The Pacific Union Conference and the St. Helena Sanitarium and Hospital have presented plans for and an estimate of the cost of modernizing the St. Helena Sanitarium and Hospital. It is estimated the project will cost approximately one million dollars. A suggestive method of financing this building project has been submitted, which includes a request for financial assistance from the General Conference. In view of the urgent need to rebuild the institution, and after careful consideration, it was--

VOTED, That a special appropriation of \$60,000 be authorized from the General Conference Contingency Fund to assist in the modernization of the St. Helena Sanitarium and Hospital.

LONG-TERM FINANCING IN NORTH AMERICAN DIVISION:

The rapid expansion of our educational and medical institutions makes additional housing for students and staff a necessity. Some of the institutions find it necessary to incur indebtedness in order to provide this housing. Because the self-liquidating nature of the indebtedness incurred on dormitories and housing reduces the risk,

VOTED, That institutions may be permitted to borrow funds for the construction of dormitories and other housing for students or staff for repayment over a tenyear period instead of a three-year period as heretofore, with the following stipulations:

- 1. That approval be secured from the North American Division Committee on Administration on each project before it is begun.
- 2. That the institution shall have a substantial equity in the project before authorization is granted to borrow.
