## Oklahoma Department.

#### Camp Meeting Rates.

ALL who expect to attend the Oklahoma camp meeting by rail should read carefully what has been said about the reduced rates. This plan is a little different than that adopted by the railroads in the other conferences.

You have no certificates to bother with this year, but instead you buy a round trip ticket when you start, for which they should charge only one fare and a third. This is very simple. The only thing that need to be looked to before you go is to see the railroad agent a few days before you wish to start, and if he has not received the authority to sell this ticket, ask him to correspond with the general office at once and get it.
