DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

Enoch Oliveira called attention to the account of two conflicting reports given by the twelve spies (Numbers 13 and 14). The majority report was discouraging but the minority report glowed with confidence in God's power.

Today we again have two conflicting reports on the work of the Church. The majority proclaims that public evangelism is obsolete, that we do not have the financial resources for large evangelistic campaigns, that society is wholly secularized, that we need to adjust our message to the needs of the day, and that we are not able to fulfill the task entrusted to us. Acceptance of this report brings stagnation and decline.

The minority report contends that public evangelism is not dead, that there are signs of a great religious revival in the world, that the ecumenical movement has opened doors for evangelism and with God's power we are able to complete the task. Acceptance of these ideas brings remarkable results.

Let us encourage one another with the words found in Numbers 14:14 and Matthew 28:19,20, for truly, "the Lord is with us."
