REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RELIGIOUS LIBERTY RESOLUTIONS:

There has been introduced into Congress a bill to provide a scholarship program in schools of higher education at public expense. A committee had been appointed by the Officers to give study to this bill and draft a statement to be sent to the House of Representatives protesting against the bill. The committee presented the following report, which was adopted:

April 17, 1958 58-28

WHEREAS, Seventh-day Adventists believe in the doctrine of separation of church and state as set forth by our Lord in Matthew 22: 21; and

WHEREAS, The granting of money from tax funds to church-related schools is contrary to that principle, and is forbidden by the First Amendment of the Federal Constitution, and by most state constitutions in the United States; and

WHEREAS, The General Conference Committee of Seventh-day Adventists adopted at the Autumn Council of 1949, and in the meeting of January 23, 1958, the following resolutions, recommending that Seventh-day Adventist educational institutions not accept grants from government funds:

"WHEREAS, The Seventh-day Adventist Church in the United States is in full accord with the principles of the separation of church and state as set forth in the Federal Constitution, and has through the years supported this principle;

"We recommend, That in the United States the denominational policy for our schools of all grades shall be to refrain from accepting gifts of money, land, buildings, or equipment from government; or grants from public tax money for the salaries of teachers; or the maintenance, operation, or support of the services which the schools supply.

"This shall not be construed to prejudice the acceptance of the regular functions of the Public Health Department, such as public health nurses! services, vaccinations, inoculations, or tuberculosis surveys, et cetera; nor shall it forbid the acquisition, for a consideration, of war surplus."

and

"We recommend, That the action taken at the Autumn Council in 1949 be recognized as including free school lunches provided by government as one of the regular functions of the Public Health Department, which in the 1949 action were indicated as proper for acceptance by Seventh-day Adventist schools with-out violating the principle of the separation of church and state."

and

WHEREAS, There is now awaiting action by the United States Congress Bill H. R. 10381 which is so worded as to permit government funds to be paid directly to schools, without specifying that such funds may not be paid directly to church-related educational institutions; be it

Resolved, That the General Conference Committee address itself to the United States Congress expressing the opposition of the denomination to such direct payments, as follows:

"WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States, in the First Amendment and most state constitutions, preclude the use of public tax funds for religious institutions; and

"WHEREAS, House of Representative Bill No. 10381 makes possible under Titles V. VIII. IX, and XII, such expenditure; be it

"Resolved, That we go on record in opposition to this measure, insofar as it provides funds to be paid directly to educational institutions, and urge its amendment by limiting the use of the direct school funds provided in it, for public schools only."
