LETTER TO NATIONAL SECURITY TRAINING COMMISSION

Inasmuch as legislation is being framed to create a National Security Training Corps, to take the place of the Universal Military Training Act, it was

VOTED, That we approve of the following letter being sent by the North American War Service Commission to the National Security Training Commission, in an effort to have our young men who are taken into the armed services designated in some other classification than as "conscientious objectors":

"July 19, 1951

"National Security Training Commission

"Gentlemen:

"In framing the legislation which will create the National Security Corps, the Executive Committee of the Seventh-day Adventist denomination in the United States respectfully requests that consideration be given and provision be made for training adherents of the Seventh-day Adventist faith in lines of medical service because of their religious training and belief, as is now done under the Selective Service Act which provides for a 1-A-0 classification.

"In this connection, however, we urge that the present stigma of 'conscientious objector' be removed from them as this designation does not accurately describe their attitude. They are not 'objectors' but rather 'cooperators.' Instead of impelling them to refuse their country's service, their consciences lead them to enter that service with skills and aptitudes which they are willing to employ for the benefit of humanity. It is because they believe that civil government is ordained of God and that they should be subject to it, that their consciences impel them to serve when called rather than to 'object' and refuse service.

"Seventh-day Adventists are not pacifists or anti-militarists, or war resisters, nor are they conscientious objectors in the customary understanding of that term. Consequently we do not relish being put

into such a category by legislation or regulation. It is not only inaccurate; to us it is offensive. It is because of this that we ask that in the preparation of the legislation to implement universal military training and service, and in the regulations to utilize the services of our young men, and in the assignments given them under National Security Training, the inaccurate and erroneous terminology used both in the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940, and the Selective Service Act of 1948, in referring to them as 'conscientious objectors,' be avoided.

"The Surgeon General's Department of the Army, which has provided training and utilized the service of thousands of Seventh-day Adventist 1-A-0 men, will verify the fact that they have served willingly and efficiently, many of them preparing themselves at their own expense before induction in the Medical Cadet training made available by their church, with a manual of instruction prepared in cooperation with the Surgeon General's Department. Such men do not deserve to be handicapped in their service by an appellation which has a stigma and does not accurately represent their attitude and position. Our request is that this be corrected in the new legislation and regulations which are printed for and govern the National Security Training Corps.

"We shall be glad to be consulted at such time as final decision is to be made regarding the terminology to be employed in designating men who are to be placed in what is now a 1-A-0 classification, in the hope that a mutually satisfactory designation may be selected.
