REPORTS

Alfred C McClure reported a very successful "Hands Across the World" rally with an offering of over \$72,000.

McClure also highlighted an evangelistic effort in Lexington, Kentucky in which 450 people attended the two opening night sessions. The following night two sessions were held again. The pastor was ecstatic as he noted the genuine hunger for answers and assurance.

Harrisburg, Pennsylvania also held an evangelistic meeting where 160 people attended, 80 of whom were nonmembers. The speaker used outstanding graphics to go with the sermon.

Parkersburg, West Virginia has always been a difficult place for evangelism. However, a meeting was scheduled and on opening night in a rented hall, 250 nonmembers came out to the meeting in a town which has less than 100 members. On the eighth night, after the presentation of the Sabbath, 65 people expressed an interest in Bible study. The members didn't know what they would do with so many prospective members. These encouraging results took place during oppressive heat where people came early to get a seat in the unairconditioned hall.

Russell Burrill brought a team from the North American Division Evangelism Institute (NADEI) of 13 members. A couple of years previous to this series of meetings, 100 Bible studies had been given and the church was now able to capitalize on this.

McClure interviewed a member who owned a lumber yard. The local church where he attended was lifeless with about 75 people coming but few were involved. The church pastor taught his members how to give Bible studies. That church is now giving over 1000 Bible Studies in the small town of Morganton, North Carolina. Their goal is to give Bible studies to everybody in the town!

George H Crumley gave an encouraging tithe report with giving increased even though we are one Sabbath behind last year, and still showing almost a two percent gain.

Owen A Troy reported that the Adventist Media Center had a good year.

Manual Vasquez reported that La Voz has elected a new associate speaker named Frank Gonzalez.

George Crumley reported that a major financial loss of \$930,000 was suffered by Canadian Union College. A software contractor who had been hired to overhaul the accounts embezzled checks and is now in jail. Canadian Union College may be able to recover part of this.

PRAYER REQUESTS

Prayer was requested for Canadian Union College with the financial loss they are experiencing, and for a Vietnam veteran who phoned the Division saying he was ready to commit suicide. The veteran put his gun away after being ministered to by Owen Troy.
