





Alumni Meeting

ELSIE GIBBS.

The Annual Union College Alumni meeting was held in South Hall dining room the evening of May 23rd. The guests were seated by classes, each class having a penant in their class colors and with the year of their class. It was found that eighteen different classes were represented, the class of '21 having twenty members present.

After the hundred guests had been served to a dainty yet bountiful three course dinner, Professor Damsgard '13, president of the Alumni Association, welcomed the largest class of seniors into Old Union's Alumni family. H. C. Franklin '21 responded that now that the names of the class of '21 are enrolled among the great. they feel it their greatest privilege to serve humanity.

Miss Philmon '20, the historical secretary, gave gleanings from letters from more than one hundred absent members, each reflecting the joy of service wherever he was, happy that he could be representing Union.

Union's History was then given by decades. Professor G. C. George '09 represented the first ten years, 1891-1901. He gave a glimpse of some of the inconveniences and real difficulties that existed in the early days and characterized the spirit of the decade as 'overcoming difficulties.' Professor C. L. Benson '04 outlined the second decade 1901-1911. At that time the denominational policy of short courses was in vogue, the president of Union College was changed every year or two and it was during this decade that Union suffered her epidnmic of debt. The spirit was one of 'Overcoming in spite of difficulties.' During this period Union sent many missionaries to foreign fields and a broader foundation was laid for Union. The college board enlarged to include several alumni members and college teachers. It was in 1904 that the Alumni Association was formed. The spirit of the third decade 1911-1921 was

characterized by the one word "Advancement" by M. N. Heligso'16. It was during these years that as a result of definite planning, hard work, and consecration Union was cleared of debt, the expansion program was carried out, advanced standards were discerned in every line, and best of all, the spiritual atmosphere of the school kept pace with the growth and progress of Union. Professor C. L. Premer said that if the class of '21 represents the fourth decade then it can be rightly named the "Spirit of special devotion to the cause of humanity." This period should mark a greater growth in every line, when a larger per cent of our young people will be college trained and be prepared to meet the common duties of life as well as to carry the heavy resposibilities.

Miss Gibbs '18 read the secretary's report of the meeting of '20. This year there were 119 who paid their membership fee and became full fledged alumni members. The following officers were then elected for the ensueing year: president, Rochelle Philmon; secretary and treasurer, Chas. Plumb; assistant secretary and treasurer, A. C. Madsen; historical secretary, F. A. Spangler. Plans for next year's meetings were discussed. It was voted to have the meeting before the close of school so that the members returning from the foreign fields to the General Conference would have an opportunity to attend. It was voted to extend a resolution of sympathy to the bereaved relatives of Eva Kern and Mrs. H. E. Scoles.

E. H. Meyers, Field Secretary for the Austral Union, Argentina, South America, writes: "Many who have not been in South America no doubt wonder just what it is to live here. Many have a wrong impression. Things are different here than in the States but not so marked as many may think. There are may marks of ignorance and undue conservativeness. There are many disadvantages and discomforts. There is Catholicism, Atheism, and some uncivilization. However it is a great mistake to regard South America as dominantly unmodern. In fact there are many advantages not found in other parts.

"We live in houses. We eat from dishes and use forks and spoons. We cook on stoves and have matches. We have everything from bread, butter, and potatoes to granola and corn flakes. We wear clothes. There are electric lights, and aeroplanes pass over the house nearly every day. People have hearts and souls. They have feelings. They have likes and dislikes; love and hate; honor and patriotism.

"Well it is too much to expect to go into too many details. We hope that others have been more faithful than we to report and express our regard and appreciation for Union and to fulfill their debts incurred by being privileged to be called Alumni. Perhaps there is no group of folk so unruly and so unresponsive, or so scattered and so unorganized as the Alumni Association.

"This defect on the part of the Alumni cannot be caused by a lack of having a warm place in their hearts for Union. it is because they have found out that after all they know so very little and are ashamed to pose off as Alumni members. they feel so out of date that they hesitate to report. What they send might be 'stale.' Our class, for instance, was one of those sent out way back in the year 1918 A. D. It really is just a little embarassing to call attention to those days for things were so different. Those were times when some of us still came late to class and to chapel. Some read books during chapel. Some of us even did visiting in the library. And some few went so far as to cause the preceptor to have some painful experiences. Some said that the 'grub was punk.' (Such English as some did use.) And

some didn't as much as attend worship regularly. And who would have thought that free and liberal access to South Hall would ever be granted the boys! They always sought that privilege in those days. I wonder if they appreciate it as much now as they thought they would. And how disagreeable it must be for the 'Knights' and those 'Senators' from the 'Cracker box' to live in the same quarters!

"May this power that draws to Old Union ever continue its work and ever increase our love for her. But above all else, may that power which 'sends out' continue to *expell*. And by it may not only others be impelled to go out but may it keep those who have gone out faithful at their post."


