ly the pioneers the kingdom before this. Why has the work not been finished? What can I as an individual do to help quickly finish the work begun one hundred years ago? We suggest that you be not only a Sabbath school member, but a Sabbath school missionary extending the influence of the Sabbath school in the community around you.

3. Thank God for the marvellous Sabbath school lessons which we enjoy today. They had their beginning one hundred years ago in August, 1852, when Elder White on the top of his lunch basket wrote out the first Sabbath school lessons. What do these lessons mean to you today? Do you value them so highly that you are willing to spend ten to fifteen minutes or more each day in a careful study of them? The plan of daily lesson study has not been abandoned by our denomination. Make sure that you as an individual do not abandon it.
4. Rededicate yourself, including your talents, your time and your means to the spreading of this blessed truth to all the world. This can be done largely through sacrificial giving in Sabbath school offerings. Would it not be a wonderful way to observe the centennial of our Sabbath school work by giving the largest 13th Sabbath offering that you have ever given in your life on September 27, which is Centennial Day. Why not consider the idea of making a gift of \$100 to the Lord on this 100th anniversary, or at least 100 half dollars? Others who are not able to give so much may desire to give 100 quarters, 100 dimes, or 100 nickels. Whatever your gift is, make sure it is from the heart with the right motive, and God can use it abundantly to help finish the work begun so nobly by the pioneers.

Korea Reporting Colporteurs Sell Signs at the Front Line

The following word comes from C. A. Williams, Korean Union Publishing Department secretary. He writes:

"There is an active war on here now but that doesn't affect the work in the least. We are doing more here in Korea now as far as winning souls is concerned than we have ever done. We have eighty colporteurs in the field here now and at least

that many more that would go out if we had something for them to sell.

"It's the strangest situation here I have ever seen. Our colporteurs work right up to the front line of battle. It's not uncommon to be giving a canvass in some straw-thatched home and have the door and windows rattle from the roar of heavy artillery. As the 8th Army goes, so goes our colporteurs—they advance or fall back with the army.

"All we have out here to sell is a magazine (the Korean *Signs of the Times*). We print that in South Korea in a prison here for Communist agitators. The army hauls the paper for us. A Protestant press makes the type for us. A Catholic publishing house makes the cuts and the Communists do the work. And that is the way we are printing. Our publishing house is nearly all destroyed, our presses have stopped, *but the message goes on.*

"We are able to get a fifty or sixty thousand edition run out about once every two months. It's usually gone in about three weeks. But our colporteurs don't sit around after they run out of their rations of literature. They follow up their interests, and so far two churches have been raised up since the war as a result.

"This war has really prepared a seed bed for the message in this country. When we advertise for an effort, instead of one or two hundred, one or two thousand come out. The response here is exceptional."

Dear reader, Jesus has placed you here for a reason. So much depends on just you, during this, the greatest campaign ever held for reaching the sinsick, sin-burdened and fallen in Canada. What provisions are you making for Him during this nation-wide campaign? He is calling upon us in this great hour of need. SHALL WE WAIT?
