#### DEVOTIONAL SERVICE:

R. H. Pierson, Chairman, referred to a statement in Ministry of Healing, page 140, on the importance of little things. Here in the General Conference we deal with the big problems, and here the big plans are laid. The problems which cannot be solved on church level are passed to the conference, and if they cannot be solved in the conference, they are passed to the union, if they cannot be solved in the union they are passed to the division, and if the division cannot take care of them they are passed along to the General Conference. All of you are conscious of this fact as you travel. We are in the particular area where big plans are laid. We seek to challenge our folks around the world. Elder Pierson read a quotation stating that life is chiefly made up of little things. Some of the little things we do have the greatest effect upon those with whom we come in contact. If we are careful about the little things, many of the larger things fall into place. We are able to take care of them. "Only by acting upon principle in the tests of daily life can we acquire power to stand firm and faithful in the most dangerous and most difficult positions." It is our reactions and our ability with God's help to stand under smaller tests and meet them successfully that enable us to meet the different problems and the big things ahead of us. So let us keep in mind that the little things are sometimes the biggest things.

# ANTILLIAN UNION MISSION SURVEY COMMISSION REPORT:

On July 1, 1971, the General Conference Committee appointed members of a Survey Commission to study the readiness of the Antillian Union Mission (Inter-American Division), for Union Conference status. The Survey Commission met in San Juan, Puerto Rico, March 13-15, 1972. At this meeting careful consideration was given to the information and recommendations presented in the preceding report. After studying this report in the light of the Criteria for Evaluating the Readiness of Union Missions for Union Conference Status, the Commission unanimously--

VOTED, To recommend to the General Conference and the Inter-American Division that union conference status be granted to the Antillian Union according to the provisions of the <u>General Conference Working Policy</u>.

After consideration of the foregoing action taken by the Antillian Union Mission Survey Commission, it was--

VOTED, That we refer this recommendation to the Inter-American Division Committee for its study and approval at their annual meeting, with the understanding that the Inter-American Division Committee will request the appropriate authorization from the General Conference Committee.

#### DEVOTIONAL SERVICE:

W. J. Hackett, Chairman, read from The Living Bible Hebrews 5: from the 12th verse to the 6th chapter, verse 6. In this passage Paul writes that although the believers have been Christians a long time, they are like babes who can drink only milk. Those using milk are not far along in life. They do not know very much about wrong. Until they become better Christians and learn the difference in right from wrong by practicing it they are not mature. Strong meat belongs to those of full age. Psychologists impress upon us that real psychoanalysis is not so important as to step out and practice what we believe. God has given this Church a great responsibility to step out, to move out into the world, to move out into the deeper things of God. The Biblical Research Committee is pretty well along now in beginning the structure of Bible conferences, perhaps four of them for North America, in which we will get into some of the deeper things of the Word. The Lord has been with this Church. We believe the future is bright--bright in many ways as we move out from the milk to the strong meat of the Word.

# REPORT:

Caris H. Lauda, Secretary for North American Missions, reported:

This quarter's Thirteenth Sabbath overflow will be given to North America. Pine Forge Academy in Pennsylvania is in great need of a dormitory, our Indian mission school in Holbrook, Arizona, is in great need as they develop industries and vocational classes for our Indian boarding school there. We are having an

excellent school year there this year. Today I am especially pleased to bring you a report of the Northwest Territories in the Alberta, Canada, Conference. Yellowknife is the capital of the Northwest Territories and, as you know, some four years ago a medical clinic was established by Dr. Steven G. Tarangle, and Pastor Henry Bartsch and his family moved to this capital city. Every home in the city has been visited, and we are now planning the third year of Vacation Bible Schools. These schools have met with very favorable response throughout Yellowknife. We thank the Lord for eight that have been baptized in the first evangelistic series and for many who are now studying the truth. We have no meeting place of our own there at Yellowknife, and thirty per cent of the Thirteenth Sabbath overflow will go to Yellowknife to build a multi-purpose building which will truly be an evangelistic center with a chapel, welfare center, educational unit and parsonage. This is a cold country and by placing all under one roof, we will save much on heating costs.

You will be pleased to know that it is our plan to make the Thirteenth Sabbath overflow dollars go a long way in this project. The money will be used mostly for materials. Plans are being laid now for an SDA pilots' fly-in to Yellowknife in June, 1973. These pilots will bring with them qualified carpenters, plumbers, electricians, masons, etc. The foundation of the building will have already been laid, the materials will be on the property and all will be in readiness for this group of workmen to go forward immediately and build this multi-purpose building. In June the days will be very long, 18 to 20 hours of light. Therefore, the building should be erected by these wonderful laymen in a two-week period. Do give liberally to the Thirteenth Sabbath offering. Remember that in Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories we not only have a number of gold mines, but Seventh-day Adventists are searching and mining for the most precious of all gold, human hearts. Do pray that our searching and mining will be most fruitful for the kingdom of God.
