ADVENTIST REVIEW - SPECIAL REQUEST

It was necessary to expand the special Adventist Review bulletins of the General Conference Session by about 104 pages to include the extended discussion on the Fundamental Beliefs of Seventh-day Adventists. It is estimated that this involved an additional cost of about \$52,000. The Review and Herald administration has asked the General Conference to share a portion of this expense.

NORTHERN AND CENTRAL UNIONS--MERGER

The Northern and Central Union Committees have each taken actions recommending to their respective constituencies the merger of the two unions into one union. The union committees have called constituency meetings, with the Northern Union convening July 14, 1980, and the Central Union July 15, 1980. General Conference approval for the merger plans has been requested. In connection with these merger plans, the two union committees have recommended that, following the merger, study be given to the needs for merging some of the conferences within the new union whereby conferences would have a minimum of 6,000 members plus an agreed-upon minimum tithe base.

Assurance has been sought from the General Conference that it would make appropriations to the new union on the same basis that it would have made to the two separate unions if they had continued to exist during a four-year phase-in period, to help the new union with current commitments. Assurances have also been sought for a similar arrangement for merged conferences.

- VOTED, 1. To approve the recommendation of the Northern and Central Union Committees for the merging of the two unions into one union, subject to the approval of the respective union constituencies.
- 2. To request the next four Annual Council budget committees to give favorable consideration to continuing regular and special appropriations to the new union on a special basis during a four-year phase-in period.
- 3. To respond favorably to, and strongly recommend, the concept of merging some of the conferences within the proposed new union and to give special consideration to the needs of those conferences at such time as the mergers take place.

(The two unions concerned had expressed the hope that funds to be made available during the four-year phase-in period might be made available immediately upon merger. This suggestion did not meet with favorable consideration.)

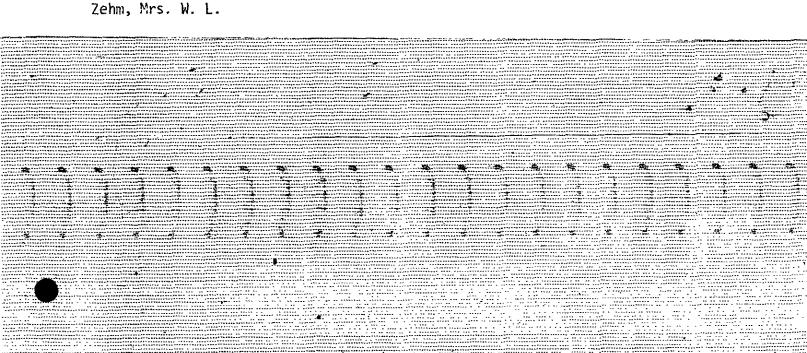

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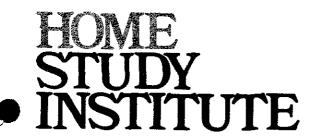

BYLAWS OF

LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER a California Nonprofit Religious Corporation

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of this corporation is LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER.

ARTICLE II

OFFICES

SECTION 1: PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The principal office for the transaction of the business of the corporation (hereinafter "principal executive office") is located in the City of Loma Linda, County of San Bernardino, State of California.

SECTION 2: OTHER OFFICES

The Board of Trustees may at any time establish branch or subordinate offices at any place or places where the corporation is qualified to do business.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSES

The corporation is a religious corporation organized pursuant to the Nonprofit Religious Corporation Law of the State of California and is an integral part of the system of medical and educational institutions established and operated throughout the world by the Seventh-day Adventist Church "to make man whole" physically, mentally and spiritually.

Its primary purpose is to operate a medical center as (1) a teaching facility for the training of students in medically related professions and skills qualified to serve the mission of the church anywhere in the world, (2) a regional tertiary care facility providing quality medical care, (3) a scientific research facility, and (4) a facility where health and temperance education is provided both for the church as well as preventive health measures promoted for the community service area.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1: MEMBERS

There shall be a single class of members of this corporation which shall consist of all ex officio members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church's North American Division Committee on Administration (hereinafter "NADCA"), the members of the Board of Trustees of this corporation, and not more than ten (10) such other persons as may be granted membership status by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the Board of Trustees. Membership in this corporation shall terminate when an individual ceases, for whatever reason, to be a member or ex officio member of the Seventh-day Adventist Church's North American Division Committee on Administration (NADCA) or a member of the Board of Trustees of this corporation.

SECTION 2: VOTING

Each member of this corporation shall be entitled to one vote.

SECTION 3: REGULAR MEETINGS

The regular meeting of the membership of the corporation shall be held every five (5) years at Loma Linda, California, at a date and time fixed by the Board of Trustees at a regular meeting. Written notice of all meetings shall be by first class mail, postage fully prepaid, addressed to each member at the member's address of record with the corporation, which notice shall be mailed at the United States Post Office in Loma Linda, California, not less than thirty (30) days immediately preceding the time fixed for said meeting.

SECTION 4: SPECIAL MEETINGS

Special meetings of the membership may be held at such time and place as may be fixed by the Board of Trustees. Written notice of the time and place of special meetings of the members shall be given in the same manner as for regular meetings of the members except that the purposes for which a special meeting is called shall be specified in the notice. The transactions of any meeting of the members of this corporation, whether called and noticed, shall be as valid as though enacted at a meeting held after regular call and notice if quorum is present, and if either before or after the meeting, each of the voting members not present signs a written waiver of notice, or a

consent of holding this meeting, or an approval of the minutes of the meeting. All the waivers, consents or approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or be made a part of the minutes of the meeting.

SECTION 5: QUORUM

Thirty (30) voting members shall constitute a quorum for any meeting of the members.

SECTION 6: ORDER OF BUSINESS

The order of business at a membership meeting shall be determined by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 7: VOTING

At all membership meetings, all questions shall be determined by a majority vote. No member may vote or act by proxy.

SECTION 8: LIABILITIES OF MEMBERS

There shall be no membership fees, dues or assessments.

No person who becomes a member of this corporation shall be personally liable to its creditors for any indebtedness or liability and any or all creditors of this corporation shall look only to the assets of this corporation for payment.

SECTION 9: INDEMNIFICATION

The Board of Trustees may authorize the corporation to pay expenses incurred by, or to satisfy a judgment or fine rendered or levied against, a present or former member, director, officer or employee of the corporation in an action brought by a third party against such a person (whether or not the corporation is joined as a party defendant) to impose a liability or penalty on such person for an act alleged to have been committed by such

person while a member, trustee, officer or employee, or by
the corporation, or by both; provided the governing board
determines in good faith that such member, trustee, officer
or employee was acting in good faith within what he reasonably
believed to be the scope of his employment or authority
and for a purpose which he reasonably believed to be in
the best interests of the corporation or its members.

Payments authorized hereunder include amounts paid and
expenses incurred in settling any such action or threatened
action. The provisions of this article shall apply to the
estate, executor, officer or employee, and the terms
"person" where used in this article shall include the
estate, executor, administrator, heirs, legatees or
devisees of such person.

ARTICLE V

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

SECTION 1: MEMBERSHIP AND QUORUM

The exact number of the Board of Trustees shall vary in harmony with the qualifications of the categories provided herein, but at no time shall there be less than fifteen (15) nor more than twenty-one (21) members. Quorum shall consist of fifty percent (50%) of the elected trustees, who shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SECTION 2: POWERS OF TRUSTEES

Subject to the limitations of the Articles of Incorporation, other sections of the bylaws, and of applicable California law, all powers of the corporation shall be exercised by or under the authority of, and the business and affairs of this corporation shall be exercised by, the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 3: OFFICERS OF BOARD

- A. The Chairman of the Board of Trustees shall be elected by the Board of Trustees on the recommendation of NADCA, and shall preside at the meetings of the Board of Trustees and the Executive Committee. He shall cause to be called regular and special meetings of the Board of Trustees in accordance with these bylaws.
- B. A First Vice Chairman and a Second Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees shall be elected by the Board of Trustees. In the absence of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the First Vice Chairman shall preside at the meetings of the Board of Trustees and the Executive Committee. In the absence of both the Chairman and the First Vice Chairman, the Second Vice Chairman shall preside at the meetings of the Board of Trustees and the Executive Committee.
- C. The Secretary shall be responsible for the recording of the proceedings of the corporation and shall perform all of the duties usually incident to the office of Secretary.

SECTION 4: ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE

The Board of Trustees shall be elected by the members of
the corporation. The term of office of each trustee shall
be five (5) years or until his successor is elected.

Successors for trustees whose terms of office are then
expiring shall be elected at the regular meeting of the
members in the year such terms expire. A trustee may
succeed himself in office.

SECTION 5: QUALIFICATION OF TRUSTEES

The elected trustees shall be selected from individuals
representing a variety of interests and abilities. Each
trustee shall be more than eighteen (18) years of age;

shall have interest in health care and medical education; and shall support the specific goals and objectives of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and its health, temperance, and educational ministries and be member in good and regular standing of said church. Trustees meeting these basic qualifications shall include the following:

- A. In recognition of the corporation's affiliation with Loma, Linda University, two (2) trustees shall be non-physician representatives from Loma Linda University.
- B. Not less than five (5) physicians who are members of the medical staff shall be selected to serve as trustees and shall include the staff president and the chief of staff. Physicians who are board members may not have concurrent contractual relations with the corporation.
- C. The president of the corporation shall be a member of the Board of Trustees, but no other officer or employee shall be a board member.
- D. The balance of the trustees may be composed of individuals selected on the basis of consideration that may include the following:
 - Well known and respected among a significant segment of the population;
 - Demonstrated leadership in humanitarian activities and active in civic and service organizations and community affairs;
 - 3. Successful in personal business matters;
- 4. Ability to listen, to analyze, to think independently and logically; to make meaningful, relevant, and concise contributions to discussions, and to be generally helpful in making decisions;

- 5. Possession of practical and technical or professional knowledge and skills which enable the giving of expert counsel; and
- 6. Possession of demonstrated capabilities in the field of education, preferably medical or medically related education.

SECTION 6: VACANCIES

The Board of Trustees shall have the power to fill vacancies among the officers and trustees between meetings of membership of the corporation by a majority vote of the trustees then in office even though less than a quorum or by the sole remaining trustee. A successor trustee so elected shall serve until the next regularly scheduled meeting of the corporate members or until his term expires, whichever event is first to occur.

SECTION 7: DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees shall have the control and general management of the business of the corporation and exercise all of the powers, rights and privileges permitted to be exercised by trustees of a nonprofit religious corporation under the statutes of the State of California, except as limited by the Articles of Incorporation and these bylaws.

Duties of the Board of Trustees shall include but not be limited to:

- A. The appointment and removal of the president, vice presidents, secretary and treasurer of the corporation.
 - B. The approval of all budgets and financial policies;
- C. The establishment and coordination of policies in which the Medical Center fulfills its responsibilities as a part of the health and educational ministries of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

D. The adoption of conflict of interest guidelines applicable to members of the board and corporate officers.

Regular meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be held at any place within or without the State that has been designated from time to time by resolution of the Board of Trustees or by written consent of all members of the Board. In the absence of this designation, regular meetings shall be held at the principal executive office of the corporation. Special meetings of the Board may be held either at a place designated or at the principal executive office.

Immediately following each regular meeting of the members of the corporation the Board of Trustees shall hold a regular meeting for the purpose of organization, election of officers of the Board of Trustees and the transaction of business. No other notice of such organizational meeting need be given.

SECTION 10: REGULAR MEETINGS

The Board of Trustees shall hold a regular quarterly
meeting. One such meeting which is held within 120 days
of the closing of the fiscal year of the corporation shall
be designated as the annual meeting of the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 11: SPECIAL MEETINGS

Special meetings of the Board of Trustees for any purpose or purposes may be called at any time by the Chairman of the Board or at written request of four (4) or more trustees delivered to the Secretary. Written notice of the time and

place of special meetings shall be delivered personally to each trustee or sent to each trustee by United States mail or by other form of written communication, charges prepaid, addressed to the trustee at the trustee's address as it is shown on the records of the corporation or, if it is not so shown on the records or is not readily ascertainable, at the place at which the meetings of trustees are regularly held. The notice shall be mailed at least fifteen (15) days before the time of the holding of the meeting.

Members of the Board of Trustees shall be deemed present at any meeting if a conference telephone or similar communication equipment is arranged, by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can communicate with each other.

The transactions of any meeting of the Board of Trustees, however called and noticed and wherever held, shall be as valid as though the meeting had been held after call and notice if a quorum is present and if, either before or after the meeting, each of the trustees not present signs a written waiver or notice of consent to hold the meeting or an approval of the minutes. All such waivers, consents or approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or made a part of the minutes of the meeting.

SECTION 12: ACTION WITHOUT A MEETING

Any action by the Board of Trustees may be taken without
a meeting if all members of the Board, individually or
collectively, consent in writing to this action. Such
written consent or consents shall be filed with the minutes
of the proceedings of the Board.

SECTION 13: RESIGNATION AND REMOVAL

- A. Any trustee may be removed from office with or without cause by a majority vote of the corporate members.
- B. Absence from more than one-half (1/2) of the regular meetings during any twelve (12) month period shall be considered as a resignation from the Board of Trustees unless the absence is excused in harmony with the following procedure:
- The Chairman or the President is informed of the reasons for the absence prior to the meeting; and
- 2. The approval of the absence by the Chairman or the President is recorded in the official Board minutes.

SECTION 14: COMPENSATION

Members of the Board of Trustees shall receive no compensation for their services as trustees.

ARTICLE VI

COMMITTEES

Except as otherwise provided by these bylaws, the Board of Trustees may, by resolution or resolutions passed by a majority of the members thereof, appoint standing or special committees for any purpose.

ARTICLE VII

OFFICERS OF CORPORATION

SECTION 1: OFFICERS

The officers of the corporation shall be a President, an Executive Vice President, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, who shall be the chief financial officer.

The corporation may also have, at the discretion of the Board, one or more additional Vice Presidents, one or more Assistant Secretaries, and one or more Assistant Treasurers. Any person may hold more than one office, except that the President may not serve concurrently as the Secretary or Treasurer. Officers shall serve at the pleasure of the Board and shall hold office until resignation or removal, or otherwise be disqualified to serve, or a successor appointed.

SECTION 2: PRESIDENT

The President shall be appointed by the Board. The President shall be the chief executive officer of the corporation.

Subject to the control of the Board of Trustees, he shall have general supervision of the business of the corporation, shall preside in the absence of the Chairman, First Vice Chairman and Second Vice Chairman of the Board at all meetings of the Board subject to the prior written approval of the Chairman, shall be a member of all of the standing committees, and shall have such other powers and duties usually vested in such an officer.

SECTION 3: VICE PRESIDENTS

Vice Presidents shall be elected by the Board of Trustees and shall act for the President in his absence in harmony with the chain of command as established by the Board of Trustees. The Vice Presidents shall perform such other duties as may be assigned with respect to the day to day operation of the medical center.

SECTION 4: SECRETARY

The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of the corporation and shall perform all of the duties usually incident to the office of Secretary.

SECTION 5: TREASURER

The Treasurer shall collect, receipt and deposit in the name of the corporation all monies due or belonging to it, including donations to the work, and shall disburse funds in accordance with the directions of the Board of Trustees. He shall do and perform all of the duties pertaining to the office of Treasurer.

ARTICLE VIII

ADMINISTRATION

SECTION 1: AUTHORITY OF PRESIDENT

The President shall be in charge of the general management of the hospital, subject to the corporation administrative policies adopted by the Board of Trustees. The President shall act as the duly authorized representative of the Board of Trustees in all matters in which the Board of Trustees has not formally designated some other person to act. In the absence of the President any of his responsibilities may be delegated by the President to a Vice President or Vice Presidents in harmony with a chain of command as may be determined from time to time by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 2: RESPONSIBILITIES OF PRESIDENT
The responsibilities of the President shall include:

A. Carrying out all policies and procedures established by the Foard of Trustees in harmony with the policies and philosophies of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and providing, in harmony with the basic purposes for which the Medical Center is operated, a teaching facility for the training of students in medically related professional skills.

- B. Development of a plan of organization of the personnel and others concerned with the operation of the hospital and submission thereof to the Board of Trustees for approval;
- C. Preparation of an annual operating and a capital expenditure budget showing the expected receipts and expenditures and such other information as is required by the Board of Trustees, and submission of such budgets to the Board of Trustees for approval;
- D. Selection, employment, control, and discharge of employees and development and maintenance of personnel policies and practices for the Medical Center;
- E. Maintenance of physical properties in a good state of repair and operating condition;
- F. Supervision of business affairs to insure that funds are collected and expended to the best possible advantage and within the provisions of the annual budgets;
- G. Cooperation with the medical staff and with all those concerned with rendering of professional service to the end that high quality care may be rendered to the patients consistent with the policies set forth by the Board of Trustees.
- H. Assuring that meaningful relationships are established and maintained with the sponsoring constituencies as well as with the publics served; and that proper efforts are put forth to seek and obtain philanthropic support.
- I. Presentation to the Board of Trustees or to its authorized committees of periodic reports reflecting the administrative and financial activities of the Medical Center;
- J. Arrange with the President of the Medical Staff for a periodic report of professional service;

- K. Reporting all activities and recommendations of the Medical Staff to the Board;
- L. Execution of contracts authorized by the Board of Trustees except as is otherwise provided by these bylaws, and subject further to the limitations of authority delegated by the Board of Trustees;
- M. Performance of other duties assigned by the Board of Trustees that may be necessary in the best interest of the Medical Center;
- N. Serving as a member of the Board of Trustees and its committees, except as is otherwise provided by these bylaws or as may be otherwise directed by the Board of Trustees from time to time;
- O. To establish goals and objectives to be presented for the approval of the Board of Trustees which shall include a long range plan and an annual update to be reviewed by the Board of Trustees;
- P. To arrange for all reasonable and necessary insurance coverage, including but not limited to casualty insurance, public liability insurance, and professional liability insurance.

ARTICLE IX

MEDICAL STAFF

SECTION 1: ORGANIZATION

The Board of Trustees shall cause to be created a medical staff organization, to be known as the Medical Staff of the Medical Center, whose membership shall be comprised of all physicians who are privileged to attend patients in the Medical Center, and, where appropriate, such dentists,

podatrists and other professionals who are privileged to attend patients in the Medical Center. Membership in this medical staff organization shall be a prerequisite to the exercise of clinical privileges in the Medical Center, except as otherwise specifically provided in the medical staff bylaws.

SECTION 2: MEDICAL STAFF BYLAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

- A. PURPOSE: The medical staff shall propose and adopt by vote bylaws, rules, and regulations for its internal governance which shall be effective only when approved by the Board of Trustees which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. The medical staff bylaws shall create an effective administrative unit to discharge the functions and responsibilities assigned to the medical staff bylaws, rules, and regulations shall state the purpose, functions, and organization of the staff, and shall set forth the policies by which the medical staff exercises and accounts for its delegated authority and responsibilities. The medical staff bylaws shall be supportive of the policies of this corporation and the health care philosophy of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.
- B. PROCEDURE: The medical staff shall have the initial responsibility to formulate, adopt, and recommend to the Board of Trustees medical staff bylaws and amendments thereto, which shall be effective when approved by the Board of Trustees. Proposed medical staff bylaw changes will be presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees and mailed to each trustee at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting at which a vote is to be taken on adoption of the proposed change. No medical staff bylaws or amendments shall become effective without approval by the Board as

provided. If the medical staff fails to exercise this responsibility in good faith and in a reasonable, timely, and responsible manner, and after written notice from the Board to such effect, including a reasonable period of time for a response, the Board may formulate or amend the medical staff bylaws. In such event, medical staff recommendations and views shall be carefully considered by the Board of Frustees during its deliberation and its action.

SECTION 3: MEDICAL STAFF MEMBERSHIP AND CLINICAL PRIVILEGES

- A. DELEGATION TO THE MEDICAL STAFF: The Board of
 Trustees shall delegate to the medical staff the responsibility and authority to investigate and evaluate all matters
 relating to medical staff membership status, clinical
 privileges, and corrective action, and shall require that
 the staff adopt and forward to it specific written recommendations with appropriate supporting documentation that will
 allow the Board to take informed action.
- B. ACTION BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES: Final action on all matters relating to medical staff membership status, clinical privileges, and corrective action shall be taken by the Board after considering the staff recommendations, provided that the Board shall act in any event if the staff fails to adopt and submit any such recommendation within the time periods set forth in the medical staff bylaws. Such board action without a staff recommendation shall be based on the same kind of documented investigation and evaluation of current ability, judgment, and character as is required for staff recommendations.
 - C. CRITERIA FOR BOARD ACTION: When acting on matters of redical staff membership status, the Board shall consider the staff's recommendations, the needs of the Medical

Center, and such additional criteria as are set forth in the medical staff bylaws. In granting and defining the scope of clinical privileges to be exercised by each practitioner, the Board shall consider the staff's recommendations, the supporting information on which they are based, and such criteria as are set forth in the medical staff bylaws. No aspect of membership status nor specific clinical privileges shall be limited or denied to a practitioner on the basis of sex, age, race, color, or national origin.

- PRIVILEGES: The terms and conditions of membership status in the medical staff and of the exercise of clinical privileges shall be as specified in the medical staff bylaws or as more specifically defined in the notice of individual appointment. Appointment to the medical staff may be for a maximum term of two (2) years, and shall in all cases be contingent upon prior appointment to the faculty of Loma Linda University. Medical staff appointment to the faculty of Loma Linda University.
- E. PROCEDURE: The procedure to be followed by the medical staff and the Board of Trustees in acting on matters of membership status, clinical privileges and corrective action shall be as specified in the medical staff bylaws.

SECTION 4: ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONALS

The Board of Trustees shall delegate to the medical staff the responsibility and authority to investigate and evaluate each application by an allied health professional for specified services, department affiliation, and modification in the services such allied health professional may perform, and shall require that the staff or a designated component thereof take recommendations to it or its designee thereon.

ARTICLE X

QUALITY OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

SECTION 1: BOARD OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITY
The Board of Trustees shall require:

- A. That the medical and administrative staff prepare and maintain adequate and accurate medical records for all patients; and
- B. That the person responsible for each basic and supplemental medical service cause written policies and procedures to be developed and maintained, and that such policies be approved by the Board. The Board shall further require, after considering the recommendations of the medical staff, the conduct of specific review and evaluation activities to assess, preserve, and improve the overall quality and efficiency of patient care in the Medical Center. The Board shall provide whatever administrative assistance is reasonably necessary to support and facilitate the implementation and the ongoing operation of these review and evaluation activities.

SECTION 2: ACCOUNTABILITY TO BOARD OF TRUSTEES The medical staff shall conduct and be accountable to the Board for conducting activities that contribute to the preservation and improvement of the quality and efficiency of patient care provided in the Medical Center. These activities shall include:

A. The conduct of periodic meetings at regular intervals to review and evaluate the quality of patient care (generally on a retrospective basis) through a valid and reliable quality assurance procedure based upon a review of patient medical records;

- B. Ongoing monitoring of patient care practices through the defined functions of the medical staff, the other professional services, and Medical Center administration;
- C. Definition of the clinical privileges for members of the medical staff commensurate with individual credentials and demonstrated ability and judgment, and assignment of patient care responsibilities to other health care professionals consistent with individual licensure, qualifications, and demonstrated ability;
- D. Provision of continuing professional education, shaped primarily by the needs identified through the review and evaluation activities;
- E. Review of utilization of the Medical Center's medical resources to provide for their allocation to meet the needs of the patients; and
- F. Such other measures as the Board of Trustees may, after considering the advice of the medical staff and other professional services and Medical Center administration, does necessary for the preservation and improvement of the quality and efficiency of patient care.

SECTION 3: DOCUMENTATION

The Board of Trustees shall require, receive, consider, and act upon the findings and recommendations emanating from the activities required herein. All such findings and recommendations shall be in writing, signed by the persons responsible for conducting the review activities, and supported and accompanied by appropriate documentation upon which the Board can take informed action.

ARTICLE XI

ADJUNCT ORGANIZATIONS

From time to time the corporation may establish adjunct organizations, including advisory boards and Medical Center auxiliaries. Each such group shall establish its own constitution or articles of incorporation, bylaws, and rules and regulations, and present them to the Board of Trustees for approval, and all amendments thereto shall also be subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees. These bylaws and the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation shall prevail and govern over the documents and actions of such adjunct and subordinate groups.

ARTICLE XII

LEGAL INSTRUMENTS

- SECTION 1: EXECUTION OF LEGAL DOCUMENTS

The President or the Executive Vice President, together with the Secretary or an Assistant Secretary, shall sign any deeds or mortgages or other legal documents under authority given them by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 2: SECURITIES

The President or the Executive Vice President and the

Secretary or an Assistant Secretary or such other officers
as the Board of Trustees may select for that purpose are
authorized to vote, represent, and exercise, on behalf of
this corporation, all rights incident to any and all
voting securities of any other corporation or corporations
standing on the name of this corporation. The authority
granted by these bylaws to the officers to vote or represent
this corporation arising from any voting securities held

by this corporation and any other corporation or corporations may be exercised by the officers in person or by any person authorized so to do by proxy or power of attorney duly executed by the officer.

SECTION 3: SEAL

The corporation shall have a corporate seal, and the same shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation, the date of its incorporation, and word "California".

ARTICLE XIII

AUDITOR

The books of the corporation shall be audited annually by an independent firm of certified public accountants as the Board of Trustees may direct, it being understood that such audit shall not preclude an annual review by the auditing service of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists.

ARTICLE XIV

AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

These bylaws may be amended or repealed or new bylaws may be adopted by either of the following procedures:

- A. By a majority vote of the constituent members at any regular meeting or special meeting of the membership;
 - B. By the vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present at any regular meeting or special meeting of the Board of Trustees, contingent upon the ratification of the membership of the corporation. To become effective, notice of any such amendment adopted by the Board of Trustees must be sent by mail to each constituent member of the corporation and ratification shall be presumed unless within sixty (60) days after mailing a majority of the constituent members vote to rescind such amendment.

 Any amendment adopted by the Board of Trustees shall not become operative without the ratification of the membership of the corporation as herein set forth.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER, INC.

ARTICLE 1

The name of this corporation is LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER.

ARTICLE !!

This corporation is a religious corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Religious Corporation Law of the State of California exclusively for religious purposes. More specifically, the purposes of this corporation are to further the medical and educational ministries of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and "to make man whole," physically, mentally, and spiritually, by providing a teaching facility for the medically related professions; by providing a tertiary care facility; and by providing a regional medical center for the geographic area which it serves.

ARTICLE III

The name and address of the corporation's initial agent for service of process is:

ARTICLE IV

A. The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to religious and educational purposes, and no part of the net income or assets—

of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member of the corporation, or to the benefit of any private person.

B. Upon the winding up and dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the corporation, the remaining assets of this corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1975. Such nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation shall be the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, a religious corporation organized under the laws of the District of Columbia, if it qualifies as a distributee at the time for distribution pursuant to the provisions of these Articles.

ARTICLE V

- A. This corporation is organized exclusively for religious purposes within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

 Notwithstanding other provisions of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on:
- 1. By a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law); or
- 2. By a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law).

ARTICLE II GOVERNANCE

112

2.01 (a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the 114 parties hereto that following the effective date of this agreement, 115 "LLUMC" shall establish/maintain its character as an independent self-governing Medical Center providing a tertiary care facility for the 116 counties of San Bernardino, Riverside, Inyo and Mono.

- (b) "LLUMC" shall make available to "LLU", facilities to 119 be used by "LLU" in its educational programs, in a manner consistent 120 with its character as a tertiary care center.
- 2.02 (a) The Medical Center Board shall be the governing body 123 of "LLUMC".
- (b) The Medical Center Board recognizes that within the 125 framework of this agreement the various schools of "LLU" shall have 126 input to the deliberations of the Medical Center Board.
- 2.03 (a) The Medical Center Board and "LLU" Boards shall each 129 appoint three members and the Medical Staff one member to a Joint 130 Affiliation Committee, hereinafter known as "JAC". This Committee shall discuss items of mutual concern to both parties to this 131 agreement and make recommendations to the respective Boards to arrive 132 at decisions. These appointed will be reviewed and reappointed annually.
- (b) When items affecting various services or Educational 134

 Programs are discussed the appropriate persons will be invited. 135
 - (c) The Committee shall appoint its own chairman. 137

- 2.04 The main topics for consideration of the JAC are as 139
 follows, however, discussion is not limited to these topics alone.
- (a) Communications: To keep Medical Center Board, 142
 LLUMC Medical Staff and **LLU** and **LLU**C** administrations cognizant 143
 of pertinent actions taken or contemplated by one or the other:
- (b) Planning: To consider plans for growth and 145 development.
- (c) Problems: To consider issues which arise in 147 operation and affairs of both parties to this agreement.
- Id) Disputes shall be resolved by the JAC between the two 150 institutions, but should the decision of this committee still leave a 151 dispute, the respective boards of "LLU" and "LLUMC" shall, through a combined effort, settle the matter and their decision as to the plan 152 for settling the dispute, shall be final.
- (e) Accreditation: To exchange views or reason for and 154 methods of obtaining accreditation for the Medical Center and all 155 schools affiliated therewith that will assure quality care and 156 education in the Medical Center.
- 2.05 (a) A formal Medical Staff with officers and authorized 158 committees shall be established and maintained by "LLUNC". Hedical 159

Staff By-laws shall be established by the members of the Medical 160 Staff, each member of which is a Faculty member of the "LLU".

- (b) The Bylaws of the Medical Staff shall be reviewed on 163 an annual basis by officers of the Medical Executive Committee. The 164 original Medical Staff Bylaws and any changes thereto shall be 165 approved by the Medical Center Board.
- 2.06 (a) The hospital administrator (President) shall continue 168 to function as the Medical Center's Chief Executive Officer, 169 responsible to the Medical Center Board.
- (b) The Medical Center Board shall set forth the duties 171 and responsibilities of the President.
- (c) If there should be a vacancy in the office of the 174 President, the appointment shall be made by the Medical Center Board. 175

177

ARTICLE III PACULTY AND MEDICAL STAFF

- 3.01 "LLU" shall have complete discretion and shall be solely 179 responsible for any and all appointments to and retention of the 180 faculty of the various schools.
- 3.02 All members of the staff of attending physicians and 182 dentists at "LLUMC" at the time of execution of this agreement will 183

continue to be members of the Medical Staff of "LLUMC" pursuant to the policies and regulations of "LLUMC". Only those who are faculty of 184 "LLUM may be members of the "LLUMC" Medical Staff.

- 3.03 Full/part-time faculty of "LLU", who are Physicians, 186 Dentists, and Podietrists <u>licensed</u> to practice in the State of 187 California, and have pledged themselves to adhere to the "LLUMC" 188 Medical Staff Bylaws, shall be eligible to become members of the 189 medical staff of "LLUMC" in accordance with policies and regulations 190 of the Medical Center.
- 3.04 (a) "LLU" and SOM (in case of Hospital Dentistry, by 192 nomination of Dean of School of Dentistry), along with the President 193 of "LLUMC" and Medical Executive Committee of "LLUMC" shall be 194 responsible for the appointment of chiefs of service.
- (b) No chief of service shall commence duties as chief 196 until such time as he/she physically re-locates to Loma Linda 197 University Medical Center, at which time and thenceforth, the major 198 focus of the chiefs* Medical activity shall be at "LLUMC".
- (c) "LLUMC" Board shall delineate and define the major 200 services at "LLUMC", with input from "LLU". Services at "LLUMC" shall 202 include, but not be limited to the following:

- establish and maintain a uniform and optimal level of medical care for 219 all patients within the financial capabilities of "LLUMC" and this 220 shall include control of the quality of activities on all in-patient floors and out-patient departments including professional clinical 221 care in the Medical Center.
- (e) Each chief of service shall be responsible for the 223 appropriate and efficient utilization of Medical Center facilities in 224 conjunction with the Medical Center President or designee.

- (g) Each chief of service shall be responsible for 229 enforcement with his/her service of Medical Center and medical staff 230 by-laws, rules and regulations and for the implementation of all actions and policies of the Medical Center Board.
- (h) The chief of service is responsible to transmit to 233 the Medical Executive Committee recommendations from within the 234 service concerning classifications, reappointment, and delineation of clinical privileges for all practitioners and clinicians within 235 his/her service.
- phase of administration of his/her service and shall cooperate fully 238 with the LLUMC administration and nursing staff in all matters affecting patient care, including those involving personnel, supplies, 239 special regulations, policies, procedures, standing orders and 240 professional techniques.
- (including operational, equipment and 243 remodeling) which are required by the Medical Executive Committee and 244 LLUKC administration and/or Medical Center Board.
- (k) LLUMC Board shall delineate and define all divisions 246 or sections within each service at "LLUMC", with input from "LLU". 247
- (1) All chiefs of divisions or sections at the Medical 249 Center shall devote the major portion of their Medical Center time to 250 activities which make possible the viability of "LLUMC".

- 3.05 Each medical and surgery service, division or section is 252 under the direction and supervision of a physician or dentist who 253 controls and coordinates the educational activities of all SOM/Dentistry students be they undergraduate, graduate or post-Generally, an employee is assigned by "LLUEC" to these 254 areas and he/she is known as the department head. The function of 255 such an employee is to care for the many details of work and the necessary management assignments and to assist the physician relative 256 routine concerns. Such authority is vested from the physician in 257 the form of delegated authority and is subject to the discretion of 258 the chief of service, in concurrence with the Hospital President or designee.
- 3.06 For purposes of this agreement the Faculty Practice Groups 260 (referred to hereinafter as Physician Private practice groups, and 261 Faculty Medical Office Corporations representing the practice arm) 262 shall be considered as part of "LLU".
- 3.07 (a) Medical Records are property of "LLUMC" and may not, 264 except for court purposes be taken from "LLUMC".
- (b) Certain records will be made available for special 267 research when properly requested through the director of Medical 268 Records of LLUMC. LLUMC Medical Records may not be copied without the 269 express permission of the Director of Medical Records.

- (c) "LLU" faculty, when attending patients at "LLUMC", 271 are expected to complete medical records and have all signatures made 272 within 14 days of the discharge of the patient.
- 3.08 The Professional Practice Committee of "LLUMC", shall 275 evaluate and determine methods of dealing with any professional 276 practice which could cause liability to the Medical Center or result 277 in less than optimal patient care and treatment.

ARTICLE IV AVAILABILITY OF PATIENTS FOR TEACHING AND RESEARCH 280

- 4.01 All patients admitted to "LLUMC" are eligible to 283 participate in teaching and research programs, unless the admitting 284 physician or the patient specifically request at time of admission 285 that they be excluded.
- 4.02 Each member of the "LLUMC" medical staff shall be 287 responsible for the professional care rendered to patients in his/her 288 name without regard to the participation of each patient in teaching 289 and research programs conducted pursuant to this agreement.
- 4.03 (a) Nothing in this agreement shall in any way restrict 292 access of all patients of any qualified *LLUMC* medical staff members 293 to beds and facilities of the Medical Center on an equal basis, with 294

due regard for priorities to patients such as those having special teaching value and/or determined emergency admissions.

- (b) Upon the identification and segregation of facilities 296 for specialized service or care, such facilities or areas may be 297 restricted to access, within reason, by medical staff members of the 298 Medical Center who possess **LLUNC** privileges and are related to such 299 specialized care.
- (c) The Medical Center Board, upon recommendation of the 301 LLUMC Medical Executive Committee and with the consent of "LLU" dean 302 of SOM, and hospital president or designee, shall have the authority 303 to identify and, as set forth above, restrict, within reason, access 304 to facilities and areas within the Medical Center which are devoted to 305 specialized care.
- (d) In order to insure adequate availability of beds to 307 meet the needs of all types of patients of the "LLUMC" medical staff, 308 the parties to this agreement agree that anytime that the total 309 Medical Center average count for all patients shall reach 88%, that 310 "LLUMC" President or designed shall temporarily remove restrictions 311 and along with the attending physician and "LLUMC" nursing directors 312 determine the best plan for admission of patients in an endeavor to 313 maximize health care for all types of ill or injured patients.

5.01 (a) Medical students as well as students from all other 318 academic areas of "LLU" when in the Medical Center shall abide by all 319 policies, rules and regulations of the Medical Center.

- (Residents) and assigned teaching Faculty of the *LLU*.
- Student physicians shall participate in patient care 327 (C) by taking medical histories, performing physical examinations, 328 differential diagnosis and problem lists. recording making recommendations for diagnostic and therapeutic procedures, making 329 recommendations for disposition of patients after discharge from the 330 Medical Center, and participating in other activities as permitted the dean of the "LLU" SOR and "LLUNC" medical staff. All patients. histories, physical examinations; and other notes as recorded by 332 students participating in Medical Center teaching programs, shall 333 become a part of the patients' Medical Center records. These entries 334 shall be identified by the student's signature and shall be properly 335 dated and show the hour of the entry. Each such entry will be signed by the appropriate attending staff or faculty member. 336
- 5.02 (a) Subject to mutual written agreement between "LLUMC" 338 and "LLU", the Medical Center will provide, within reason, education 339

facilities for "LLU" students from SOM and other schools as may be negotiated from time to time.

(b) All educational programs in the "LLUMC" shall be 341 under the jurisdiction of an educational unit of "LLU". 342

ARTICLE VI HOUSE STAFF (RESIDENTS)

345

- 6.01 House Staff may participate in the "LLUMC" Resident program 347 upon assurance that they have satisfied all prerequisites of the 348 California Board of Medical Quality Assurance, or California Board of Dental Examiners, and have been approved by the Graduate Medical 349 Education Committee.
- 6.02 (a) Post-Graduate education is supervised by the director 352 of Graduate Education, a physician on the medical staff of "LLUMC". 353
- (b) Approval of applications to the Resident Program, and 355 coordination of the program is supervised by the Graduate Medical 356 Education Committee, a Medical Center Committee.
- 6.03 The numbers of residents budgeted shall be negotiated 358 annually between the "LLU" SON (SON) School of Dentistry and "LLUNC". 359

- 7.01 (a) "LLUMC" and "LLU" are committed to the advancement of 364 knowledge through research.
- (b) It is understood and agreed hereto that are regard be 367 given to the safety and personal rights of all patients involved in 368 any research pertaining to patients at the Medical Center.

 369
- (c) All patients at the Medical Center involved in any 372 program of research shall be provided information sufficient for them 373 to understand their participation in research, and all patients involved in research shall have first given their written unpressured 374 consent to participation in research.
- (d) There shall be an approval from the Federal Drug 376 Administration on drugs and medications or devises that are on an 377 experimental basis, and the use of such drugs or medications or devises is prohibited until such approval is on file in "LLUMC" 378 Pharmacy.

ARTICLE VIII <u>EXCLUSIVE AFFILIATION WITH LLU</u>

381

8.01 "LLUMC" agrees that it shall not enter into any affiliation 383 agreement with any School or Program other than "LLU" Schools or 384 Programs without prior approval from "LLU".

- 8.02 (a) It is understood by "LLUMC" that "LLU" schools may 388 require affiliations with other hospitals and Medical Centers to 389 fulfill the purposes of "LLU" schools. However, it is recognized that "LLUMC" is the primary affiliation hospital.
- (b) "LLU" has the sole authority to determine the number 392 and content of all affiliation programs into which "LLU" enters. 393
- (c) "LLUMC", with input from "LLU", shall determine other 395 hospital or Medical Center affiliations, content and financial 396 structure of all approved Resident programs.

ABTICLE IX SHARING OF COMMON FACILITIES AND SERVICES 398

- 9.01 **LLU* and **LLU**C** shall have nutual and reasonable access 400 to support facilities and services involving both entities. These 401 shall include, but not be limited to parking, cafeterias, grounds, and 402 utility plant.
- 9.02 In those instances where the parties hereto agree that 403 payment by either institution to the other for use of common 404 facilities and services is appropriate, such payments shall be made in accordance with the article addressing financial considerations.
- 2.03 (a) "LLUMC" Board, with input from "LLU", shall select 407 those persons or agencies who shall provide professional, medical, and 408 medical-related services to the Medical Center, including those who

shall be appointed as medical directors and/or supervise diagnostic 409 and/or therapeutic facilities at the medical Center (hereafter 410 sometimes referred to as "such persons or agencies").

- (b) It shall be the responsibility of mLLUMC" Medical 414 Executive Committee to be responsible for the quality of care rendered by such persons.
- (c) The terms and conditions upon which such services 417 shall be provided by such persons or agencies at the Medical Center, 418 included but not limited to all financial and administrative aspects 419 thereof, and the compensation to be paid to such persons or agencies shall be the province of "LLUMC".
- [d] Subject to the provisions of the agreements with such 422 persons or agencies, Medical Center Board, with recommendation from 423 the "LLUNC" Medical Executive Committee, will have the right to 424 continue or terminate such person or persons at any time.

 425
- (e) Within 120 days from the effective date of this \$27 agreement, "LLUMC" and "LLU" shall review all existing professional, 428 medical and medical-related agreements and contracts. Where there is 429 mutual understanding and concurrence to continue existing agreements \$30 it will be recorded by the JAC. Where either "LLU" or "LLUMC" does \$31 not approve or has questions, the necessary plan to bring about a \$32

mutual agreement, shall be formulated by the JAC, or appropriate steps 433 shall be taken to terminate those agreements.

- (f) "LLUMC" shall thereafter enter into future agreements 435 with the approval of "LLUMC" Board and with approval by "LLUM".
- 9.04 Matters pertaining to quality of care issues shall be 437 discussed by the Professional Practice Committee, but final 438 determination to continue or terminate shall be determined by the 439 Medical Center Board, after recommendations from "LLUNC" Medical Executive Committee.

ARTICLE X ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS 442

- 10.01 (a) Upon the execution of this agreement the Bylaws of 444 "LLUMC", the Bylaws of the medical staff of "LLUMC" and/or any 445 necessary revision, and the policies set forth by the Medical Center Board shall continue to govern the operation of the Medical Center. 446
- (b) In the event of any conflict between the terms and 449 conditions of this agreement, the Bylaws of the Medical Center, the 450 Bylaws of "LLUMC" medical staff and the policies set forth by the 451 Medical Center Board, the Medical Center Bylaws shall govern. 452
- 10.02 Authority to administer programs pursuant to the terms and 454 conditions of this agreement shall be vested in the Vice-President for 455

Medical Affairs or his designee on behalf of "LLU" and in the President of "LLUHC" or his designee on behalf of the Medical Center. 456

- 10.03 (a) The Medical Center Board, with input from "LLO", 458 shall endeavor to promote orderly planning, development, and 459 compliance with existing and anticipated requirements of County, State 460 and Federal agencies.
- (b) The parties hereto shall share and exchange 462 information necessary for the compilation and documentation of all 463 planned programs and facilities in order to insure accurate and timely submissions of all certificate of need and grant applications.

 464
- (c) Utilization of spaces for *LU* SOM, as relates to 466 the research wing, and SOM area shall be determined by *LLU* along with any financial requirements for establishing new or remodeling of 467 existing space.
- 10.04 In order to insure that planning and preparation of 469 financial and statistical statements, reports and budgets of each 470 institution can be completed in a timely and accurate manner, and in 471 compliance with guidelines and regulations which may be imposed by each institution, the Medical Center and *LLU* SOH and other schools 472 of "LLU* as needed, shall establish appropriate reporting schedules, 473 to meet the requirements of *LLU* and *LLU*C*.

- 10.05 (a) The net costs of operation of the Medical Center 475 attributed solely to the activities of the "LLU" SON and other schools 476 pursuant to this agreement, which are not reimbursed by any other 477 party or from any other source, shall be reimbursed to "LLUNG" by "LLUM".
- (b) Any net costs of operation of the Medical Center 479 attributable partially to the activities of the "LLU" pursuant to this 480 agreement and attributable partially to any other cause, shall be 481 reimbursed to the Medical Center by "LLU" solely to the extent and in such proportion as such costs are attributable to activities of the 482 "LLU" pursuant to this agreement, and such reimbursement shall be 483 subject to the same conditions and limitations governing reimbursement of any other net costs pursuant to this agreement.
- (c) It is agreed by "LLUMC" that "LLU" must approve in 486 writing, all activities, programs and purchases for which the Medical 487 Center shall seek reimbursement from the "LLU", as a condition precedent for reimbursement of such costs to the Medical Center. A 488 methodology which is mutually agreeable to "LLU" and "LLUMC" and has 489 been reviewed and approved by the appropriate officials of "LLU" shall be developed to identify such net costs which are not reimbursed 490 through third party payors, as a precedent to reimbursement of such 491 costs.

Id) It is agreed by "LLU" that "LLU" must approve in 493 writing, all activities, programs and purchases for which "LLU" shall 494 seek reimbursement from "LLUMC", as a condition precedent for 495 reimbursement of such costs to "LLU". A methodology which is mutually agreeable to "LLUMC" and "LLU" and has been reviewed and approved by 496 the appropriate officials of "LLUMC" shall be developed to identify such net costs which are not reimbursed to "LLU", from or in 497 conjunction with "LLU", and shall modify its business procedures 498 accordingly, to the extent not inconsistent with the law or reimbursement regulations.

attributable to undergraduate medical education provided, pursuant to 502 this agreement, and subject to the approval of reimbursement by the 503 State of California. As a condition precedent to reimbursement to "LLUMC" for these costs, "LLU" shall approve in writing all 504 expenditures relating to undergraduate medicine education and other 505 like school expenditures before they are incurred. A methodology which is mutually agreeable to "LLU" and "LLUMC" and has been reviewed 506 and approved by appropriate "LLU" officials shall be developed to 507 identify such educational costs which are not reimbursed through third party payors. As a condition precedent to reimbursement of such 508 costs, "LLUMC" shall in good faith seek reimbursement from all other 509 parties, payors or sources for such net costs prior to seeking 510 reimbursement from "LLU" pursuant to this section.

- 10.07 All purchases of goods and services by either "LLU" or 512
 "LLUMC" pursuant to this agreement shall continue to conform to the 513
 existing business procedures and policies in existence at each
 institution, or which shall hereafter be adopted by either party.

 514
- 10.08 (a) "LLUMC" shall be responsible for hiring, supporting 516 and supervising employees associated with patient care activities of 517 the Medical Center.
- (b) "LLU" shall have the responsibility to hire and 519 support all employees associated with research, grants and education 520 conducted pursuant to this agreement.
- 10.09 (a) Pursuant to this Agreement there shall be two 522 categories of employees as follows:
 - (i) Employees of the Medical Center associated 524 directly or indirectly with patient activities 525 of the Medical Center and who are responsible to the Medical Center; 526
 - (ii) Employees hired by "LLU" and corporations 528 within the private practice groups that fall 529 under "LLU"s" direction and who are involved in research grant programs or education undertaken 530 pursuant to this agreement;

- (b) Individuals employed by both "LLU" and "LLUNC" will 532 be paid by the institution determined in advance to be the primary 533 employer. The secondary employer will be billed for a portion of the 534 proper share of salary and benefits, on a monthly basis.
- 10.10 When a contractee devotes time and performs service for 536 both the Medical Center and "LLO" they shall agree in writing on the 538 allocation of that contractee's time and payment to be made to contractee prior to his/her appointment. The parties shall not alter 539 the agreed allocation of time and compensation without prior mutual 540 agreement of the parties to this agreement.
- 10.11 In those instances where chiefs of services are full time 542 faculty, "LLU" shall have the responsibility for paying salaries or 543 determining method of compensation for those chiefs of divisions or sections.
- 10.12 (a) House Staff (Residents) shall be under contract to 546
- (b) Stipends and benefits shall be established by "LLUMC" 548 and shall be reviewed and established in January to take effect in 549 July. Stipends and benefits of House Staff shall be paid on a basis that is considered customary and reasonable to this area after a 550 careful review of other like institutions in Southern California.

- (c) The Graduate Medical Education Committee of "LLUMC" 552 shall present annually in January to "LLUMC" President or his designee 553 a schedule of each division containing numbers and types of House Staff needed for the first of July. Prom this "LLUMC" shall prepare 554 budgets.
- (d) Any changes in salary, fringe benefits or payroll 556 taxes resulting from a change in government regulations, law or 557 bargaining agreement shall constitute an automatic adjustment of contract fee pertaining to each House Staff physician. The Medical 558 Center shall notify "LLU" of any such change as promptly as possible. 559
- 10.13 "LLUMC" shall have the responsibility to pay expenses 561 including, but not limited to, American Medical Association site 562 visits, National Intern-Resident Matching Program costs and other 563 expenses which may be related to the Residency Training Program.
- 10.14 "LU" shall retain the ownership of all land upon which is 565 presently located the medical Center. "LUMC" shall retain ownership 566 of all buildings and equipment located on such land.
- 10.15 "LLUMC" will continue to grant discounts to students on 568

 Medical Center bills according to "LLUMC" established policy after the 569

 execution of this agreement, but reserves the right to discontinue 570

 such discounts should government regulations or "LLUMC" policies

 reflect a future change.

 571

10.16 "LLU" and "LLUMC" shall within 120 days of the signing of 573 this agreement review any and all relationships regarding "LLU" 574 Foundation monies or any endowment funds held by "LLU" as restricted funds which may effect support to "LLUMC", and take action as needed 575 to establish and maintain proper relationships.

10.17 The payment schedule for all contract fees required to be 577 paid by either party to the other pursuant to the provisions of this 578 agreement, shall be due and payable on or before the 15th day of the 579 month following the month in which the services or goods were 580 delivered.

ARTICLE XI INSURANCE

584

11.01 (a) "LLUKC" recognizes the need for all risks (direct and 586 indirect), losses, all special risks, crime coverage, professional 587 liability protection, bodily injury and death, general comprehensive 589 and all other necessary forms of insurance.

(b) "LLUMC" also recognizes the need for medical and 592 health protection coverage for employees and residents, along with 593 Survivor Insurance, automobile, physical damage, unemployment, 594 disability, worker's compensation protection, and other similar types 595 of insurance coverage.

(a) and (b) above will be provided for by "LLUMC" either directly or 598 under contract with "LLU" or some other agency, to be effective at the 599 time of the signing of this affiliation agreement.

ARTICLE XII GIFTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS

603

- 12.01 (a) Gifts and contributions made to either institution to 605 the agreement subsequent to the effective date of this agreement shall 606 continue to remain the sole property of that institution.
- (b) Nothing contained in this agreement shall abridge the 609 right of either institution to solicit gifts, contributions and grants 610 (hereinafter collectively, "Gifts") independently of the other for its 611 sole use and benefit, nor shall anything contained in this agreement prevent the creation or continuation by either institution of either 612 new or existing funds, programs or activities for the receipt or 613 solicitation of gifts.

ARTICLE XIII TRANSITIONAL COSTS

615

13.01 Upon execution of this agreement or as soon thereafter as 617 is practicable, the Medical Center and "LLU" shall prepare and agree 618 upon a budget and cost allocation to the parties to cover any and all 619 transitional costs.

ARTICLE XIV CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION

14.01 "LLUMC", with input from "LLU", shall plan for capital 624 construction, and space needs relative to needs at a value based at 625 the Certificate of Need (CON) level, to provide an appropriate 628 physical environment for the successful conduct of all of its programs.

ARTICLE XV TERMS AND MODIFICATIONS OF AGREEMENT

- _15.01 (a) The term of this agreement shall be for 5 years, 633 unless either party gives motice of termination or modification 12 634 months prior to the ending date of this agreement.
- (b) This agreement may be modified or amended by mutual 637 consent of the parties in writing.
- (c) This agreement may be reviewed annually by the 640 parties to this agreement.

ARTICLE XVI GENERAL PROVISIONS
