Definite word has been received from the Iran Mission of their inability to secure an entry visa for D. V. Kubrock to return to Iran. Various unfilled openings in the work were considered in reassigning Brother Kubrock, and it was

VOTED, That Brother Kubrock be assigned to the East Mediterranean Union and the Lebanon-Syria Mission for evangelistic work, taking the R. L. Mole budget.

Two years ago we had a call in with the General Conference for a distitian and cook for the Dar El Salaam Hospital, which was later canceled. It seems very desirable at present that such a call be renewed. In harmony with a request of the Dar El Salaam Hospital Board, it was

VOTED, To renew our call with the General Conference for a lady distitian who can also supervise the cooking at the Dar El Salaam Hospital, the budget for this worker to be provided out of hospital earnings.

Dr. E. C. Frank, who is now serving at the Dar El Salaam Hospital, came out on a short term basis, and it was felt that we should begin immediately to lay plans for another doctor to come out and to be here before Dr. Frank leaves. It was felt that if another doctor could come forward soon and spend some time in language study. it would greatly aid in his future work.

VOTED, That a call be placed with the General Conference for a doctor, preferably one whose wife is a nurse.

Unfortunately a number of promised offerings for the Dar El Salaam Hospital and the Nurses' Home have not been turned in. The nurses' home has been authorized and the foundations have been poured, but at the last meeting of the Hospital Board it was voted to defer any building above the foundation until funds are available. In this connection the Hospital Board placed a request for the privilege of doing Ingathering work in the Baghdad area for the benefit of the nurses! home.

VOTED, To request the East Mediterranean Union to grant the request of the Hospital Board for the privilege of doing Ingathering solicitation in the Baghdad area during 1953, the proceeds from which are to apply on the nurses! home building fund.

The committee reviewed the 1954 special budget 1954 BUDGET SPECIALS requests which have come in from the fields, and after some revisions, it was

> VOTED, That the treasurer be authorized to list in the 1954 budget the special requests as amended.

Brother Hilal Doss had previously requested the privilege of taking a portion of his furlough this year, which ordinarily would fall due next year. However, due to the urgent need of translating certain material from English into Arabic, it was

VOTED, To request Brother Doss to defer his furlough until next year, and that he be asked to serve as a translator this summer, to put into Arabic some much needed material.
