DEVOTIONAL REPORT

Neal C Wilson reported the good news that Harvest 90 baptisms are about 300,000 ahead of projections.

He told of how the members in Burundi have renewed their zeal after religious freedom was proclaimed in that country about a year ago. They set a goal of 15,000 baptisms in one year which would be more than 50 percent of their membership. Although they only began their work in February 1988, available figures at the end of the year showed that 11,030 new members had been added to the Church. This devotion has resulted in 1,000 new members per month. Wilson remarked how strange it must be for God to look down on His children and see the wide differences of attitude and varying degrees of commitment.

The Chairman gave a report of the Andrews University Board meeting February 26 and 27, 1989. The University has made a thorough self study under the leadership of Patricia Mutch in preparation for the visit on campus this spring of two accreditation bodies. The financial problems are pressing. The University may have to drop some courses which are desirable but not necessary for accreditation. The University has facilities capable of handling an enrollment of 4,000 students but at the present time there are 2,525 in attendance.

Elder Wilson touched upon the Theological Seminary and its need for a Dean. Three people have been contacted but none of them has accepted. He then enumerated the main requirements for a Dean.

DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

C E Bradford read Romans 13:11-14 from the Good News Bible. "You must do this, because you know that the time has come for you to wake up from your sleep. For the moment when we will be saved is closer now than it was when we first believed. The night is nearly over, day is almost here. Let us stop doing the things that belong to the dark, and let us take up weapons for fighting in the light. Let us conduct ourselves properly, as people who live in the light of day—no orgies or drunkenness, no immorality or indecency, no fighting or jealousy. But take up the weapons of the Lord Jesus Christ, and stop paying attention to your sinful nature and satisfying its desires."

This scripture is to be understood in light of the second coming of Christ, the near expectation that is woven into all the New Testament writings. From the day that Christ left He has always been coming back. Since that day it has been proper to look for Him. Every Christian society, every generation, every age has lived with this near expectation. Christ says I am making arrangements for coming back. While I am coming back, you do business with the resources I have given you. Paul is using this expectation as a motivation for holy living.

Ellen G White said that whenever an angel talked to her about this, he always said it is near. For the genuine Christian community, it has always been constant that He will return. When this takes hold of us as a people, then those things that count become important in our lives. Fellowship increases; doctrine becomes pure. This gives urgency to our preaching, and it becomes relevant. We are dealing with what will prepare us for eternity.

The painting is almost completed on the second floor.

Carpeting is being laid by a group of Seventh-day Adventists, and they are doing an excellent job. The carpeting is being turned up about eight inches along the wall so that the wall will not be scarred when bumped. It is nice to have the brethren so deeply involved with the new building.

The office doors for the second and third floors are hung, but the doors to the entrances have not yet been delivered. More security may be needed to guard the different entrances.

By tomorrow the last orders for shelving will need to be sent in. Everyone will not be able to take all of the books they now have in their offices. There is neither room nor support in the new building to hold all of this extra weight. Jones advised those who have books they do not use frequently to take them home.

No plants will be allowed in the new building. There is no place to put them in the offices, they cannot be hung from the ceiling, and the custodial staff does not want to clean around them.

The Certificate of Occupancy from the county, which has to be in hand before the move can be made, cannot be issued until construction has begun on the road. May 14 is the probable date of the move to the new headquarters. Six bids for constructing the road are in the county office and one is to be chosen this week or next. Two lanes must be kept open on the road while the other two are being constructed.

The county is more concerned with how the people who live in the Takoma Park area are going to travel to work than how those from other areas will get there. It is hoped that many of them will ride the bus. It is the plan to get at least 50 employees' cars off the highway from this direction.

SABBATH SCHOOL INVESTMENT OVERFLOW PROGRAM AND PROJECTS—PILOT PROJECT

For some time requests have been sent to the General Conference Church Ministries Department for a study to be done to find ways to enhance mission offerings. Recently the Frederick, Maryland Church requested that a portion of the Sabbath School Investment Funds raised in that church go for a special overseas mission project. The General Conference Church Ministries Department has studied the request and has recommended the following pilot proposal with reviews at the end of both 1988 and 1989 to determine the affect this type of program has had on the overall stewardship of the Church:

- 1. A yearly basic Sabbath School Investment goal of \$5 per Sabbath School member be established in the Frederick, Maryland Church. It will continue to sponsor the regular ongoing Sabbath School mission program of the Church as presently carried on by the denomination through the Sabbath School Investment Fund.
- 2. All Sabbath School Investment Funds raised by the end of each fiscal year above \$5 per Sabbath School member would go for building new churches in the Burundi Mission.

DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

C B Rock, Chairman took Deuteronomy 33:24, 25 as his text. Moses, the patriarch, was blessing the tribes of Israel and Ashur specifically in these particular verses. The Chairman's accent was on the last part of verse 25, ". . . as thy days, so shall thy strength be."

This passage could be a general blessing, but "as thy <u>days</u>" seems to make the present very significant, the day being the very basic unit of living, though often months, years and decades are considered in good long range planning.

The word "as" suggests that whatever kind of day is given to us, difficult, easy, happy, stormy, successful, tragic—for each, God will give us the needed strength. "As thy days" also suggests that with the increase of days there will be for the child of God an increase of grace and wisdom.

Prayer was offered by G L Plubell.

REPORTS

R L Pelton reported that the Seventh-day Adventist Church, through it's medical work, touched the lives of 7.5 million patients last year.

Dr Dharmavir Bhakt, a Hindu doctor, founded the Dinbandhu Hospital, near Surat, India, by traveling around the world soliciting funds to build it. He found a Muslim man willing to donate the land including a power line and a beautiful grove of oranges. This 50-bed hospital is similar to community hospitals in the North American Division but costs about a half million dollars.

A newspaper clipping said that previously Hindu and Muslim radicals were not interested in having Christians operate the hospital. However, the kind and caring spirit exhibited at the hospital towards the patients caused the people to support Dr Bhakt and the Christians who ran the hospital. Poor and wealthy patients were given the same care. Dr Timothy Jonahs, Medical Director of Surat and Dinbandhu Hospitals in India, has been working under trying conditions but now the outlook is brighter.

<u>R J Kloosterhuis</u> and <u>C B Rock</u> gave reports of the final session of the Franco-Haitian Union held in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. The purpose of the meeting was to divide the union into two new Francophone unions of the Inter-American Division.

The Inter-American Division Committee appointed Asser Jean-Pierre as President of the Haitian Union and Antoine Ocull as president of the French Antilles Union. Delegates in session, approved new constitutions, elected union departmental directors, mission officers, and union committees for the respective new unions. In 1957, when the Franco-Haitian Union was first organized, there were approximately 13,000 members. Now there are about 150,000. Each union faces special challenges. However, the delegates were of excellent courage, filled with hope, and determined to move forward under the Lord's direction.

WT Clark told about a young Korean man who studied allergies about 19 years ago. In time he enjoyed a \$700,000 a year practice and lived in a two-million dollar home. Dr Lee became acquainted with Seventh-day Adventists and joined the Church. Later he went to Weimar Institute and worked for a salary of \$700 a month.

This enthusiastic man returned to Korea and obtained time on the radio. He began to present the New Start Program over the air and spoke freely of Seventh-day Adventists. Three interesting newspaper clippings state that the price of beef, pork, and chicken dropped drastically, with the price of vegetables actually rising somewhat. A request has been made to remove Dr Lee from Korean Broadcasting Service programs but this has not been done.

<u>Humberto M Rasi</u> enthusiastically reported that the French-speaking group of 60 to 70 people led by Gerard Latchman, who meet weekly at the Columbia Union College, has been organized as a church by the Potomac Conference.

- G Ralph Thompson gave an update on C D Brook's effort in Barbados. Three thousand people are attending each night and special interest in prayer is requested for the first Sabbath celebration this week.
- Gary B Patterson reported that Don Aalborg's prognosis is a little brighter and requested that he be remembered in prayer.

<u>K J Mittleider</u> reported that Middle East College has been closed for the last two days due to heavy fighting. No loss of life has been sustained to this point, although there has been damage to property. Prayer was requested for the college, its faculty, and students.
