Devotional thoughts were then presented regarding the need to maintain a sense of urgency in our endeavors to finish the work.

Wilson read 2 Timothy 4:2, Phillips translation, "Never lose your sense of urgency." Self-satisfaction and indifference soon dull the sense of urgency.

When the spirit of God takes possession of the heart, it transforms the life. Sinful thoughts are put away; evil deeds are renounced; love, humility, and peace take the place of anger, envy, and strife; and joy takes the place of sadness. When Christ lives in the heart by faith, it is not just a visit, not an occasional call. It is the permanent address.

DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

Juan Carlos Viera, Associate Director of the E G White Estate, presented devotional thoughts from the Gospel of John which he entitled, "Priority Items on Our Agenda."

Each time the General Conference Committee meets there are priority items with which it must deal. However, there are also other unwritten priorities which are perceived to be more important; these have to do with our own personal lives, the corporate life of God's people, and the finishing of our mission as God's appointed Church.

Christ gave first priority to the will of God and the work of God. His second priorities were to help His followers to fulfill God's will by demonstrating to them a sanctified life and to fulfill God's mission by showing the Father to the world.

It can be seen that our most important priorities or concerns are those of Christ. His solutions for our greatest concerns are (1) abide in Me and abide in the Spirit, (2) obey Me and obey the Spirit, and (3) trust in Me and trust in the Spirit.

We can conclude, then, that our most important priorities are not in our hands but in the Spirit's. Nevertheless, we must be teachable and willing to accept His ways not only to be transformed and made ready for heaven, but also to be used in finishing the mission of the Church.

#### GENERAL CONFERENCE EVALUATION PROCESS

Neal C Wilson stated that the General Conference has established an evaluation process under the direction of Duane McBride of Andrews University. This evaluation will help determine which services provided by the General Conference are still valid and valuable to the mission of the Church. As a result of this evaluation significant changes may take place in the number of personnel employed at headquarters and in the services it provides.

#### 182-89G SOVIET DIVISION OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE OF SEVENTH-DAY ADVENTISTS

For many years the Church has been appealing to the Soviet Government to accord full recognition of the SDA Church as a distinct church organization authorized to operate throughout the USSR. The Soviet Union is now ready to grant this request. Prior to such organization it will be necessary to broaden the understanding of the church pastors and leaders in the Soviet Union in the responsibilities and privileges of formal church organization. Approximately 250 delegates (including lay persons) plus delegates-at-large will be allowed by the government to attend an organizational meeting.

The organization of this new division must be seen as growing out of desires and decisions of church members in the Soviet Union and not as something that is mandated by General Conference headquarters.

RECOMMENDED, 1. To record appreciation for the authorization granted by the Soviet authorities to organize a division.

2. To approve the request of the Church in the Soviet Union to take all the preliminary steps necessary to organize a division.

3. To encourage a meeting in the Soviet Union to be held August 8-13, 1989 for the following purposes:

- a. To develop the organizational structure of the division.
- b. To appoint delegates to attend the 1990 General Conference Session.

c. To discuss the feasibility of organizing three new unions (Central Asian Republic, Moldavia, and Baltic Republics) in addition to the present two unions (Association of Seventh-day Adventists in the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic and Association of Seventh-day Adventists in the Russian Soviet Federated Socialist Republic), making a total of five unions comprising the proposed division.

d. To refer to the 1990 General Conference Session the formal approval for organization of the Soviet Division of the General Conference and its unions, the election of officers, and other personnel.

M P Kulakov and N A Zhukaluk of the Soviet Union expressed appreciation for the action relative to the organization of a division of the General Conference in the Soviet Union and affirmed their confidence in the Lord who will complete what He has begun.

#### USSR PUBLISHING HOUSE - REPORT

Harold F Otis Jr, who recently returned from the Soviet Union reported that at present two leading Soviet surgeons are visiting the United States. Rose Otis is acting as their guide. This week the surgeons were thrilled with the unique opportunity to watch Dr Leonard Bailey perform an infant heart transplant. They were deeply impressed by their visit to Loma Linda.

Progress is continuing on the contract for the publishing house in the USSR. Several stipulations which the government had requested in the contract have been changed or deleted which gives the Church more freedom and management control of the publishing house.

Later this month Mr Propokov, who is in charge of all publishing in the USSR, and his associate will visit the United States accompanied by the governor of Tula where the proposed publishing house will be located. They will visit the Review and Herald Publishing Association in the course of their stay.

STEWARDSHIP--NEED FOR RENEWED EMPHASIS

VOTED, To refer to the General Conference Officers the need for more emphasis to be given to stewardship within the Church with a view to developing a heightened awareness of the spiritual dimensions involved in giving.

LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY ACCREDITATION - REPORT

Norman J Woods, president of Loma Linda University, assured the committee that although Loma Linda University has been placed on probation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, it is still accredited. A meeting with the Commission and board leadership will be held later this month to discuss the problems. LLU has been cited mainly on governance and management problems, and less in academic matters. The performance and improvement of Loma Linda University and its compliance with the WASC requirements will be reviewed in 1991 and it is believed that full accreditation will be restored and the probationary status will be removed at that time. The more than twenty schools and programs at Loma Linda, such as the School of Medicine and the School of Dentistry, etc, are fully accredited by their respective agencies. These accreditations are separate and distinct from the WASC university accreditation.

1990 YEAR OF ADVENTIST WORLD MISSIONS - REPORT

K J Mittleider reminded those present of the 1988 Nairobi Annual Council action designating 1990 as the Year of Adventist World Missions. A committee has been formed to finalize the details and a report will be presented to the 1989 Annual Council.

GENERAL CONFERENCE SESSION OFFERING - REPORT

The General Conference Session offering has been designated for the San Marino radio station, subject to the satisfactory completion of contract negotiations. Mittleider reported that Neal C Wilson will be in San Marino and Italy at the end of April to visit with the authorities. Mittleider appealed to all present to continue to remember this project in prayer. Plans for the radio station which will cover the Middle East, Western Europe, and most of North Africa, are at present on hold until the necessary authorization is received from the governments of San Marino and Italy.

180-89G GENERAL CONFERENCE MONEY FUND -  
OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES

VOTED, To record the following operational guidelines for the General Conference Money Fund, as approved by the General Conference Investment and Securities Committee.

General Conference Money Fund - Operational Guidelines

1. The General Conference Treasury (Investment Office) shall maintain a fund known as the General Conference Money Fund (Money Fund) for the purpose of pooling denominational funds available for short-/medium-term periods.

2. The Money Fund shall have a high degree of liquidity in order that depositors may withdraw funds upon a reasonable advance notice if sizeable withdrawals are to be made.

3. The Money Fund shall invest in high-grade commercial paper and bankers' acceptances. US Treasury issues, Federal Agency issues, and investment-grade corporate bonds may also be used but shall be limited to maturities of six months or less and are not to be sold before maturity, thereby eliminating the need for consideration for fluctuation. Other non-fluctuating investment vehicles may also be used as circumstances indicate and as approved by the Investment and Securities Committee.

4. Earnings on deposits in the Money Fund shall be calculated daily and then added to the capital on deposit at the end of each month.

5. Monthly statements of account shall be given to all depositing entities along with data as to yield.

6. No administrative or management fees shall be charged to depositors' accounts.

HARRIS PINE MILLS—REPORT

D F Gilbert presented a report on the Harris Pine Mills. The trustee bankruptcy settlement estimate of \$6,928,286 will pay off all creditors except the General Conference. The Church may have a net loss of approximately \$6,000,000. All creditors will be paid by the end of June, 1989. None of the creditors will receive interest, since the General Conference has not yet received its settlement.

VOTED, To record that the Harris Pine Mills report was received.

NEW GENERAL CONFERENCE HEADQUARTERS—FINANCIAL REPORT

In his financial report on the new General Conference Headquarters building, D F Gilbert stated that he was thankful for the way the Lord

has led in this building project. The original estimate was \$22 million with a top figure of \$25 million. Because of the scope of work changes, county imposed changes, time delays, and other unforeseen problems, the present estimated cost of the building is approximately \$29.5 million. The building was increased in size by 21,000 square feet, open offices were changed to closed offices, and various changes were requested by the architect. In spite of all the changes and unforeseen problems, the cost per square foot is \$67, which is a very reasonable figure given the complexity of the building.

Gilbert gave a report of the cost of the site work, public road work, architectural planning, furnishings and allowances. J G Davis Construction Company is the contractor, and the land planning and design was done by Ostergaard and associates. Consultants were hired for telephone, space planning, project management, audio-visual installations, lighting, studio, and telecommunications. Added to these costs were the expenses of Treasury and other General Conference personnel.

Total available funds and expenditures to date are as follows:

The need was expressed for approval to go beyond the \$25 million figure which was originally voted.

VOTED, To accept the report and to approve a maximum building cost of \$30 million for the new General Conference Headquarters building.

#### HANGZHOU MEDICAL CENTER--PROPOSAL

C B Rock gave an overview of the work of the Eastern Asia Committee in the People's Republic of China. A request has been received from Sir Run Run Shan and the Zhejiang Provincial Government of the People's Republic of China to operate a hospital in Hangzhou. For a number of years Loma Linda University has given invaluable service in the training of Chinese doctors and is now requested to take charge of this project to train more doctors in China.

Samuel Young presented the proposal for the construction and operation of a high-standard hospital in Hangzhou. Hangzhou needs advanced technology and equipment to improve the diagnostic and therapeutic services for patients with serious illnesses in Hangzhou city and the Zhejiang Province. The Shaw Foundation is to provide approximately \$9 million for the planning, design, construction, and equipment of the hospital. The Zhejiang Provincial Government is to

provide the balance needed for this project. The General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists is to lead out in the construction, planning, and selection of equipment for the hospital. It will also be expected to recruit and pay for the support of employing highly-trained professionals to staff the hospital. Loma Linda University has agreed to be in charge of this project. The plan calls for the Church to operate this teaching hospital for five years, after which the fully-operational institution will be managed by local personnel. The Zhejiang Provincial Government and Zhejiang Medical University are to provide the land, high-quality construction, housing for the overseas staff, as well as local staff, other subsidies, licenses, and services as needed.

Neal C Wilson cautioned that the proposed agreement has serious implications for the Church. However, the proposal is very significant because it gives specific recognition to the Seventh-day Adventist Church. The consensus of opinion was that this was an opportunity that could not be overlooked and that it was the type of project to which members of the Church would rally in support.

VOTED, To authorize the pursual of a contract, between Sir Run Run Shaw, the Zhejiang Provincial Government in China and the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, and its agent, Loma Linda University, for the construction of the Hangzhou teaching hospital.

As the proposal develops additional reports will be presented to the General Conference Committee.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMISSION---REPORT

Neal C Wilson reported on the work of the Financial Review Commission. The Commission was composed of 15 lay persons and 8 denominational workers and was chaired by K J Mittleider. The Commission has completed its report on the Adventist Health System and the General Conference Officers will review it in a preliminary way on Tuesday, April 11. He expressed appreciation for the many hours spent in travel and work by members of the Commission in preparation of the report.

#### HARVEST 90—REPORT

Carlos Aeschlimann expressed thanks for the concerted effort made in all divisions to achieve the baptismal goal of Harvest 90.

The Harvest 90 baptismal goal through December 1989 was 1,250,000 baptisms. A total of 1,572,192 baptisms was reached which is an overflow of 300,000. Six divisions have given Harvest 90 high priority. The faith goal for baptisms in 1988 was 500,000, and Aeschlimann was happy to report 497,171 baptisms for the year. This figure is only slightly below the goal and there is a real possibility that when all the reports are in it will exceed the goal. However, it is necessary to accelerate the action of the Church because there are only five quarters left to achieve the quinquennial goal. Aeschlimann mentioned the various campaigns that are planned or in progress throughout the world field. Fifty union and local fields have already reached their Harvest 90 goals. Four divisions will reach their goals during 1989.

## DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

C E Bradford began his devotional with Romans 10:14, "and how shall they hear without a preacher?" The work of the preacher has long been caricatured, the subject of much good humor. The preacher's work generally is not looked at as very important, not very much valued.

When people have problems ". . . the lines of procedure are well established . . . as to what rescuer is chosen, which 'somebody' is supposed to know best what to do about it. . . . Doctors give medicine; surgeons do surgery; policemen arrest people; lawyers "defend" them; judges order people locked up in iron cages; clergymen sympathize or counsel or suggest penance. (They also preach, an underestimated function. . . .)"--What Ever Became of Sin by Karl Menninger, MD.

Karl Menninger, a psychiatrist in Kansas City, maintains that a preacher has the best opportunity to inspire individual and social improvement, to mend the mind, and to prevent the development of chronic depression and mental illness. Menninger also said that some clergymen prefer counseling to preaching, but that the latter is greater. Stop envying the counselor, the psychiatrist. Go on and preach!

Ellen G White has stated that people come to church not so much for the song or even the prayer but because they are hungry for the Word of the Lord (Ev 101). The Bible states "and how shall they hear without a preacher" (Rom 10:14).

GENERAL CONFERENCE HEADQUARTERS - UPDATE

D F Gilbert reported that the main Old Columbia Pike entrance has been realigned. This entrance satisfies the second required access for fire trucks until the external roads are complete.

The second and third floors are almost finished with first floor moving along towards completion. In order to test the smoke detectors, the engineer of the system must prepare and execute a specific operating procedure check. This may cause a delay with the Fire Marshal's office as the actual testing will come in order along with the other companies in line for testing. This may be one of the hurdles that could delay us for a couple of weeks.

Gilbert suggested that furniture for the front of the chapel has not been fully designed but the committee is looking for something similar in quality to the board room table made for the Review and Herald Publishing House. There are three lovely conference rooms in the Conference Center and one designated as the North American Division Committee Room. Changes in the new building other than furniture movement will be kept to a minimum, for one year until everyone settles into their new location. This decision reflects counsel given by several other firms who have moved their offices to new locations.

Employees and other visitors who have toured the new building have mostly made very favorable comments. The new offices will be smaller but comfortable. The four pipes that can be seen in the wet pond are to care for the underground water table changes. The Park and Ride lot should be paved and finished this week. The moving company made a presentation to the Building Committee noting that it has expertise in moving computers. One hundred offices can be moved a day if necessary.

The Certificate of Occupancy inspection process is due May 11 or 12, 1989 and the move should still take place very near the present target date of May 22-May 31, depending upon the Fire Marshall.

There is a party interested in buying the North Building. If this sale does not materialize, the property will be put on the open market, as the cash flow is needed to pay for the balance on the new building. The asbestos problem will be taken into consideration in the sale. We believe the Lord will help us to finalize on a buyer soon.

Local Adventist Schools are requesting to bus children from the new General Conference office to school. The building committee is requesting the schools not to put this into effect until fall as this school year will be nearly finished by the time the move is made. This will be carefully studied this summer. Bus and train tickets will be subsidized by the General Conference and the Montgomery County to encourage more people to use public transport.
