God's power working in and through us can make us a winsome presence in the world and start a worldwide surge of evangelism.

DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

V N Olsen, President of Loma Linda University, introduced the series of morning devotional meetings with the topic "Joy in the Good News of Salvation."

The acid test of the redemptive experience, Christian living, service and mission is "Joy in the Lord." Joy comes into being through self-involvement in meaningful processes and authentic person-to-person relationships. Jesus said: "I have spoken thus to you, so that my joy may be in you, and your joy complete." (John 15:11). Joy is to be found in a certain relationship with God like this: "Those who in everything make God first and last and best, are the happiest people in the world.
. . . Let us never lose sight of the fact that Jesus is the wellspring of joy."--MYP 38.

The pen of Ellen G White also writes these beautiful words: "Heaven is full of joy. It resounds with the praises of Him who made so wonderful a sacrifice for the redemption of the human race. Should not the church on earth be full of praise? Should not Christians publish throughout the world the joy of serving Christ? Those who in heaven join with the angelic choir in their anthem of praise must learn on earth the song of heaven, the keynote of which is thanksgiving."--7T 244.

We chose to be Seventh-day Adventist workers. Our rewards, our satisfactions, our life is the communication of our joy made complete in Christ. Our work is a ministry in fellowship with that Lord who saved us.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

G Ralph Thompson, Secretary of the General Conference, enumerated the different areas of work carried forward by the Secretariat. The most important of all is to keep the church aware of its main objective, carrying the gospel to all the world.

The Secretary explained the work of his associates and their assignments to world divisions. The Appointees Committee appoints new workers from North America, processes calls between divisions, releases workers, and votes permanent returns. In addition, this committee processes a number of volunteer workers.

G R Thompson also called attention to a table of current calls as of September 11, 1980 and a chart showing the missionary departures, both inter- and intradivision, for 1979. The total of new workers, returning missionaries and volunteer workers sent out last year was 1,129. Added to this number were 61 national workers who returned to serve in their homelands making a total of 1,190.

In closing, G R Thompson said: "There must be no muted sound in the preaching of the everlasting gospel with the distinctive features that make up the Advent Message. Let no note of defeat or retreat be heard among us. Remember, God never leads this people where retreat is necessary or advance impossible. We must never let ourselves get caught up in the paralysis of analysis. The future for the Advent Message is as bright as the promises of God."

TREASURER'S REPORT

L L Butler, Treasurer of the General Conference, expressed the conviction that we see tokens of Christ's coming on every hand. Although all around us men are fearful and perplexed, our God knows the future and we must be constantly guided by Him. This is the basis of our confidence in the future.

(Treasurer's Report - contd)

Upon discussing the current financial situation and prospects for the immediate future with some of the economists associated with banks in New York, one gets the overall impression of an effort to remain as optimistic as possible in the gradually deteriorating situation. Recovery from the recession is slow and minimal.

Commenting on the Financial Statement of the General Conference for the period ended June 30, 1980, L L Butler pointed out the tithe increases in the North American Division for the first six months of the previous three years have been as follows:

| 1980 | 6.8% |

These increases are well below the inflation rate for those years. These shortages are cumulative, which means that tithe income has declined. Mission offerings for similar periods are comparatively no better. Ingathering for this year is 1.1 percent ahead of last year.

If this trend continues, what of the future? These figures may be symptoms of a condition more serious than the financial implications. Is our problem simply selfishness or merely materialism? We need to carefully examine our priorities so we shall not disappoint our Lord or fail in the commission He has entrusted to us.

VOTED, To amend GC Q 25, Extended Mission Service Allowance, as follows:

Paragraphs 1-7, No change

8. A worker who has served in mission fields for more than six years, has been permanently returned, and was in his base division on January 1, 1973, will receive credit only for the initial six-year qualifying period of his previous mission service if he accepts further mission appointments after that date.

In cases where workers are granted more than one permanent return, previous extended mission service allowances will not be adjusted by subsequent allowance computations, but at the time of each succeeding permanent return, all mission service to date will be taken into con-

(Extended Mission Service Allowance - contd)

sideration in determining the allowance percentage level. The allowance which will accrue to such a worker for additional service, or to a worker who received a settlement for prior service, shall be charged proportionally to the divisions in which he subsequently serves.

3. To expand GC F 15 25-4-d-2) to harmonize with the above recommendations and to make certain that the individual concerned receives adequate information relative to the overseas assignment.

However, in addition to national and local safety requirements, minimum denominational standards shall be maintained for all denominational air operations.
- 2. To reclassify subsections GC C 90 15-1 to 5 under one new section, GC C 90 17, Pilot Requirements, and renumber the subsections/paragraphs correspondingly.

- b. He shall possess a current Aircraft and Powerplant Certificate or its equivalent.
- c. He shall have a minimum of twelve months of aircraft mechanic experience or demonstrate acceptable competence and experience under the supervision of the Adventist Aviation Center.
- d. He shall pass a denominational aircraft mechanic checkout with orientation for the type of aircraft he will be expected to maintain.

Children who remain in the division where the parents are serving should normally be voted permanent return when they reach their 22nd birthday or when they have completed their college education, whichever comes later. The division and General Conference actions should specify a date beyond which the General Conference/division would not be responsible for permanent return expense. Academy-age children authorized to attend school in their base division normally are not voted permanent return inasmuch as close ties still remain.

The following comments and observations were made regarding A 3198-A ANNUAL COUNCIL 1982, for possible consideration.

(See 1980 Agenda book, pages 48 and 49, Item 130).

- J J Aitken: Field secretaries are elected to serve the world church, therefore all of them should be listed to attend the Annual Council in Manila.
- C D Henri: Although the Christian Record Braille Foundation is based in North America and operates within the North American Division, if a representative could attend the 1982 Annual Council some other world division might see the value of sponsoring a similar organization.
- *G J Bertochini: Departments serve the world field. If departmental directors only attend the Annual Council, they would be seriously handicapped inasmuch as each associate is assigned a specific area of work and would not be present to promote it or to lend assistance to the department director.

The Sabbath School Department in particular is a unifying influence since the same lessons are studied all over the world. If we cannot meet together, how can we maintain unity?

- *W J Brown: The question was raised regarding the economy of sending all the General Conference Officers.
- F Bresee: It was suggested that particular attention should be given to inviting pastors and laymen to the Council. Perhaps this should be made specific in 2-a-14.
- Cyril Miller: It would be well to make arrangements for more of the world Committee members to attend the Annual Councils in the United States through pool travel and other special arrangements.

If not all the North American Division members are going, we need to have a North American President's Council.

- E C Beck: A representative of the North York Branson Hospital in Canada should be invited to attend the North American Division Council.
- <u>D S Johnson</u>: Local conference presidents in North America should be attending the Manila Council. They need the exposure, and it would heighten their interest in the world work.
- M L Mills: The selection of Committee members to attend Annual Councils outside North America should not be by precedent. It would also be wise to send some representatives from certain groups not now represented (Associate Directors of Departments). Might promote a better feeling.

*Neal C Wilson made a statement in regard to the economy of sending all the Officers to the Council. The Annual Council is an administrative meeting and officers therefore have an assignment for this meeting, to give leadership in organizational activities.

It is not that we consider departmental associates and other helpers of less importance than the Officers. The truly important people in this church are not necessarily those on committees. Pastors are the real spiritual leaders of the church. Any time we make administrative decisions that do not include everybody, those who are left out feel we consider them unimportant. Importance in the church is not determined by attendance at meetings.

We must have organization and follow structure and limits within the organization to make it function. Certain people are needed in order for the mechanics to operate smoothly.

VOTED, To amend GC W 15, Sabbath School Offerings, as follows:

W 15 Sabbath School Offerings

The Sabbath School in all its divisions has long been recognized as the church organization that gives weekly emphasis to the worldwide program, and funds received through Sabbath School mission offerings constitute a significant portion of the annual world mission budget.

(Sabbath School Offerings - contd)

All Sabbath School mission offerings are General Conference offerings and are to be passed on in their entirety by the church treasurer to the conference/mission for transfer to the General Conference. These mission offerings include the regular weekly offering, Thirteenth Sabbath offering, Sabbath School Investment, and the Birthday-Thank offering. They are all mission offerings. Each of these mission offerings is to be identified as a separate fund in the regular system of records from the local church to the General Conference.

If the expenses of the Sabbath School are not provided for in the regular church budget, a Sabbath School expense offering may be received. This offering is retained in the local church to meet the recurring expenses of the Sabbath School as voted by the Sabbath School Council.

No other offering for any cause may be promoted or received during the Sabbath School.

- W 15 05 Regular Weekly Mission Offering -- Mission offerings given through the Sabbath School, other than those for the Thirteenth Sabbath of each quarter, Investment, and the Birthday-Thank offering, constitute the regular weekly Mission Offering.
- W 15 10 Thirteenth Sabbath Offering -- The offering received on, or marked for, the Thirteenth Sabbath of each quarter, a portion of which is devoted to designated projects in world divisions according to a schedule voted by the Annual Council, is divided as follows:
- 1. Twenty-five percent of the actual amount of funds received by the General Conference for the Thirteenth Sabbath offering will be appropriated to the designated projects, and the remaining seventy-five percent to the World Mission Fund.
- 2. For the purpose of computing the Thirteenth Sabbath Offering, the remittances from North America for one month beyond the closing date of the quarter and the reports from the overseas divisions for two months beyond the closing date of the quarter, shall be included in the calculation.
- W 15 15 Sabbath School Investment -- In order to encourage further giving to the mission program and to raise mission funds through various individual or group projects, the plan known as Sabbath School Investment was developed. This plan is not particularly tied to a regular time period nor to a weekly or quarterly appeal for the offering but is a continuing program to promote an increase of mission gifts beyond normal regular giving on the basis of financial returns from special fundraising projects decided on by individual members or groups. Such proceeds or offerings are received at any time, but periodically a

(Sabbath School Offerings - contd)

special promotional appeal is presented in the Sabbath school. All Sabbath School Investment funds are recognized as General Conference funds and designated as a portion of the World Mission fund. Twenty-five percent of the Investment funds are appropriated for frontier outreach and/or large city evangelism, as follows:

- 1. 22.5 percent to the overseas divisions in proportion to their regular annual base appropriations
 - 2. 2.5 percent to the North American Division

Projects to be benefited by the Sabbath School Investment should be designated annually by each division committee.

W 15 20 Birthday-Thank Offering -- An appeal is presented in the Sabbath School periodically suggesting that a special mission gift would be appropriate in recognition of God's blessing on the occasion of a birthday or other special event in gratitude to God for His providential care and leading. This mission offering is the Birthday-Thank Offering.

- 2. To the home division -- The worker shall serve on the basis of a national returning if called to his home division or if he returns there on his own responsibility. He may request that his home division accept the transfer of his service credit accrued in the adopted division and that it be added to his service record in the home division. If the home division approves the request
- a. A record of the request, the division approval and consequent transfer shall be made by the General Conference (Administrative Committee).

- a. Determine the maximum indebtedness allowable using the formula outlined in GC N 20 25.
- b. Divide the amount of indebtedness allowable by the number of months for payout specified in the appointee's student loan promissory note(s).
- c. The result shall be the amount of indebtedness which may be amortized by each month of mission service.
- 2. Months Required for Amortization -- The number of months of mission service required for full amortization and for which indebtedness liquidation assistance will be scheduled shall be determined as follows:
- a. When the indebtedness is less than the maximum allowable, the method outlined in paragraph I above shall be used to determine the amount which may be amortized by each month of mission service. The result divided into the amount of indebtedness will be the number of months required for amortization and for which indebtedness liquidation assistance will be scheduled.
- b. When the indebtedness is equal to the maximum allowable, the number of months required for amortization and for which indebtedness liquidation assistance will be scheduled shall be equal to the number of months for payout specified in the appointee's student loan promissory note(s) unless:
- 1) The appointee has converted previous student loan promissory note(s) into a passbook savings account with a 72-month payout, in which case the loan amortization and indebtedness liquidation schedule shall be for 72 months, or
- 2) The appointee has some student loan promissory notes for the 60-month payout period and others with a 72-month payout period, in which case the loan amortization and the indebtedness liquidation schedule shall be for 60 months.

Year-round Nominating Committee -- Where desired and approved by action of the local church, the duly elected church nominating committee may continue its work throughout the church year for the purpose of filling vacancies which might occur.

A 3189 DISASTER RELIEF RESPONSE PROGRAM

VOTED, To adopt the following Disaster Relief Response program:

- 1. Each church should plan to stock the emergency supplies that may be deemed necessary for the types of disasters ordinarily occurring within its respective area.
- 2. Lay Activities Committees of divisions, unions, conferences and missions should study the types of disasters which could be ordinarily expected in their respective territories and develop a disaster relief plan for the assignment of personnel, the procuring and stockpiling of emergency equipment and supplies, and the necessary financing.
- 3. The executive committee of the conference/mission in which disaster relief is being given should coordinate the activities of local church community services and of SAWS, and define the spheres of action for each.

VOTED, To adopt the following plan for prison ministries:

- 6. To list the Board of Education item for discussion at the Interdivision Education Administrators' Seminars.
- 7. To record the text of the General Conference Board of Education document specifying terms of reference and authority as follows:

B. Meetings

C. Appeals

Appeals from decisions of the Board may be made to the General Conference Committee after a hearing by the executive committee of the Board.
