. We are pleased that Dr. and Mrs. Harder will be joining us. He will serve as Executive Secretary of the North American Board of Higher Education.

REPORTS:

Arthur L. White, Secretary of the Ellen G. White Publications, reported concerning the Seminary Extension School held in the Far Eastern Division, Mountain View College, in the province of Bukidnon, in Mindanao, Philippine Islands, May 3 to June 8.

The setting for the school was conducive to study. The elevation is 2,000 feet; the nearest telephone is 75 miles away; mail comes once a week. The campus is a beautiful place, nestled in the mountains. Bukidnon means mountainous.

There were 257 students enrolled in the Seminary Extension School, the largest held up to this time. They were comprised of ministers, Bible instructors, and educational workers.

Dr. W. G. C. Murdoch taught a class in Christology. His wife, Dr. Ruth Murdoch, taught a class in Educational Psychology, one of the most popular classes. She was assisted by Mrs. Marion Simmons, elementary educational supervisor from the division headquarters, who also taught a class. Division

evangelist Bruce Johnston was there teaching a course in Evangelism. Elder White presented Prophetic Guidance. A fine spirit prevailed throughout the school. R. C. Williams, Secretary of the Ministerial Association of the Far Eastern Division, was the co-ordinator, and did a fine piece of work keeping the wheels turning. This is the thirteenth Seminary Extension School Elder White has had the privilege of attending. He expressed pleasure in bringing a favorable report of the Seminary Extension School just closed in the Far Eastern Division.

L. L. Bock, Associate Secretary, stated he had the unexpected privilege of witnessing the Gymnaires for Christ, a youth team, while on a recent trip.

Although there may be room for improvement in certain ways, yet he feels they have the making of a tremendous program. They were attractively and appropriately attired. Their uniforms are beautiful. They displayed real flashes of genius so far as their gym groups, etc., are concerned. They were enthusiastic all the way through their program in their testimonies. Their music is appealing and urges people to give their hearts to the Lord Jesus and come to know Him. As they give their testimonies their faces show a radiance that is beautiful to behold.

 \underline{G} . \underline{E} . $\underline{Vandeman}$, Associate Secretary Ministerial Association, stated his heart is deeply burdened for the work in the great city of Montreal. There are 2.8 million people in the city, with only four to five hundred Seventh-day Adventists.

The It Is Written telecast has only been on since January. Already over 2,000 families have responded by mail or 'phone. In anticipation of results of the telecast, the Conference has bought a new church, without either a pastor or a congregation, believing it would be filled eventually.

Elder Vandeman was there for the first eight meetings. The entire campaign is for a month. Over the first weekend there were 700 non-SDA families attending, or 1,200 non-SDA individuals, representing 37 different denominations, with Roman Catholics doubling the number from any other denomination.

The Conference has gone all out in sending in workers for the campaign. There were present 12 Andrews University students, and 7 of their wives. The wives are also visiting. The Conference has brought in 8 laywomen for Bible Instructors' training. All of these 8 are now being trained to be Bible Instructors. With the exception of 1, all were It is Written converts, having come into the message through It Is Written.

Nearly 100 decisions were made at the end of the first eight meetings. One hundred of these interested people spent \$2.00 each for the privilege of spending all day in a Bible Seminar on the second Sabbath of the campaign.

Elder Vandeman re-emphasized his deep heart burden for the needs in the city of Montreal.

At the midyear Division committee meeting, with a full representation from the field, the following proposal was approved:

ORGANIZATION OF A NEW UNION CONFERENCE

Voted, To recommend to the General Conference and to the respective union committees that a new union conference be organized comprising the following organizations: Austrian Union of Churches, Belgian Conference, North French Conference, South French Conference, French Swiss Conference and German Swiss Conference, effective January 1, 1972.

I am inclosing a copy of the procedure which we are following and welcome any suggestions which you may have. All of these details were worked out in counsel with Elder Carcich and the men who are involved in this transition.

You will notice that we will have a special meeting of the three union executive committees in Zurich on July 7 and 8 to discuss with them the program and answer any questions which they may have. We are working out the details of the financial aspect and will have a suggestive budget to present at the time of our meeting in Zurich.

We have also studied the personnel for the new union conference and will be prepared to give guidance to the nominating committee which will be chosen with representation from all three fields. We realize that our time schedule is rather tight, but if we could have a reply from the General Conference with their recommendation at the time of our Zurich meeting, this would be most helpful as we talk with the brethren. We feel that the Lord is opening the way for closer collaboration as we plan for greater things in the future.

ORGANIZATION OF A UNION CONFERENCE

We recommend the following procedure in organizing a new Union Conference:

1. Recommendation of the Division Committee

The Division Committee, at a regular session, voted to recommend to the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists that a new Union Conference be organized comprising the following organizations: Austrian Union of Churches, Belgian Conference, North French Conference, South French Conference, French Swiss Conference and German Swiss Conference.

2. General Conference approval of the new Union Conference

The approval of the General Conference for the organization of the new Union Conference.

- The union president will inform each union executive committee as soon as possible.
- 4. Special meeting of the three union executive committees

The Division officers will meet with the members of the three union executive committees at Zurich, Switzerland, on July 7, 8, 1971. This group will study the various financial aspects involved in the organization of the new Union Conference. It will also propose the dissolution of the present union organization and the organization of the new union conference.

(5.) Call a special session of each union

The executive committee of each union affected will call a special session during the month of September, 1971, to act on the organization of the proposed Union Conference. If it is approved they will elect their delegates on the following bases: "Each conference or mission shall be entitled to one delegate without regard to numbers and one additional delegate for each 500 church members or major fraction thereof."

6. Date and place of the special session

The three union executive committees will agree upon the date and place of the union executive committee of the new organization.

7. Call a regular Union Conference session

In harmony with the Division policy, the delegates thus chosen will assume the following responsibility:

- (a) They shall elect the president, secretary-treasurer, the departmental secretaries of the union and the members of the Union Conference executive committee.
- (b) They shall adopt the constitution for the new organization.

- (c) They shall choose the name and headquarters for the new Union Conference.
- 8. Distribution of the expenses of the delegates
 - (a) The Division will assume the total hotel and entertainment expense of the three union committees meeting at Zurich and the travel expense will be borne by the respective unions.
 - (b) All additional expenses in connection with the above meetings shall be borne by the respective organizations.
