



Good Tidings

Once each year a full report of the work done is published in the OUTLOOK for the encouragement and inspiration of our people. There is in this report a picture of the results of our work during the previous years. We invite you to study the facts and figures which have been compiled for you to meditate upon, and which we feel confident will bring blessing and courage to you as you read them.

We thank God for the onward march of the gospel, and we believe that in the near future the millions of people in this great Division will have heard this last message of truth, and that a multitude will be saved in the kingdom of God.

The Annual Offering

The record for the year 1940 closed with the church membership of the Far Eastern Division at 33,601. When the reports were made up at the time of the last General Conference, at the close of 1935, the membership of the Division territory stood at 27,669. The membership increase during the last five years has therefore been 21%. Since the work of Seventh-day Adventists was first begun in the Far East, more than four decades have passed by. In the meanwhile the infant church has grown like the mustard seed of the parable. Viewed through the years in five-year intervals, this growth may be seen from the following table of figures:

Baptisms—Baptisms for the year 1940 come to 3,072 in the Far Eastern Division, and we are happy to report that this is the largest on record. The next highest report was in 1932, when 2,969 were baptized. The record for the past ten years is as follows:

Laborers—The fact that most of our foreign missionaries have been transferred from Chosen and Japan, is quite well understood by our constituency in the Far East. A number of these workers have been located in other sections of the Division; some have taken leaves which are due at this time; and several are planning to remain in the homeland permanently. These changes will all have an effect on the reports of total laborers as found in the various unions, though the effect will be seen principally in the reports of 1941. However, the ranks of our national workers have not been weakened by these changes; in fact, they have in some ways been strengthened. This is apparent from the report of the national ordained ministers in the Far East, which shows a total of 73 for 1939, and 74 for 1940. Naturally, it is not the desire of the General Conference or the Division to see our missionary forces in the Far East reduced. We may be sure that everything possible will be done to provide the help that is needed, although in some places we shall have to wait for the return of normal conditions before this can be fully accomplished.

Institutions—Page fifteen, which carries the reports of institutions in the Far Eastern Division, is full of interest as it portrays statistically the excellent work which these establishments are doing in the cause. Three new major institutions appear

in the lists, all located within the Malayan Union field. The Sabah Training School in Borneo has finally been opened for the Dusun young people of that field, after many years of planning and hoping for such an institution. It will train young people to be Christian leaders in the home villages, teaching them hygiene and sanitation, Bible, and some elements of the common branches of knowledge, as well as something of the practical duties of life. The Bhuket Mission Clinic has been opened to represent our medical work in southern Thailand, after a careful search was made for the best place available. It serves Thai and Chinese people, and all others who come, in this important tin-mining center of Malaya. The French Indo-China publishing work is now listed separately, though some connection is still preserved with the parent institution, the Malayan Signs Press, under which it was first established as a branch.

Tithes and Offerings—The tithes and offerings record as given on page five should be studied thoughtfully. Since this is all reported in units of local currency, exchange fluctuations do not have any direct bearing on the figures. The trend of the per capita in tithe is upward, rising from 8.51 in 1939, to 8.56 in 1940. And we are pleased to see that the trend in offerings is also upward, going from .047 in 1939, to .050 in 1940. One of the five unions shows a loss, and the other four all have gains.

The Spirit of God is at work in the hearts of men, calling them to repentance and obedience. May we all move forward as the openings of God's providences indicate, reaping the grain that stands white for the harvest.
